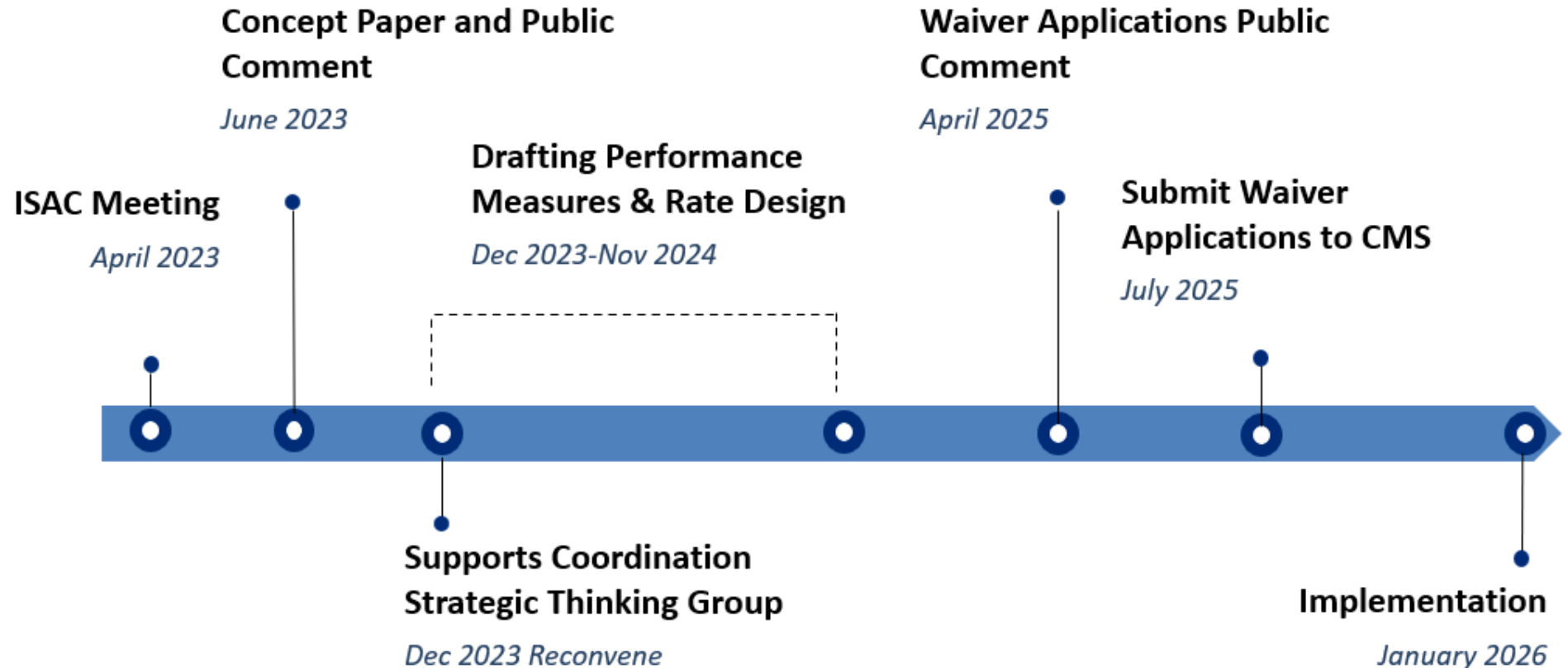

Performance-Based Contracting: Supports Coordination Organizations



- Analyzing feedback from stakeholders about draft **performance standards**
- Analyzing feasibility to change **payment model** from an FFS to alternative payment or per member/per month rate

Multi-Year Program Growth Strategy



- As of December 1, 2025 - 1,893 individuals enrolled in CLW or CW since Feb 2024
- AE Forum held 12/3/24
- Protocol released to AEs
- Readiness reviews began January 1 with all AEs rolled in by 12/31/25
- Since the Governor's Feb 2024 announcement ODP reduced the adult waiting list (age 21+) to under 4,000 for the first time in years. At announcement there were 4,462 adults waiting. The waiting list had been growing since the pandemic.
- Just since the Feb 2024 announcement, ODP has a 7% increase in total program capacity meaning that finally more than 40,000 individuals with ID/A can access home and community-based services. Current program capacity is 41,316 waiver capacity.
