

## Trading In Agism and Ableism for Person-First Language

What are we communicating when we speak about residents and to residents? This training will go in-depth to identify ageism and ableism, examine ageist and ableist language, and challenge participants to reframe their language to person-first. Person-first language helps eliminate stereotypes and emphasizes individuality, equality, and dignity of individuals, ultimately improving the quality of life for each resident. The training includes opportunities for participants to practice person-first language and related skills. This 6-hour hybrid training includes a 3-hour prerequisite, to be completed online **prior** to attending the live, virtual 3-hour session.
