





# Meet Your SNAP Work Reporting Requirements

**Due to changes in federal policy**, you might need to report work, education, training, and/or volunteer hours to the Pennsylvania Department of Human Services (DHS) in order to receive SNAP.

## DHS is Here to Help You Meet These Requirements

There are several programs available to help you find a job, get career and technical training, or attend school at one of Pennsylvania's community colleges. These programs include:

- Keystone Education Yields Success (KEYS)
- Employment Advancement Retention Network (EARN)
- SNAP JETS (formerly called SNAP 50/50)
