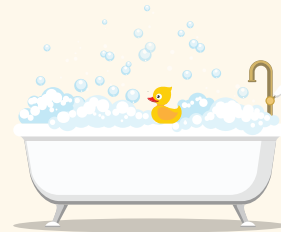
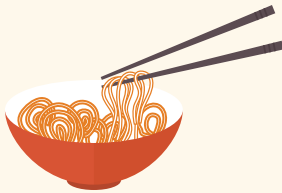


RESIDENTIAL HABILITATION

(sometimes called Res Hab)

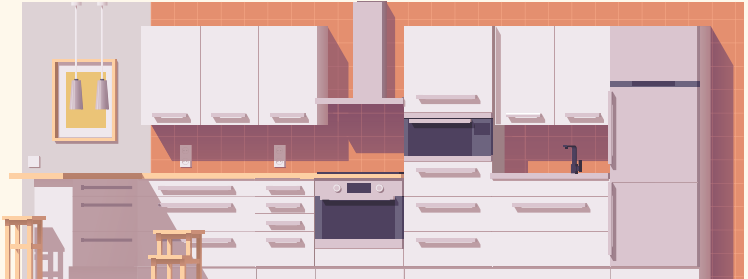
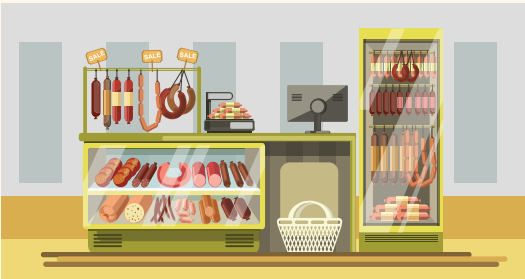
What is Residential Habilitation?

- An ACAP service
- A service to help improve skills to live in the community
 - Examples: cooking, shopping, bathing, dressing



Where does Residential Habilitation happen?

- In a licensed facility (not yours or your family's home)
 - Examples: group homes, shared/family living
- Support can happen in or out of the licensed facility
 - Examples: Your Res Hab staff can take you to the grocery store to get food for your home.



Who gets Residential Habilitation?

- Like all services, you and your team must identify a need for this service
- Your share of room and board will not be more than 72% of the monthly Social Security Income (SSI) maximum rate.
