New Driver and Vehicle Services Website

As a valued PennDOT partner, we wanted to share that the PennDOT and Driver & Vehicle Services (DVS) websites were refreshed and migrated into the new pa.gov format launched earlier this year. State agencies have been adopting this new pa.gov look and feel throughout 2024.

Now that DVS has applied this update, we wanted to share some key updates to help you get acclimated to the new web pages:

- To ensure there is “no wrong door” to access Commonwealth services, all service content from DVS was pulled into the [statewide directory](#) on pa.gov.
 - These new service pages will still be linked to other content within the DVS site, just housed in this new location.
 - The service directory is part of the main site navigation and featured prominently on the pa.gov homepage for easy access.
 - Examples of DVS services: [renewing a vehicle registration](#), [getting a driver’s license](#), and more.
- [DVS](#) still has its own webpage.
- We consolidated [PennDOT contacts](#) from across the site into one database that can be searched, filtered, and linked to specific regions or business areas to help users find information more easily.
- We converted our registration plate options into accessible search hubs, allowing users to more easily view and find [specific registration plates](#).

Many of the features you’ve come to rely on remain on the site, such as [Forms and Pubs](#) and the [Business Partner Resource Center](#) and the [Medical Reporting Information Center](#).

We worked with the Commonwealth’s web vendor to set up redirects for most pages of the PennDOT and DVS sites, but if you can’t find something, please reach out to your point of contact at DVS.
