1 2 Report of Board President - NCARB Annual Business 3 Meeting / NCARB Correspondence 4 [Mary McClenaghan, Board President, presented on 5 Agenda Item No.6, the upcoming NCARB (National 6 Council of Architectural Registration Boards) Annual 7 Business Meeting for the dates of June 19-21, 2025, 8 in Scottsdale, AZ. President McClenaghan inquired as to attendance 10 at the NCARB annual meeting and suggested that the Board needed to decide who would attend. Board 11 members Michael Johns, William Bates and Patrick 12 13 Endler stated that they were thinking about 14 attending. President McClenaghan stated she would be 15 attending. 16 President McClenaghan also noted that Region 2 would be there as well, working on their strategic 17 18 planning and thereby wanting to meet on the first day 19 of the meeting. 20 She then advised that the Board needed to vote on 21 approving those members that planned on attending the 22 annual meeting.] 23 MS. 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12 | Miscellaneous - Appointments

13 | [Steve Swarney, Executive Director for AIA (America

14 Institute of Architects) presented an update for the

15 | Pennsylvania AIA.

16 Mr. Swarney first notified the Board that the AIA

17 | Pennsylvania was in transition since moving to

18 | National and that they were working with a lobbying

19 | firm to fill the position left by Amal Mahrouki,

20 previously the Director of Legislative Affairs for

21 AIA Pennsylvania.

He further stated that they were planning a small

23 version of Action Day (Architects Action Day) for the

24 March 28th, 2025 meeting in Harrisburg. He indicated

25 that the legislative session is just beginning, and

- 1 the AIA Pennsylvania will be involved only in
 2 introductory meetings between their Board members and
 3 legislative members on Action Day.
- Mr. Swarney then spoke to the existence of an active lawsuit that the PA AIA, along with others in the design community, was involved with based on the Pennsylvania Statute of Repose (42 Pa. C.S.A. §5536).

 The lawsuit is currently being argued in the Pennsylvania Supreme Court. Of concern to the AIA Pennsylvania and other likeminded associations is how this statute and the interpretations thereof will

affect the entire design community.

- Mr. Swarney informed Board members of the annual Women in Leadership Conference that the AIA
 Pennsylvania recently started. They are beginning to offer grants and scholarships for women that wish to attend this event. Additionally, the AIA
 Pennsylvania is in preliminary discussions regarding continuing education. Of note, Amira Weiss, AIA
 Pennsylvania Communications staff, is highlighting female board members for Women in History Month
 (March 2025). This coincides with PA Architect Week for April 2025.
- Mr. Swarney advised the Board that there was concern from members as to how the current tariffs

- 1 | will impact them and other likeminded businesses. The
- 2 AIA Pennsylvania is partnering with the AIA offices
- 3 in New York and New Jersey to offer a video seminar
- 4 event that can address these and similar issues for
- 5 their architects. The AIA Pennsylvania is also
- 6 | working with the New York and the New Jersey AIA on
- 7 some small firm symposiums and education.
- 8 Mr. Roller inquired of Mr. Swarney if there was
- 9 anything of significance going on with the
- 10 legislature regarding a reduction or modification of
- 11 the Statute of Repose. Mr. Swarney responded by
- 12 stating that a modification of the statute was still
- 13 one of their priorities. He stated that the
- 14 coalition they have built with others is helping with
- 15 that effort and he believes that effort will
- 16 translate over legislatively as well.]
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- 18 Report of Board Counsel (Cont.) Act No. 144 of 2024
- 19 [Ashley Goshert, Esquire, Board Council, presented on
- 20 Act No. 144 of 2024.
- 21 Ms. Goshert notified the Board that Act 144
- 22 merges somewhat with the regulatory counsel reports.
- 23 | She suggested starting with their plan as to how to
- 24 focus on the regulations that they need in order to
- 25 move forward with Act 144.

She noted prior discussion to bifurcate the Continuing Education for architects into one regulation package with interior design's Continuing Education as a second package.

Ms. Goshert advised the Board of a meeting with NCARB they had in order to view their model law. She further stated that they had also familiarized themselves with the New Jersey law on Act 144. She suggested that, since the Pennsylvania Act 144 is based in large part on the New Jersey law, that this would be a good starting point from which to begin the process. She added that NCARB was going to present at the Board's next meeting. The Board could discuss their model law with them as well.

Mr. Roller questioned if the NCARB model law would provide them with enough regulation and stated that the New Jersey law seemed tailored to what he believed their Board would want. He further reiterated the importance of time expediency on this matter as he felt that an adaptation of the New Jersey subchapter 4A by Pennsylvania should be in effect by the time the Board's next renewal period came up in 2027.

Mr. Roller believes that if the Board Counsel could have a draft of the above-referenced section

ready for them by May it would enable the regulatory process to begin sooner than later.

Discussion ensued with comments from Board members on various aspects of the NCARB model law versus the New Jersey law of same.

Ms. Goshert advised the Board that she, perhaps, could have a draft for the next meeting based on her perception of the Board's preference for the New Jersey Act 144 law. She again stated that the New Jersey law would be a good starting point for all of them.

The Board then briefly remarked on the lengthy time process for regulatory laws to proceed, process and pass. Ultimately, they agreed that 2029 would most likely be the year in which the Board would be looking at the passed regulations and the licensee continuing education process.

There was mention of an option to fast track the regulatory process for Act 144. However, the Board was advised that a file omitted would not apply to the scenario at hand and, indeed, might only shorten the regulatory process for Act 144 by a few months at best.]

- 5 Mr. Farrell began by stating that he had already
- 6 provided the Board with most of the information they
- 7 needed, including four active matters and the 16A-
- 8 4112 general revisions that were still on track to be
- 9 completed. Included in the information received by
- 10 the Board were the continuing education packages,
- 11 | with package 16A-4122 for architects and package 16A-
- 12 | 4123 for certified interior designers and the Act 41
- 13 Licensure by Endorsement.
- 14 Mr. Endler asked Mr. Farrell if there was any
- 15 update for the one in the pipeline, Regulation 16A-
- 16 4112. Mr. Farrell replied that it was moving
- 17 | forward, and he felt confident it would be completed
- 18 in a timely fashion.
- 19 Mr. Farrell commented that the Board had already
- 20 approved and voted on the matters, and it was just a
- 21 | matter of obtaining the internal approvals needed.]

President McClenaghan began by stating that the next big event was the annual meeting in June coupled with the Region 2 strategic planning event. She advised the Board that the Region 2 event was requesting that all member Board executives participate and that she needed one more Board member, along with Jessica Harris, that could guarantee their attendance for the meeting.

Additionally, President McClenaghan notified the Board that the Region 2 event was expecting to be able to do virtual interviews with representatives from several different jurisdictions. She stated Mr. Bates would be one of the interviewees for this event and inquired as to who else would be interested in participating. Mr. Roller replied that he would be happy to interview as well.

President McClenaghan finished up her report by notifying the Board of the upcoming elections for various positions at NCARB, which would be held at the June meeting. She advised the Board that they would have this topic on the agenda for the May meeting as they would need to decide who they would want to elect for the NCARB positions. She also stated that there was a contested election for the

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secretary/treasurer position and that currently
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   George Miller, Miquel Rodriguez and Scott Harm were
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   all running for the position. She encouraged the
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   Board to review the biographical profiles of the
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   above-referenced and to be prepared to discuss at the
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   main meeting.]
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   Report of Board Administrator - No report

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   Goshert, when registration renewals opened. Ms.
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   Goshert replied that it was generally about 60 days
