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   Report of Board Counsel - Regulations
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   [Marc Farrell, Esquire, Regulatory Counsel, Office of
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   Chief Counsel, Department of State, addressed the
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   restructuring of the counsel division. He noted the
22
   counsel division had only one attorney to work on
23
   regulations up until about a year ago when two
24
   additional regulatory counsel were added to keep the
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   regulations moving as sufficiently as possible.
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Mr. Farrell stated the Board's open regulatory packages have decreased from two to one. He informed Board members that he and Mr. Jayman attended the Independent Regulatory Review Commission's public meeting on June 20, noting 16A-6412 regarding the Act 41 licensure by endorsement rulemaking package was approved.

Mr. Farrell stated the licensure by endorsement rulemaking package is now with the Office of Attorney General and is in the final step in the process. He believed it would be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* as the final regulation. He mentioned the Board has already been applying the Act 41 principles in the interim structure that they established.

Mr. Farrell referred to 16A-6410 regarding Act 88 amendments. He explained that there are three main components to any rulemaking or regulatory package. He noted the annex is the actual language from the regulations into which they have interspersed the changes, additions, and deletions from the Board.

Mr. Farrell noted the preamble is the story of why the changes are being made and what is supporting the changes being made. He also noted the Regulatory Analysis Form (RAF) is a lengthy, technical document that the Independent Regulatory Review Commission

requires.

Mr. Farrell stated boards will typically approve the preamble and the annex but not so much the RAF. He reported that the annex and preamble are ready but that the Board has not voted on the annex and has never been presented with the preamble. He noted that he would be sending the preamble and annex to the Board administrator this week, so they have plenty of time to review the documents and prepare for a vote at the next meeting.

Mr. Farrell will continue to work on the RAF and then the next step would be to send the annex and and preamble to the Governor's Office on September 10, 2024, if the Board approves the documents. He noted prior Board discussion in the minutes concerning the regulations and the importance of getting the regulations changed for Board members.

Mr. Hostetter asked whether Board members would be able to get back with Mr. Farrell if they have any questions or changes, so the final is ready for the next meeting.

Mr. Farrell offered to get back with the Board after he checks with Deputy Chief Counsel. He noted the Board could vote to approve after the changes were discussed at the next meeting.]
