9 [Marc Farrell, Esquire, Regulatory Counsel, Office of
10 Chief Counsel, reported on the current status of the
11 Board's regulations. Licensure by Endorsement Act 41
12 is a proposed rulemaking which was published for
13 public comment since the March 2025 meeting. He
14 noted no public comments were received. The package
15 is currently with the Independent Regulatory Review
16 Commission (IRRC). After IRRC's review, the package
17 will move into the final rulemaking phase.]

19 Report of Regulatory Counsel - Proposed Reg. No. 16A-
20 4210 - current Schedule of Civil Penalties
21 [Marc Farrell, Esquire, Regulatory Counsel, Office of
22 Chief Counsel, reported Regulation 16A-4210, Schedule
23 of Civil Penalties, sets forth the various citations
24 the Board can issue under Act 48 of 1993. The
25 schedule streamlines the disciplinary process by

1 eliminating the need for formal orders. He noted the
2 schedule was last updated about 20 years ago, so fine
3 dollar amounts might need to be increased. He
4 provided the current schedule for the Board to
5 review. He stated, at the next meeting, the Board
6 could make recommendations on changes. He was
7 working with Prosecution attorneys for suggestions.]

21 [Arion R. Claggett, Acting Commissioner, Bureau of
22 Professional and Occupational Affairs, congratulated
23 Stefan Holloway on his appointment to the Board.

24 Acting Commissioner Claggett announced the
25 Board's ability to have meetings at off-site

1 locations. He provided instances of other boards
2 off-site meetings. He noted, if a barber school were
3 interested in hosting, it would need to have a
4 conference room.]

6 Report of Board Administrator - No Report

7 ***

8 Matters of Public - Questions from Public Attendees
9 [John Christopher, Professional Member, reported the
10 National Association of Barber Boards would be
11 hosting their mid-winter conference in Charleston,
12 South Carolina, February 22-24, 2026. He added the
13 annual conference would be held the third week of
14 September in Charlotte, North Carolina. He noted it
15 would be nice to have a Board delegate at the
16 conferences other than himself. It was noted the
17 topic would be added to the next Agenda.]

18 ***

19 [Tyshawn Williams, Teacher, Barber, Faded Precision
20 Barbering, presented concerns regarding the
21 difference in graduation and examination requirements
22 between the barber industry and cosmetology industry.
23 He noted barber students are required to take tests
24 on skills they do not use on a regular basis, if
25 ever. He stated both industries study the same book

1 with the same number of hours, but cosmetologists
2 have a number of different fields they can enter
3 after school while barbers do not.

4 Mr. Williams expressed frustration at the
5 difficulties students have entering the industry. He
6 added, at some point, the challenges will impact the
7 ability of people to be licensed.

8 Mr. Merten addressed the concerns presented by
9 Mr. Williams. He stated cosmetology has had more
10 recent changes in their regulations than barbering.
11 He noted the Board is working on regulation changes
12 which may address some of the concerns. He added a
13 third party administers the tests, and he was unaware
14 of when the barber test was established.

15 Ms. Evans noted both herself and the Cosmetology
16 Board Administrator meet with the testing agency on
17 an annual basis to review the test topics and pass
18 rates. She added the main difference is that
19 cosmetology students take the theory exam while
20 barber students take the theory exam and the
21 practical exam where they have to demonstrate
22 practices they may not necessarily use in the shop.

23 Mr. Holloway introduced himself as an employee
24 of the testing company and discussed the requirements
25 on the practical exam. He disagreed with the

1 decision to allow cosmetology students to only take
2 the theory exam. He believed in the importance of
3 being well-versed in chemicals and how to apply them
4 correctly. He understood the frustrations expressed
5 by Mr. Williams.

6 Mr. Merten noted the requirement of barbering
7 students to take the theory exam and the practical
8 exam is a legislative issue and not something the
9 Board can address.

10 Mr. Williams reiterated his concerns over the
11 disparity between the two industries.

12 Mr. Merten noted the changes for the cosmetology
13 exams came through legislative changes; therefore,
14 any parity between the industries would have to go
15 through legislature. He extended appreciation to Mr.
16 Williams for bringing his concerns to the Board.]
