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first by stating, after the Proposed Annex was circulated, a positive comment was received from Dr.

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   Jeffrey Wack of the CFOP, (Chiropractic Fellowship of

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   to the board members at the CFOP, which was
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   unanimously in favor of it. Dr. Wack requested an
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   in-person meeting with their peers.

4 [Dr. Andrew Heck, President of the Pennsylvania

5 | Chiropractic Association, presented on the topic of

6 chiropractic practitioners as they relate to, or not,

7 | the ongoing care and treatment of athletes in

8 Pennsylvania. He stated the PCA was currently

9 aligned with the Board's current practice act and

10 regulations. He requested a declaration of

11 regulatory clarity for the practitioners across the

12 state and was seeking confirmation of that existing

13 scope.

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Dr. Heck began to clarify the physical issues

15 that might play a significant role in determining

16 whether or not an athlete can participate in their

17 | sport of choice. Some of the physical exam history

18 might include past injuries to the athlete,

19 underlying health conditions, a baseline health

20 report, etc. The exams are conducted in a

21 | musculoskeletal setting. Additionally, those exams

22 | would consist of cardiovascular exams, respiratory

23 | system exams, abdominal exams, ears, nose, throat,

24 | vision and more.

25 Dr. Heck stated individuals that are training or

1 taking care of the athletes must follow the rules of 2 the PCA.

He advised the Board that every licensed chiropractor had to demonstrate the ability to identify systemic abnormalities, such as those previously noted, on their board exams.

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Dr. Heck continued by stating the purpose of the regional examination for a chiropractor would be for the purposes of referral if the management falls outside of their current scope of musculoskeletal system. Chiropractors must be able to detect systemic abnormalities, identify vital signs, and if needed, refer the athlete to the appropriate doctor for further evaluation. Currently, Dr. Heck stated medical doctors are the only practitioners that can legally send an athlete back to their athletic trainer after treatment. Chiropractors, on the other hand, are not legally qualified to return an athlete back to practice after treatment. If an athlete prefers a chiropractor over a medical doctor, he or she could see a chiropractor but would then have to be examined by a medical doctor after chiropractic treatment and before being accepted back into the play of practice. This method is time consuming since the chiropractor cannot send the athlete

directly back into the play of practice.

Dr. Heck commented on the fact that chiropractors can perform all of the above-mentioned processes with Paralympic athletes, collegiate, and professional athletes. They are excluded from practicing from within the scholastic athletic setting, for which he provided examples.

He suggested, if chiropractors are able to participate in the return to play decision, an athlete can then go to the chiropractor who is able to release that patient directly back to the athletic trainer and return onto the field of play.

Dr. Heck discussed additional training that provides the education for sideline care. The CCSP and the DACBSP training provide such training. The CCSP is a postgraduate education in sports medicine injury management. The emphasis would be on emergency procedures, injury triage, spinal injury management, concussions, etc. The diplomate program is a 300-hour course with 100 hours spent hands on the field of play. There is a board examination to determine if the practitioner has the skills to complete the criteria for this education.

Dr. Heck stated the Pennsylvania Chiropractic Association is respectfully asking that the

Pennsylvania State Board of Chiropractic make a motion to direct Regulatory Counsel to confirm that chiropractors licensed in Pennsylvania are authorized to perform pre-participation examinations, participate in return to play decisions, and participate in sideline care athletic events with appropriate additional training and credentials such as the CCSP or the DACBSP.

Ms. Oquendo asked how often the chiropractors were taking the NBCE (National Board of Chiropractor Examiners) board exams. Dr. Khoury stated the physical examinations and the sideline training for the PPEs were already within any chiropractor's training. He understood what Ms. Oquendo was asking about were the additional certifications like the Diplomate program and CCSP. He advised her that those programs are approved specialties through the American Chiropractic Association, doctors that have additional training in specific areas of practice.

It was clarified what was being proposed with the Annex. The proposal would allow the State Board of Chiropractic in Pennsylvania to regulate those practitioners that claim to be specialists but are not. The regulation would give the Board the ability to impose sanctions on those that falsify their

"specialty" practice.

Dr. Miller also suggested that this presentation should be given to the PIAA (Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association), further commenting that the PIAA decides who they want on their panel and they chose not to have chiropractors on it.

Dr. Miller opined that being able to pursue another type of industry, for example, becoming examiners for pilots and having the full scope as certified medical examiners, might be an option. If this process could be achieved and then presented to the PIAA, it might allow them to see the medical credentials of those doing the pilot exams, and therefore approve and include chiropractors as being on their team.

Dr. Moreland reiterated the belief that the purpose of the Board's discussion was not so much about relating this to the PIAA. He focused on the fact that the regulation was to be able to gain clarity on their current scope of practice. He stated that their Board was looking for a declaration that they could use their practice in all settings.

Dr. Miller agreed wholeheartedly with Dr. Moreland's comments and felt they needed more clarity

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from the Board.

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Dr. Heck brought up the option of preparing a statement of policy about this regulation which might help to clarify the situation. He also requested that the Board Administrator forward the same to him and to Board Counsel for the purpose of having a contact person within the Board in order to commence a dialogue regarding this subject.

An additional factor in processing the method by which they could become a part of the PIAA panel would be to inform them of a chiropractor's ability to perform permit physicals, which also has a regional examination component to it.

Mr. McCullough thanked Dr. Heck for bringing this presentation to their attention. He also suggested that Mr. Davis would be working with Board Counsel.]
