A variety of programs help the 25 underserved areas of need. She stated the data that

is collected through their survey services significantly helps the PCO to assist the Board in applying for the PCO programs, thereby increasing the workforce in Pennsylvania of same.

Ms. Iqbal explained that shortage designations identify an area, population or facility experiencing a shortage of health care services. The Health Resources and Services Administration, (HRSA), creates new shortage designations and preserves the underserved ones already included.

The surveys include all occupational positions within the medical field. The timing of the surveys coincided with the two-year re-licensure periods. The information gathered from the surveys and re-licensure periods helps the PCO understand the specific nature and practice of each practicing medical professional. Included in the surveys are requests for the geographical locations of the medical professionals, the hours per week providing direct patient care, the percentage of patients paying with Medicaid, and others areas of specific interest that impact the potential designations of new shortage locations and preserve the already existing underserved ones. This is the primary data used by the PCO as it supports a workforce analysis

understanding. It helps the Department of Health, state legislators, and stakeholders design strategies for where and when to address underserved healthcare needs. There are over 400 geographic populations and facility health professional shortage areas designated in the state of Pennsylvania and another 155 medically underserved areas in same.

- Ms. Iqbal commented that helping practitioners to qualify for federal or state recruitment helps boost the workforce in that area. She noted the need for up-to-date data from medical professional between and during the two-year period in which re-licensures are conducted.
- Ms. Iqbal requested members visit the CMS website in the NPI and update their practice details. She strongly encouraged members to reach out to other professionals to explain the importance of completing these surveys.
- Ms. Iqbal discussed focusing on general medical providers and not necessarily specialties like audiologists or chiropractor. This was due to the fact that the federal and state grants were geared towards general medical, mental health and dental care providers. It is a survey that is not required legislatively, but it is required for statistical

1 data.

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Dr. Woodland asked if the surveys were collecting information on the age of the providers. Ms. Iqbal answered in the affirmative with the stipulation that gathering this type of data helps to acknowledge that a number of older practitioners could be retiring in five years or so. She discussed keeping the data accurate regarding practicing providers.

Dr. Woodland then inquired if there were concerns about the new budget. Ms. Iqbal agreed that it was a concern but countered with the information that Governor Shapiro had proposed a fifteen million dollar increase to help with the loan repayment program, which would be split across different providers.]

13 Report of Board Administrator - No Report

Report on Committee of License Qualifications
[Gerald Dillon, Ph.D., reported to members that
graduates of Canadian medical schools will no longer
be accredited because the LCME (Liaison Committee on
Medical Education) has withdrawn its accreditation
status from Canadian medical schools.

Dr. Dillon wanted to let the Pennsylvania State
Board of Medicine know the volume of his committee's
input. He further explained that their committee
oversees requests to review applications and license
issues in order to expedite those that can move

- 1 forward more quickly. For the first half of 2025 the
- 2 | committee received approximately 45 applicant cases
- 3 to review and was able to approve about two-thirds of
- 4 them, thus allowing those cases to move forward
- 5 | without requiring review and approval by the full
- 6 Board."
- 7 Report of Committee on Legislation/Policy Development
- 8 and Review
- 9 [Mark B. Woodland, M.S., M.D., FACOG, informed
- 10 members that this committee is to bring forth issues
- 11 | that might impact licensure workforce within
- 12 legislative issues within the Commonwealth.
- 13 He stated the Pennsylvania Rule of Civil
- 14 Procedure 1006A1 contained a venue rule change. In
- 15 the late 1990s, the Pennsylvania Supreme Court
- 16 | initially declared a venue change in the rule of
- 17 Civil Procedure, 1006.81, that medical cases filing
- 18 against medical providers were limited to filing
- 19 within the same venue that they had occurred. This
- 20 lowered the cost of medical malpractice liability and
- 21 caused a decrease in the number of cases filed
- 22 throughout the state.
- 23 This rule of 2023 was repealed by the Superior
- 24 | Court of PA which has had a significant impact on the
- 25 medical community. Plaintiff awards have increased.

- Legal filings are submitted to different venues,

 depending on what might be the most favorable venue

 to file pleadings or how much a certain court or

 venue might award the plaintiff should they win their

 case.
 - Dr. Woodland commented that the Procedure Rules
 Committee of the Supreme Court will review the impact
 rule change.

- Dr. Woodland advised members that the Federation of State Medical Boards has held that the deadline for submitting comments regarding alternate pathways for licensure is July 11th, 2025.
- He further informed the members that the US Supreme Court (SCOTUS) issued a ruling at the end of June in favor of the Affordable Care Act.
- Additionally, Dr. Woodland suggested that anyone wanting to join the Journal Medical Regulation as part of the review panel to please let him know. He forewarned members about the ability of the United States Preventative Task Force to continue to make recommendations on preventative services and the fact that all states will have the culpability of abiding by those issues.
- Dr. Woodland mentioned that the AMA had written a letter about the impact of the recent limitations on

1 visas and non U.S. citizens and the potential impact 2 it may have on the workforce.

Lastly, he stated that Representative Arvin

Venkat of Allegheny County proactively put together

protecting vaccine access legislation that may be of

interest for us here in the Commonwealth should

things go south with vaccines.

Chair Yealy noted his concerns about what he believed to be a misunderstanding that individuals, who have completed medical training outside of Pennsylvania, must complete full retraining. He emphasized that anyone completing medical school or a residency elsewhere might need to do partial retraining. The state of Pennsylvania recognizes that there are several different pathways to licensure and that his hope was that the people of the Commonwealth understood that.]

23 [Robert Bonacci, M.D., Department of Health, informed

24 members about the measles outbreak in the U.S. and

cautioned them about the importance of keeping up with the MMR vaccine.

He also updated members on HANS, health alerts, that have been issued for Pennsylvania including the recent heat dome that hovered over the state, as well as advising tips to avoid heat stroke.

Dr. Bonacci informed Board members about the existence of a drug known as medetomidine, typically used by veterinarians as a sedative or anesthesia for animals but now being recognized for its overdoses and withdrawal symptoms for human drug users.

He further alluded to the fentanyl drug supply in the state having been contaminated with xylazine, a sedative. The xylazine contamination in fentanyl is decreasing but the medetomidine is replacing it. He suggested that medications such as dexmedetomidine or clonidine can help with the withdrawal of medetomidine.

Dr. Woodland asked Dr. Bonacci about any updates on mosquito-borne illnesses or anything similar. Dr. Bonacci stated the bigger issue might be tick-borne illnesses and to take precautions when outside.

Chair Yealy recognized and introduced Dr. Mike Lynch and Dr. Jeanne Marie Perrone, who have contributed to educating the Commonwealth and the
