He provided a brief 21 introduction of PCH4. He explained PHC4 is 22 conducting a three-year study on non-compete 23 agreements and their impact to healthcare in 24 Pennsylvania. Act 47 of 2024, the Fair Contracting 25 for Healthcare Practitioners, limited the

length of non-compete agreements and added administrative requirements on employers.

Mr. Muskovitz provided the Board with an example of a standard non-compete and reviewed the example with the Board. Prior to Act 47, there were four rules in which the court system in Pennsylvania would use to judge the outcome of contract disputes: Attachment to a lawful agreement like an employment contract, association with additional compensation, protection of legitimate interests such as referral and patient lists, and a reasonable limitation in either duration and geographic extent. Act 47 now limits the length of non-compete agreements to one year maximum and the agreements are only enforceable upon voluntary departure of the employee. employee is terminated for cause, the agreement is considered void. The law is for five specific license types: MDs, DOs, Pas, CRNPs, and CRNAs.

Mr. Muskovitz noted the last paragraph of the law instructed PHC4 to conduct the three-year study and report the findings to both health committees of the legislature at the begging of 2028. He reviewed the prior survey steps PHC4 had conducted, such as public comments, training a model to recognize thematic sentences and semantic meaning, and a hands-on care

provider survey. There is a second public comment period planned for the beginning of 2027, and the same model will be used to review the comments to identify changes over time.

Early results from the voluntary provider survey captured slightly less than 200 MDs, roughly 45 percent of the population. Mr. Muskovitz reviewed different parts of the survey with the Board. He also presented how the survey results can be filtered to look at specific information to help with such requests as tracking of filed civil lawsuits, which was a request of support staff within the legislature. He discussed the data collecting efforts across the Commonwealth in ways other than the survey. These ways include data sources within the Pennsylvania government, such as the Department of Health, as well as from employers and the Hospital and Health System Association of Pennsylvania.

Mr. Muskovitz concluded his presentation by reviewing different ways to keep in touch with PHC4 including their website, newsletter and email. He also offered QR codes to PHC4's contact information, public reports and case studies.

Dr. Woodland stated in his opinion, non-compete agreements can be prejudicial for physicians and

interfere with professional development and career opportunities. He added he believed if physicians were organized, perhaps non-compete agreements would be challenged as being legal in the first place.
