20 Report of Board Counsel - Regulatory Report - Status  
21 of Regulations

22 [Jacqueline Wolfgang, Esquire, Regulatory Counsel,  
23 stated Regulation 16A-4960, Continuing Education and  
24 Volunteer License, was approved by the Office of  
25 General Counsel and Policy and submitted to the

1 Office of Attorney General (OAG) on September 12,  
2 2025. OAG has 30 days to review the regulation. She  
3 noted, after OAG's review and approval, the  
4 regulation can be published as proposed at the end of  
5 October 2025. Once published, there is a 30-day  
6 comment period. Ms. Wolfgang noted after the comment  
7 period, she would return to the Board with any  
8 comments or questions on the regulation.]

10 Report of Board Counsel - Regulatory Report - 16A-  
11 4954 - General Revisions and Updates - Proposed  
12 Rulemaking

13 [Jacqueline Wolfgang, Esquire, Regulatory Counsel,  
14 explained Regulation 16A-4945, General Updates to  
15 Licenses and Permits, proposed to update and clarify  
16 regulatory provisions. She stated the regulation is  
17 a comprehensive review with many proposed changes,  
18 many of which are just clarifying the Board's  
19 existing process.

20 Ms. Wolfgang reviewed the changes covered by the  
21 regulation. The four existing license statuses,  
22 active, expired, inactive and active retired, are  
23 being made more transparent for the regulated  
24 community. References to license registration are  
25 being replaced with the term renewal throughout the

1 regulations to clarify the biennium renewal process.

2 Additional updates include aligning procedures  
3 for applicants seeking initial licensure or  
4 reactivation after being out of clinical practice for  
5 more than four years, implementing the Act 16 of 2022  
6 Amendments to the Medical Practice Act, and removing  
7 the limit on affiliated facilities for institutional  
8 license holders. The regulation will also allow for  
9 the issuance of temporary licenses to physicians  
10 during emergency declarations.

11 Regarding educational changes, the regulation  
12 enables educational institutions to verify the  
13 completion of the educational portion of a degree  
14 program for prosthetists and orthotists applying for  
15 graduate permits. The regulation removes the seven-  
16 year time limit for completing the United States  
17 Medical License Examination. The regulation also  
18 updates the English proficiency regulations for  
19 consistency in the Board's regulations.

20 Ms. Wolfgang noted the regulation creates an  
21 exception to the 30-day limitation on prescribing  
22 Schedule II controlled substances for physician  
23 assistants prescribing intrathecal pumps.

24 The regulation also clarifies that active retired  
25 licensees need to complete mandatory continuing

1 education requirements in child abuse and opioid  
2 continuing education.

3 Ms. Wolfgang discussed page 27, Section 18.158 of  
4 the Annex, the prescribing and dispensing drugs,  
5 pharmaceutical aids and devices. She noted the Board  
6 had previously discussed allowing physician  
7 assistants to prescribe a supply of up to 60 days for  
8 medications delivered via intrathecal pain pumps,  
9 provided the supervising physician had approved the  
10 prescription for ongoing therapy. She also acts as  
11 senior Regulatory Counsel for the State Board of  
12 Nursing, which is permitting CRNPs to prescribe up to  
13 a 90-day supply in the same situation. She  
14 questioned whether the Board wanted to consider  
15 changing the up to a 60-day supply to up to a 90-day  
16 supply.

17 Dr. Woodland asked if the Nursing Board chose 90-  
18 days because of the typical length of a prescription.  
19 Chair Yealy noted common prescription lengths are 30,  
20 60 or 90 days, depending on malady and treatment  
21 being offered. He added that physician assistants  
22 and CRNPs should be aligned whenever possible.

23 Chair Yealy did not see any reason 90-days would  
24 be a problem. He added the Board wants to empower  
25 people to have the flexibility to meet their

1 patient's needs.

2 Dr. Woodland added his support for being  
3 consistent with other boards.

4 Chair Yealy expressed gratitude for Ms.  
5 Wolfgang's work in updating the regulations.

6 Ms. Wolfgang added her appreciation for Ms.  
7 Archer. She reviewed the steps of the regulation  
8 process for the Board. She noted the regulation will  
9 go through several steps prior to being published as  
10 proposed for the public comment period and IRRC  
11 review.]

20 [Mark B. Woodland, M.S., M.D., FACOG, reported the  
21 Federation of State Medical Boards (FSMB) has put  
22 forth an initiative called Care Matters to raise  
23 public awareness as to the importance of the state  
24 medical boards. He added the website,  
25 [carematter.org](http://carematter.org), has a video.

1 FSMB has put out recommendations for awards and  
2 nominations. He has been nominated for chair elect  
3 of FSMB for next year.

4 Dr. Woodland also reported the Department of  
5 Health and Human Services sent a letter to all  
6 medical organizations, including FSMB, regarding  
7 efforts on nutrition, specifically nutrition in  
8 medical education. The letter asked for responses  
9 from every medical group asking how they address  
10 nutrition in the educational process.

11 Dr. Woodland shared the FSMB quarterly newsletter  
12 spotlighted the census, Care Matters, updates on  
13 federal advocacy, the Share Act, and new educational  
14 videos.

15 Mr. Dillon is a member of FSMB's state medical  
16 board panel to the USMLE program. He added the panel  
17 would be meeting at the beginning of October 2025.  
18 He offered to take feedback from the Board and staff  
19 members, related to the USMLE program to the meeting.

20 Chair Yealy recognized how engaged the Board of  
21 Medicine is with FSMB. He noted it demonstrates  
22 evidence of how committed they are to the job in  
23 Pennsylvania but also making sure they are on the  
24 leading edge and congruent with everything happening  
25 around the country.]

10 [Mark B. Woodland, M.S., M.D., FACOG, reported the  
11 Department of Homeland Security has sent out a ruling  
12 of a \$100,000 fee for H-1B visas. AMA and other  
13 medical groups are challenging the ruling and asking  
14 for an exemption as the ruling will greatly affect  
15 the graduate medical education programs.

16 Dr. Woodland noted comments were made regarding  
17 acetaminophen use, pregnancy and autism. He added a  
18 number of organizations, including American College  
19 of OBGYN, have touted acetaminophen to be safe for  
20 limited use in pregnancy. He reported two autistic  
21 lawmakers in Pennsylvania have brought forth issues  
22 about how autism is being used politically and people  
23 should be careful about that moving forward.

24 Dr. Woodland concluded his report by explaining  
25 the Association of American Medical Colleges

1 collected state-by-state data on graduate medical  
2 education. Pennsylvania has approximately 8,000  
3 residents in training, 6,500 of which are supported  
4 by GME slots from Medicare. He noted 30 percent of  
5 physicians who train in Pennsylvania still practice  
6 in the state. He added his full report was listed in  
7 writing for the Board along with related websites.]

9 Report of Committee on Health-Related Professionals -  
10 No Report

12 Report of Department of Health  
13 [Robert Bonacci, M.D. on behalf of Debra Bogan, M.D.,  
14 FAAP, Secretary Department of Health, reminded  
15 everyone the new Department of Health (DOH) guidance  
16 on vaccines points to the recommendations of trusted  
17 experts, including American Academy of Pediatrics,  
18 American Academy of Family Physicians and American  
19 College of Obstetrics and Gynecology.

20 Dr. Bonacci noted DOH had recently released  
21 frequently asked questions for the COVID- 19 vaccine  
22 in Pennsylvania which included specific guidance on  
23 vaccination as well as questions related to that for  
24 patients and health care practitioners. He added,  
25 relevant to the physician community, it is

1 recommended adults who are 19 to 64 years old, who  
2 are health care workers, receive the 2025/2026 COVID  
3 vaccine. All adults 65 and older are also  
4 recommended to get the vaccine regardless of risk  
5 factors.

6 Dr. Bonacci stated the Health Alert Network at  
7 DOH had sent out guidance on work exclusions for  
8 health care personnel with respiratory viral  
9 infections. He explained DOH recommends restricting  
10 activity from work for at least three days from  
11 symptom onset until moderate to severe symptoms have  
12 passed. If work restrictions are not possible for  
13 any reason, a face mask should be worn in all patient  
14 care areas and common areas in the health care  
15 facility.

16 Dr. Bonacci noted there is a second health alert  
17 related to preparedness as respiratory illness season  
18 starts. He added the key takeaway is the importance  
19 of making sure practitioners and patients are  
20 vaccinated.

21 Chair Yealy stated the Board of Medicine fully  
22 supports the Department of Health. He noted DOH  
23 gathers information from many different sources to  
24 make recommendations and has been entrusted since its  
25 inception to give advice and direct guidance in the

1 Commonwealth to ensure the health of the people  
2 living there.]

5 will be days or weeks appreciated emergency nurses,  
6 medical technicians and pharmacy technicians. He

10 Chair Yealy recognized October is Metastatic  
11 Breast Cancer Awareness Month. He noted the disease  
12 disproportionately affects women and while progress
