regulations to clarify the biennium renewal process.

Additional updates include aligning procedures for applicants seeking initial licensure or reactivation after being out of clinical practice for more than four years, implementing the Act 16 of 2022 Amendments to the Medical Practice Act, and removing the limit on affiliated facilities for institutional license holders. The regulation will also allow for the issuance of temporary licenses to physicians during emergency declarations.

Regarding educational changes, the regulation enables educational institutions to verify the completion of the educational portion of a degree program for prosthetists and orthotists applying for graduate permits. The regulation removes the seven-year time limit for completing the United States Medical License Examination. The regulation also updates the English proficiency regulations for consistency in the Board's regulations.

Ms. Wolfgang noted the regulation creates an exception to the 30-day limitation on prescribing Schedule II controlled substances for physician assistants prescribing intrathecal pumps.

The regulation also clarifies that active retired licensees need to complete mandatory continuing

education requirements in child abuse and opioid continuing education.

Ms. Wolfgang discussed page 27, Section 18.158 of the Annex, the prescribing and dispensing drugs, pharmaceutical aids and devices. She noted the Board had previously discussed allowing physician assistants to prescribe a supply of up to 60 days for medications delivered via intrathecal pain pumps, provided the supervising physician had approved the prescription for ongoing therapy. She also acts as senior Regulatory Counsel for the State Board of Nursing, which is permitting CRNPs to prescribe up to a 90-day supply in the same situation. She questioned whether the Board wanted to consider changing the up to a 60-day supply to up to a 90-day supply.

Dr. Woodland asked if the Nursing Board chose 90-days because of the typical length of a prescription.

Chair Yealy noted common prescription lengths are 30, 60 or 90 days, depending on malady and treatment being offered. He added that physician assistants and CRNPs should be aligned whenever possible.

Chair Yealy did not see any reason 90-days would be a problem. He added the Board wants to empower people to have the flexibility to meet their

patient's needs.

Dr. Woodland added his support for being consistent with other boards.

Chair Yealy expressed gratitude for Ms. Wolfgang's work in updating the regulations.

Ms. Wolfgang added her appreciation for Ms.

Archer. She reviewed the steps of the regulation process for the Board. She noted the regulation will go through several steps prior to being published as proposed for the public comment period and IRRC review.]

Dr. Bonacci noted there is a second health alert related to preparedness as respiratory illness season starts. He added the key takeaway is the importance of making sure practitioners and patients are vaccinated.

Chair Yealy stated the Board of Medicine fully supports the Department of Health. He noted DOH gathers information from many different sources to make recommendations and has been entrusted since its inception to give advice and direct guidance in the
