  clinical competency evaluations; the Quality of Care

  Assessment for cases involving variation in care or

  complaints; the Practice Monitoring Program, which

  includes both on-site and remote oversight; and the

  ATM Program (Assessment, Training, Monitoring)
9
  developed to address controlled substance prescribing
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patterns.

Ms. Ziegler also described the Fitness for Duty
Assessment, used to determine if a provider is
physically and cognitively able to fulfill
professional responsibilities, and the Professional
Support Program, developed in response to referrals
involving disruptive behavior and expanded to address
systemic and burnout issues.

Ms. Ziegler continued by detailing Lifeguard's

ABEM Re-eligibility Program, launched in 2022 in

collaboration with the American Board of Emergency

Medicine to support physicians who timed out of board

eligibility through a structured six-month program.

She described assessment components including

knowledge exams using NBME and specialty question

banks; neurocognitive evaluations performed by

1 licensed neuropsychologists; physician reviewer

- 2 | interviews; oral case presentations tailored to
- 3 participants' specialties; and standardized patient
- 4 | simulations conducted through partnerships with Penn
- 5 | State Hershey and Texas A&M's KSTAR program.
- 6 Additional tools included randomized medical records
- 7 reviews and hands-on simulation labs, particularly
- 8 for surgical and anesthesia assessments. Enrollment
- 9 begins with an intake conversation and submission of
- 10 documentation such as a CV, NPDB report, and board
- 11 correspondence, followed by proposal generation,
- 12 acceptance, and payment. Assessments typically span
- 13 two to three days and are mostly conducted on-site,
- 14 though remote options are available. Final results
- 15 are reviewed by the physician team and compiled into
- 16 a report within two weeks of completion.

1 [Jacqueline A. Wolfgang, Esquire, Regulatory Counsel,
2 reported on the status of regulations listed under
3 Item 27 on the Agenda.

She noted that proposed regulation 16A-4945, regarding general updates to licenses and permits, was drafted by Board counsel Ms. Archer and was currently under her review, with plans to present it to the Board by July or August. She also updated the Board on regulation 16A-4955 concerning Physician Assistants, which was unanimously approved by the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) on May 15, 2025. The regulation was under review by the Office of Attorney General, with publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin expected by the end of June, pending timely approval. She thanked Ms. Archer for her expertise in advancing both regulations.

Ms. Wolfgang discussed regulation 16A-4960 on Continuing Education and Volunteer Licenses. The exposure draft was circulated to stakeholders in September 2025, and feedback from the Pennsylvania Medical Society (PA Med) was reviewed. She made several clarifying, non-substantive amendments to the Annex, including adding definitions for primary health services and types of retired practitioners, removing a redundant child abuse training

requirement, clarifying that the organ donation training was a one-time requirement, and specifying that the PA support curriculum was not mandatory.

Dr. Woodland expressed concern about the mandated organ donation training, noting that Pennsylvania was the only state to require it and that medical schools already provided such education. He questioned the scope of organ donation and the relevance of this mandate compared to other CME topics. He urged consideration of the educational value and necessity of such mandates.

Ms. Wolfgang acknowledged his concerns but reiterated that the mandate was legislatively required and outside her control, although she appreciated the feedback.

Chair Yealy thanked Ms. Wolfgang for her efforts to clarify and streamline the regulations and emphasized the Board's appreciation for her work within legislative constraints.

Dr. Woodland requested an update on the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact.

Acting Commissioner Claggett responded that full implementation of the Compact was still on track for June 2025, though no specific date had been confirmed. He stated that a definitive date and related communications, including email blasts and press releases, would be provided once available.

Ms. Wolfgang added that although a regulation had been considered for the Compact, discussions with Board counsel indicated it might not be necessary.

Ms. Archer confirmed that no regulation was required to implement the Compact. Any future regulation would be optional and potentially address matters such as application fees, but was not essential for initial implementation.]

He suggested that expanding the scope of practice for genetic counselors was necessary and predicted that, in the future, individuals would likely have both a primary care provider and a genetic counselor to interpret their genome and guide healthcare decisions. He recommended closely monitoring the bill.

Chair Yealy agreed with Dr. Woodland's assessment. He briefly commented on House Bill 1066, acknowledging it as an interesting initiative and asked to be updated on its status.]

Dr. Woodland further emphasized the significance of Mr. Dillon's role, linking it to broader issues of corporatization in healthcare, including hospital closures and reduced access to care in Pennsylvania. He noted a national movement toward unionizing physicians and the involvement of graduate medical education representatives. He announced his own reelection to the FSMB Executive Committee and appointment as chair of the FSMB Journal Oversight Committee, a three-year position.

Dr. Woodland then identified five major FSMB conference sessions of interest: artificial intelligence in medicine, physician competency evaluation, innovation in CME accreditation, misconceptions about medical regulation and licensure among new physicians, and discussion of a national practice registry. He also noted a delegate vote establishing an advisory commission on licensing

Dr. Bonacci responded that while community water fluoridation decisions in Pennsylvania are made locally, the Department does provide online information supporting its dental health benefits. He acknowledged the importance of the issue and committed to sharing further resources.

Dr. Woodland emphasized the need for the

Department of Health to both react to and proactively

manage information, ensuring the public receives

scientifically supported guidance amidst the spread

Report of Board Chair

[Donald M. Yealy, M.D., FACEP, Chair, recognized recent national observances, noting that two weeks prior was National Nursing Week and encouraging ongoing appreciation for nurses across the Commonwealth and the Board of Nursing. He also acknowledged EMS Week, emphasizing the vital and often unrecognized work of emergency medical service providers who respond to critical, time-sensitive situations in unpredictable environments.

Chair Yealy reported emerging public health developments in Pennsylvania, highlighting early findings in Philadelphia and Pittsburgh on Medetomidine, a new street drug adulterant replacing Xylazine in opioid exposures. He explained that Medetomidine, an alpha agonist causing deep sedation, presented a rapid and severe withdrawal profile, unlike Xylazine. He noted firsthand experience managing this withdrawal as an emergency physician

and commended licensed partners for sharing data that
the CDC and MMWR have since adopted, underscoring
Pennsylvania's national leadership in early detection
and response to substance use trends.

Finally, Chair Yealy discussed the Board's ongoing efforts to ensure access to skilled healthcare providers while minimizing unnecessary barriers. He emphasized initiatives such as the Interstate Licensure Compact, veteran reentry pathways, and accommodations for internationally trained professionals, clarifying that retraining is not always required. He also referenced changes inspired by the Lorna Breen Foundation to reduce stigma around mental health in licensure applications. He praised the Board's forward-thinking approach and encouraged greater awareness of its thoughtful, progressive efforts to support high-quality, accessible care across the Commonwealth.]
