The Board 11 returned to open session at 10:30 a.m.] 12 13 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State 14 Board of Examiners of Nursing Home Administrators was 15 held on Wednesday, August 6, 2025. Ilene Warner-Maron, Ph.D., RN, NHA, Chair, called the meeting to 16 order at 10:31 a.m. 17 * * * 18 Roll Call of Board Members 19 20 [Deidre Bowers, Board Administrator, provided a roll 21 call of Board members and introduction of attendees. 22 A quorum of Board members was present.] 23 24 [Judith Pachter Schulder, Esquire, Board Counsel, 25 noted the meeting was being recorded and voluntary

- 2 | Continuing Education
- 3 | [Judith Pachter Schulder, Esquire, Board Counsel, and
- 4 Thomas M. Davis, Esquire, Regulatory Counsel,
- 5 discussed the Continuing Education regulation, 16A-
- 6 | 6221, with the Board.
- 7 Ms. Pachter Schulder reminded the Board of its
- 8 discussion at its last meeting regarding the addition
- 9 of topics, such as mental health, in the continuing
- 10 education regulation.
- 11 Mr. Davis reviewed the proposed Annex. He stated
- 12 | the Nursing Home Administrators License Act requires "not
- 13 less than 24 hours of continuing education," but
- 14 | Section 31.11 of the Board's regulations require 48
- 15 clock hours. The Board wanted the ability to decide
- 16 the specific topics to be included in the remaining
- 17 | 36 hours of continuing education, not assigned in
- 18 subsection (a).
- 19 Ms. Pachter Schulder directed the Board's
- 20 attention to the requirement that at least 12 of the
- 21 required 48 clock hours in emergency preparedness and
- 22 infection control beginning with the July 1, 2022-
- 23 June 30, 2024 renewal period. She noted Mr.
- 24 | Hoffman's suggestion at the Board's last meeting of
- 25 adding mental health to the credit hours, and Mr.

King's question as to whether there is a need for all 12 credit hours to be emergency preparedness and infection control. She also commented on subsection (i) with regard to a discussion Mr. Davis had with

5 the Board related to the Board having the authority

6 to assign additional credit hours if desired.

Ms. Pachter Schulder questioned Mr. Davis as to whether language needed to be added to the regulation if the Board wanted the authority to be able to decide, on a biennial period, what specific course requirements the Board needed in order to fulfill the 12 credit hours needed.

Mr. Davis confirmed the language of the regulation does allow the Board to direct what subjects of study should be contained in the remaining hours.

Ilene Warner-Maron, Ph.D., RN, NHA, Chair, stated the Board wants to have the ability to take those 12 hours and change them as the Board sees fit. Mr. King concurred with this statement. Mr. Hoffman mentioned having the flexibility of having the 12 hours to at least modify the education.

Ms. Warner-Maron added that Mr. Hoffman's idea of adding some behavioral health categories, along with the disaster control and infection control, could all

be mandatory.

Ms. Pachter Schulder clarified that the recommendation is that subsection (a) would be amended by deleting the language in it and subsection (i) and replacing it with the requirements that with adequate notice, the Board can direct the required topics to be completed in the 12 hours for any biennial period.

Discussion then ensued with Ms. Warner-Maron informing Mr. Davis of the Board's desire to give nursing home administrators some autonomy in the decision-making process of determining education hours and, additionally, the diverse backgrounds of personnel within the nursing field. Possible justifications for changing regulation requirements as the changing times might dictate were discussed.

Mr. Davis suggested redrafting the Annex and present it for the Board's review at its next meeting.

Ms. Pachter Schulder questioned the Board as to additional topics to discuss with Mr. Davis regarding their preference for deciding the 12 credit hours of education.

Ms. Warner-Maron brought up the subject of cannabis use potentially moving from a Schedule 1

controlled substance to something else and that there should be significant education about this. Nursing homes, Medicare and Medicaid were also discussed in the context of imminent and legal reprisals if cannabis were to remain a Schedule 1 controlled substance.

Additional considerations discussed for the 12 credit hours to be determined by the Board included, but were not limited to, homelessness, mental health, trauma, facility assessments, and patient safety.

Mr. Davis asked if the Board wanted to just keep the regulation as a proposed regulation at this moment in time, so it could retain the flexibility of it. Ms. Pachter Schulder responded in the affirmative, and stated that would be in the regulation.

Ms. Warner-Maron asked if someone with the experience of being a nursing home administrator in charge of a large organization with a panoply of continuing care options would qualify for licensure. She was told it would not.

Comments from other Board members included questions and answers about what qualifies an applicant to become licensed if only having worked in a nursing home, NHA licenses, personal care, and

9 assisted living facilities. It was noted, if a nurse 1 2 has a valid license and kept up with their 48 3 biennial credit hours, he or she would continue to be 4 licensed and able to work in any aspect of personal 5 care.1 * * * 6 7 Report of Board Chairperson - Temporary Permit 8 Applications [Ilene Warner-Maron, Ph.D., RN, NHA, Chair, reported 10 four temporary permit applications were approved Ms. Pachter Schulder stated the Board needed a 11 12 motion to ratify the approvals.
