   Appointments - Licensure Survey for Health Care
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Providers

[Dr. Muneeza Iqbal, Deputy Secretary for Department of Health-Department of Health's licensure survey for healthcare providers, presented on the topic of the Pennsylvania Primary Care Office, (PCO), and how it works with survey data to help accomplish the work it does for medically underserved areas across the state.

Dr. Iqbal began by stating that the mission of the PCO is to improve access and distribution of medical, mental, and dental healthcare services for underserved populations.

She advised that the PCO already has various programs to help these segments of the population, such as loan repayment programs and other community based healthcare programs. Dr. Iqbal stated these programs use significant data through the licensure survey process to enable their continued ability to help the medically underserved.

Dr. Iqbal commented that there are a number of federally designated underserved areas across the state. They are referred to as Health Professional Shortage Areas, (HPSA). The PCO works with the help of the Health Resources and Services Administration, (HRSA), to create and/or preserve existing shortage

designations at risk; designations that can attract more providers, their services and their facilities to them.

Dr. Iqbal advised the Board that the assistance provided to the medically underserved areas from the PCO comes from the data obtained through the workforce survey and the re-licensure of medical professionals that occurs every two years. Most of the occupational positions in the medical field are surveyed in order to collect the highest quality data and ensure the accuracy of potentially underserved areas or those underserved areas that already exist.

Dr. Iqbal explained that some of the information being requested on medical provider surveys involved obtaining a provider's specific practice area, the address where the provider practices, what specialties the provider offers and other numerous inquiries of this nature. She suggested that proposed shortage designations will typically look at provider to patient ratio as well. This data, she stated, helps the PCO with the state legislature and stakeholders that are interested in potential provider access for the underserved areas and the strategies involved in meeting the needs for those providers.

Dr. Iqbal stated approximately 300 healthcare providers are offering medical, mental health and dental services to underserved areas. These providers are supported through the PCO programs. Seventeen organizations are receiving funding from the Community Based Healthcare Grant program to contribute to underserved areas. There are 400 HPSAs designated in Pennsylvania as well as 155 underserved areas or populations that already exist in the state. Medicaid data on claim files and statewide organizational input are integrated into the statewide research.

Ms. Iqbal reiterated the importance of collecting accurate data for the PCO and advised that keeping this data up to date was imperative for continued state and federal funding that the PCO receives for their work. She commented that this year Governor Shapiro proposed \$10 million towards behavioral health and \$5 million towards rural health.

She requested that medical providers go to the CMS website to update any practice details on the MPI system. She asked for participation from them for the PCO's the outreach efforts. She further emphasized that medical providers speak with their colleagues on the importance of filling out these

1 surveys. 2 She introduced Paul Hoffman, the new Program 3 Manager, at the Pennsylvania Department of Health. 4 Dr. Litman inquired as to how the PCO could 5 validate the data they receive, particularly with Medicaid for those providers who did not engage in 6 7 private practice. Dr. Iqbal responded by stating that surveys are sent to the larger hospitals so that they may prepare their providers with the information 10 that the surveys are requesting.
