   Report of Regulatory Counsel - Status of Regulations
15
   [Thomas M. Davis, Esquire, Regulatory Counsel
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   presented on the status of regulations. He noted a

   written Regulatory Report provided for the Board's

   review.
        Mr. Davis reported an update to Regulation 16A-
19

   6522, regarding Early Exam and CE for Clinical
21
   Instructors. 16A-6522 was published as final in the
22
   Pennsylvania Bulletin on July 5, 2025, and was now in
23
   effect.

        Mr. Davis highlighted key points of the
25
   regulation. 16A-6522 allows physical therapy
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1 students and physical therapist assistants students

2 to sit for requisite examinations up to 90 days prior

3 to graduation of their respective programs. The

4 regulation also allows PTs and PTAs to receive a

5 limited amount of continuing education for providing

6 clinical instruction to students at clinical

7 | facilities affiliated with accredited programs.

8 Additionally, it allows applicants to sit for a third

9 or successive examination after two failures without

10 | first seeking the Board's permission.

Chair Grzybek acknowledged Mr. Davis, past Chair Cindy Potter, and former Board Member Sandy Campbell for their work on Regulation 16A-6522. She also expressed her appreciation to Acting Commissioner Arion Claggett and Board Administrator Michelle Roberts for their patience with the Board through the

20 [Geraldine Grzybek, Physical Therapist, Chairperson,

21 reported Pennsylvania fully implemented the PT

22 Compact on July 7, 2025, allowing for PTs and PTAs to

23 apply for a multi-state license. She noted the

24 Physical Therapy Compact is an agreement among more

25 than 30 states to provide PTs and PTAs the

opportunity to obtain practice privileges in multiple
member states. The Compact is managed by the
Physical Therapy Compact Commission.

Chair Grzybek extended her appreciation for all of the people, past and present, who worked to get the Compact approved.

She noted the next step is adopting the Compact Commission rules. The need for regulation is undergoing internal review with the anticipated publication date unknown. Notice of the Compact approval was published on the Physical Therapy Board's website on July 7, 2025. In addition, notice was published stating new applicants for healthcare practitioner licenses must obtain a fingerprint-based FBI background check for review as part of their application. Licensees renewing their Pennsylvania or multi-state licenses are not required to obtain a background check for renewal.

Chair Grzybek noted the Federation of State
Boards of Physical Therapy (FSBPT) will be electing
new officers in October 2025. She encouraged Board
members to read the candidate statements and provide
feedback to Pennsylvania's delegate Lisa Mackell. A
search was underway for FSBPT's next CEO as CEO
William Hatherill will be retiring at the end of the

1 year 2025. She noted the next FSBPT webinar is on 2 August 20, 2025.

Chair Grzybek noted Michelle Roberts, Krista Wolfe, and Lisa Mackell attended FSBPT's Legislative Forum July 19 and 20, 2025.

Krista Wolfe, Physical Therapist, Vice Chair, suggested attending the August 20, 2025 webinar. She reported Legislative Forum was a great meeting.

Discussions were held regarding workforce data and how it can be used across jurisdictions as well as futuristic planning regarding a workforce data compact. Information was also shared regarding the Examination Licensure Discipline Database and how different jurisdictions utilize it. Roundtable discussions were held about the Physical Therapy Compact and hurdles faced in different jurisdictions.

Ms. Wolfe noted a key takeaway was the mission of the FSBPT as well as state boards of physical therapy would be the protection of the public, part of which is being transparent and communicating with all parties involved. She added three hurdles were brought forth during discussions; possible lack of support or enough staffing to adequately complete demanding jobs in jurisdictions; outdated data resources impacting some states to be able to join

the Compact and ways around the issue; and the standardization of policy, procedures and rules across jurisdictions.

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Michelle Roberts, Board Administrator, added there was a discussion on informed consent and the need for it to be a standard for all healthcare professions.

Chair Grzybek noted FSBPT continues to offer grant money to support member jurisdictions in their mission to protect the public.

Chair Grzybek highlighted the May FSBPT News Brief. There was an article from the New England Journal of Medicine regarding AI. The article noted several states have enacted or are considering legislation to regulate the use of artificial intelligence in healthcare. She noted there is no bills pending in the Pennsylvania legislature specific to AI in healthcare. Chair Grzybek added the Shapiro Administration, the Departments of Aging, Banking and Securities, and the Insurance Department are leading a coordinated effort to defend consumers, older adults, and families from AI driven fraud. Senate Bill 649, signed into law by the Governor, created new criminal penalties for anyone using AI to produce non-consensual forged digital likenesses to
