        Mr. Davis provided a copy of the proposed Annex

   and proposed Preamble for Regulation 16A-6523,

   Licensure by Endorsement. He explained the

   regulation would be presented to the Board as edits

   are made. He noted, with Board approval, the

   regulation could be moved to the Office of General
21
   Counsel before the final steps.
        Mr. Davis explained, when the regulation was
22

   first written, it made sense to include a definition
24
   of what it means to be actively engaged in physical
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therapy, the reasoning for the 200 hours of active

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   patient engagement to be a requirement. Mr. Davis
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   stated, upon reviewing the proposed regulation and
3
   speaking with Board Counsel, he removed the 200-hour
4
   requirement of active patient engagement for
5
   licensure by endorsement. He added the definition of
   physical therapy does include administrative roles,
6

   not just patient engagement. Administrative roles,
8
   while not including active patient engagement, do
9
   qualify as the practice of physical therapy.]

The Compact permits Pennsylvania Physical Therapists and Physical Therapist Assistants to apply for compact privilege to practice in Pennsylvania and other compact member states. The email offered a reference to additional information on the Board's
  - Chair Grzybek thanked Mr. Steele for delivering a presentation on the National Physical Therapy

    Examination to physical therapy students at the University of Scranton on September 17, 2025.
  - Chair Grzybek provided updates regarding the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy (FSBPT). She thanked Ms. Wolfe for her continued service with the FSBPT Board of Directors. Upcoming webinars include October 15, 2025, Final Orders; November 18, 2025, Expanding PT Practice Into Health

and Wellness Services; and December 17, 2025, A Year in Review. She encouraged Board Members to sign up for the webinars and to share ideas for future webinars with the FSBPT Educational Committee. She also noted FSBPT appointed Pennsylvania Licensee William Stoddard to the Task Force for reference expansion.

Chair Grzybek stated the FSBPT will be conducting their annual delegate meeting as a virtual meeting on October 15, 2025, with a physical meeting in Spokane, Washington, from October 23-25, 2025. She reported Lisa Mackell is the Board's delegate with herself as the alternate. Chair Grzybek explained the FSBPT officers would be elected at the meeting. She reviewed the candidates and encouraged Board Members to reach out to either Ms. Mackell or herself with feedback.

Chair Grzybek shared thoughts on the retirement of Ms. Roberts. She noted Ms. Roberts had served the Commonwealth for 24 years and was with the Physical Therapy Board for the past 18 years. She praised Ms. Roberts for her wisdom, poise, precision, and thoughtful attention to detail. She noted Ms. Roberts had answered countless questions from potential licensees, potential certificate holders,

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1 licensed physical therapists, PTA credential holders,
2 and Board Members. She added Ms. Roberts
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3 contributions to the Board's work shaped the Board in

4 ways that will last long after her retirement. She

5 expressed sadness at Ms. Roberts retirement but

6 excitement for her to embrace her new chapter in

7 life. Chair Grzybek concluded by congratulating Ms.

Roberts and expressing gratitude on behalf of the

9 Board and all PTs and PT assistants in Pennsylvania.
