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[Pursuant to Section 708(a)(5) of the Sunshine Act,  
at 9:30 a.m. the Board entered into Executive Session  
with Judith Pachter Schulder, Esquire, Board Counsel,  
for the purpose of conducting quasi-judicial  
deliberations on a number of matters that are  
currently pending before the Board and to receive the  
advice of counsel. The Board returned to open  
session at 10:30 a.m.]

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The regularly scheduled meeting of the State  
Board of Psychology was held on Monday, February 10,  
2025. Donald McAleer, Psy.D., Chair, called the  
meeting to order at 10:37 a.m.

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[David Zehrung, Ph.D., Secretary, experienced  
technical difficulties.]

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[Judith Pachter Schulder, Esquire, Board Counsel,  
noted the Board engaged in quasi-judicial  
deliberations during Executive Session on the matters

1 Report of the Administrator, and Correspondence.

2 Ms. Pachter Schulder also noted the meeting was  
3 being recorded, and voluntary participation  
4 constituted consent to be recorded.]

6 Introduction of Board Members

7 [Donald McAleer, Psy.D., Chair, requested an  
8 introduction of Board members.]

10 Approval of minutes of the December 2, 2024 meeting

11 CHAIR MCALEER:

12 Could I have a motion to accept the  
13 minutes, please?

14 DR. ERICKSON:

15 Motion.

16 DR. WARNER:

17 Second.

18 CHAIR MCALEER:

19 Could we have a vote, please?

20

21 McAleer, aye; Eaton, abstain; Zehrung,  
22 abstain; Erickson, aye; Warner, aye.

23 [The motion carried. Matthew Eaton and David Zehrung  
24 abstained from voting on the motion.]

1 Appointment - Annual Budget Presentation

2 [Jennifer Jumper, Fiscal Management Specialist,  
3 Bureau of Finance and Procurement, Department of  
4 State, presented the Annual Financial Report.

5 Ms. Jumper stated the Board's renewable licensee  
6 counts represented a seven-year history of the  
7 licensee population. She then showed the Board their  
8 licensee population by class and offered the Board a  
9 comparison of their licensee population over the last  
10 two biennial periods. She reported a 4% increase in  
11 the number of psychologist licenses.

12 Ms. Jumper addressed licensure renewal fees. She  
13 noted the Board renews in November of odd years. She  
14 reported the renewal fee for psychologists is \$300  
15 and noted the Board's last fee increase was in 2005.  
16 She also mentioned the Board waived fees for the  
17 November 2023 renewal.

18 Ms. Jumper addressed biennial revenue from  
19 revenue sources and as a total. She stated the Board  
20 renews in November of odd years, which would  
21 typically show a higher revenue for that time period,  
22 but noted the revenues are only about \$15,000  
23 different due to the renewal fees being waived by the  
24 Board for the November 2023 renewal. She reported a  
25 total biennial revenue of \$58,000 with 87.6% of

1 revenue coming from renewals and applications.

2 Ms. Jumper referred to Board expenses, noting  
3 costs include timesheet-based charges, direct  
4 charges, and licensee population. She noted FY24-25  
5 and FY25-26 budget numbers and compared prior and  
6 current biennial periods showing expenses are  
7 expected to increase \$245,000 from \$1.07 million to  
8 \$1.315 million. She explained that the major item  
9 contributed to the increase is the modernization of  
10 the Pennsylvania Licensing System (PALS).

11 Ms. Jumper addressed revenues and expenses to  
12 look at the Board's overall financial standing. She  
13 referred to the FY24-25 and FY25-26 time period,  
14 noting revenue exceeds expenses and a fee increase is  
15 not necessary.

16 Chair McAleer requested information regarding the  
17 cost of the waiver and whether the cost was  
18 approximately \$900,000.

19 Ms. Jumper noted Chair McAleer to be correct and  
20 explained that multiplying the licensee count times  
21 the number of licenses would provide the dollar  
22 figure.]

24 Report of Board Counsel - Sunshine Act/Recusal  
25 Presentation

1 [Judith Pachter Schulder, Esquire, Board Counsel,  
2 stated the purpose of the Sunshine Act is to provide  
3 sunshine into what is happening with the Board, so  
4 there is never a question that anything is being done  
5 without public scrutiny involved in the Board's  
6 action. She noted there must be a time publicly set  
7 when the Board will deliberate and report back at the  
8 end of the deliberation.

9 Ms. Pachter Schulder provided a definition of  
10 agency, deliberation, and official action. She  
11 addressed public notice and mentioned the agenda is  
12 also published for the public to know what is  
13 occurring at board meetings. She also discussed the  
14 recording of votes and minutes.

15 Ms. Pachter Schulder addressed exceptions to the  
16 public meeting requirement, including executive  
17 session and conferences. She noted executive session  
18 may be held to discuss personnel issues, attorney-  
19 client information, and quasi-judicial deliberations.

20 Ms. Pachter Schulder discussed legal challenges,  
21 where a board may be sued if they do not act within  
22 accordance of the Sunshine Act. She also discussed  
23 penalties for violating the Sunshine Act.

24 Ms. Pachter Schulder stated all business has to  
25 be conducted in open session, and board members



1 cannot discuss what happened in executive session  
2 outside of the meeting.

3 Ms. Pachter Schulder stated committees can  
4 perform certain functions for the board if given  
5 authority by the board. She noted deliberations  
6 happening at an open meeting must have public notice.

7 Ms. Pachter Schulder addressed mandatory  
8 recusals, where a board member may have a direct  
9 personal or financial interest in the outcome of the  
10 matter or a prosecutorial role.

11 Mr. Pachter Schulder addressed strongly suggested  
12 recusals, where a board member has a personal  
13 affection for someone or outside knowledge and cannot  
14 make a fair and unbiased determination.

15 Ms. Pachter Schulder noted discretionary recusals  
16 are when a board member cannot be fair or impartial.  
17 She encouraged board members who are uncertain  
18 whether to recuse themselves to discuss the matter  
19 with counsel.

20 Ms. Pachter Schulder addressed abstention, noting  
21 abstention means someone is withholding their vote  
22 but are still part of the quorum requirements. She  
23 noted a board member is no longer part of the quorum  
24 when they recuse.

25 Ms. Pachter Schulder discussed conflicts of

1 interests, where professional board members may not  
2 be a statewide association or organization officer  
3 while a member of a board.

4 Ms. Pachter Schulder further explained that  
5 public members cannot have a family member who is a  
6 licensee on the board they are representing. She  
7 also noted public members cannot be affiliated in any  
8 way with the profession or hold an office with  
9 another state agency.]

11 [Judith Pachter Schulder, Esquire, Board Counsel,  
12 announced Jason Giurintano is the new deputy chief  
13 counsel. She also mentioned Ronald Rouse is their  
14 new Board Counsel and provided a summary of his

24 MS. PACHTER SCHULDER:

1 regulations. She stated the Board already voted on  
2 16A-6317 regarding the proposed continuing education  
3 regulation. She informed Board members that she is  
4 finalizing the Regulatory Analysis Form and is  
5 anticipating that it will be sent to the Office of  
6 General Counsel (OGC), Budget, and Policy by the end  
7 of the month.

8 Ms. Wolfgang believed 16A-6324 regarding the code  
9 of ethics regulation is still on hold because they  
10 were awaiting an update in the code of ethics from  
11 the association.

12 Ms. Wolfgang informed Board members that she  
13 would be looking at 16A-6320 regarding the general  
14 revisions package with new Board Counsel.

15 Ms. Wolfgang mentioned she would be working on  
16 16A-6323 regarding the volunteer license regulation  
17 within the next six months or so to reflect updates  
18 in the volunteer license law. She mentioned they are  
19 following suit on this one with respect to how  
20 regulations are being drafted for other boards.]

22 Report of Regulatory Counsel - 16A-6327

23 [Jacqueline A. Wolfgang, Esquire, Senior Regulatory  
24 Counsel, addressed 16A-6327 regarding the  
25 accreditation regulation. She noted the Board

1 reviewed and voted on the proposed regulation  
2 published on November 16, 2024, for a 30-day comment  
3 period.

4 Ms. Wolfgang reminded everyone that the Board  
5 recognizes the Psychological Clinical Science  
6 Accreditation System (PCSAS), which provides an  
7 alternate accreditation to the American Psychological  
8 Association and the Canadian Psychological  
9 Association.

10 Ms. Wolfgang noted PCSAS parody within the  
11 Commonwealth provides clinical psychological programs  
12 a pathway to licensure. She reported the amendments  
13 would also update a name change from the Commission  
14 on Recognition of Postsecondary Accreditation (CORPA)  
15 to the Council on Higher Education Accreditation  
16 (CHEA). She provided a final preamble and annex for  
17 the Board's review.

18 Ms. Wolfgang referred to a letter from the  
19 Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC)  
20 concerning 16A-6327 and reported IRRC had no  
21 comments.

22 Dr. Erickson asked whether the continuing  
23 education regulation would go to IRRC at the end of  
24 the month.

25 Ms. Wolfgang explained that the regulation to be

1 reviewed and approved by OGC, Budget, and Policy,  
2 which takes about 30 days and then submitted to the  
3 Office of Attorney General for review and approval  
4 before being delivered to IRRC.]

5 MS. WOLFGANG:

6 I believe the Chair would entertain a  
7 motion to approve the final regulation,  
8 which includes the preamble and annex  
9 at Regulation 16A-6327, and direct  
10 regulatory counsel to move the final-  
11 form rulemaking through the regulatory  
12 process.

13 CHAIR MCALEER:

17 MS. PACHTER SCHULDER:

17 [David Tomaselli, Psy.D., Cedar Avenue Psychotherapy,  
18 requested information concerning the procedure.

19 Ms. Pachter Schulder explained that the Board  
20 tabled his application to provide additional time to  
21 document supervised experience hours. She further  
22 explained the Board did not find his research hours  
23 capable of replacing supervised experience.

24 Ms. Pachter Schulder mentioned that it is  
25 possible he has been currently practicing under

1 supervision and to document those past hours with his  
2 supervisor. She noted he could obtain the 250 hours  
3 of supervision if he does not have any supervised  
4 hours.

5 Ms. Pachter Schulder explained that it would not  
6 be necessary to come back before the Board if he  
7 obtains the 250 hours of supervision and could go  
8 ahead and schedule for the licensing exam, but if he  
9 does not present the 250 hours, he can tell the Board  
10 that he would not be doing that and ask them to  
11 decide based upon what he submitted.

12 Dr. Tomaselli informed Board members that he  
13 presented a signed affirmation from his dissertation  
14 chair and the director of the program. He reported  
15 some ambiguity within the code itself as to research  
16 and what constitutes research and asked for a bit of  
17 rationale as to why that does not constitute  
18 research.

19 Dr. Tomaselli requested more clarity, noting it  
20 was roughly 10% of his submission toward the 1,750  
21 and thought they could get up to potentially 50% of  
22 research contributing to the ultimate total of  
23 supervised experience.

24 Ms. Pachter Schulder asked Dr. Tomaselli to take  
25 the Board through his research and to provide an

1 explanation as to where that research was supervised  
2 to qualify.

3 Dr. Tomaselli provided three posters and a book  
4 review but debated on whether or not to include his  
5 dissertation hours and just went ahead with his  
6 research above and beyond program activities. He  
7 mentioned it was theoretical research and straddles  
8 whether or not it can constitute research. He  
9 mentioned drawing from very disparate literatures to  
10 bring together sort of a novel look at how defense  
11 mechanisms operate within the industrial  
12 organizational context.

13 Dr. Tomaselli commented that he contributed to  
14 the field in a pretty novel way. He noted it was  
15 theoretical in nature but became applied in the  
16 course of his dissertation via autoethnography.

17 Dr. Warner stated it is meant to be clinical  
18 supervision, and research was mentioned in the law  
19 because there are times where they are doing clinical  
20 research or when it is supervised as a part of doing  
21 clinical work. He noted Dr. Tomaselli read books and  
22 commented on them, which is not clinical and is why  
23 it will not count. He also noted Dr. Tomaselli would  
24 need to do clinical work under supervision.

25 Dr. Warner recommended Dr. Tomaselli follow the

1 standards of the documentation submitted, including  
2 neuropsychology and work at Turtle Creek.]
