21 was drafting the final regulation, which will go back

22 to the Board for its review and vote.

Mr. Rouse discussed Regulation 16A-6324, the Code

24 of Ethics. He stated Board Counsel and Regulatory

25 | Counsel will be updating this regulation.

Mr. Rouse questioned Chair McAleer whether the Board had received a response from the American Psychological Association with regard to this regulation. Chair McAleer responded that every 10 years the APA updates their ethics code. since the PA State Board of Psychology bases their own ethics code on the APA ethics code, the regulation for the Board of Psychology is being edited and discussed until after the APA finalizes their ethics code.

Revisions. The Board adopted the proposed annex and the preamble for the General Revisions regulation.

Mr. Rouse stated the regulatory analysis form was being drafted in order to complete the proposed regulatory package.

4 Discussion Item(s) - Corporate/Fictitious Names, at 5 Item No. 11 on the agenda.

Item No. 11 on the agenda.

[Mr. Rouse discussed the status of the regulation found in section 41.27, subsection C, which says a fictitious name must be approved by the Board prior to its use. Mr. Rouse also advised that names which circumvent or neglect to comply with the ethical principles set out in section 41.61 will be denied. He added this type of non-compliance by a potential fictitious name applicant also included actions of false, misleading or deceptive information and would be applied to fictitious names which limit the practice to a particular area of psychology such as neuropsychology, clinical psychology or biofeedback. Documentation of training sufficient to establish

Chair McAleer noted the receipt of requests for fictitious names that included words like Psychology Services, Psychology Associates, or XYZ Associates. These requests would not be honored unless the words, Psychology Services or any other type of plurality suggested within the fictitious name(s), are proven

to have more than one practicing member of the group.

Chair McAleer advised that the Board has been asked to approve fictitious names that infer the offering of specialty services, such as marital counseling, addiction counseling, forensic psychology or the like.

Chair McAleer requested the Board discuss and determine which areas of psychology might require further skill and training as opposed to the more generic training of a psychologist. He did not want to be overly zealous about over-restricting the criteria that would allow the plurality of a given entity name.

Dr. Zehrung commented, given the full scope of the report thus far, he was comfortable with some degree of leniency regarding the potential plurality of a given treatment center fictitious name, provided no evidence of false or misleading information was submitted to the Board.

Chair McAleer believed, though they were trying to protect the public, it was the public itself that was capable of deciding on a plural or singular practice. Chair McAleer suggested using a plural name for some solo service providers was not, in and of itself, harmful, provided the information

submitted by the fictitious name applicant was true and genuine.

Dr. Erickson concurred with the statements made by both Chair McAleer and Dr. Zehrung regarding generic psychology practices. He voiced his concern that the criteria that would be required for specialized practices of same. Dr. Erickson suggested, for specialized practitioners, the regulation to be considered by the Board should include Board Certification. Board Certification is based upon a metric in which the public can know with certainty that the specializing psychologist has met the criteria for having the experience and background in that particular specialty.

Dr. Zehrung commented that specialization is a special service within or outside the specialties of all psychologists. To the degree that the specialty service or Board Certification has not been obtained, he would promote and support an increased review and a higher standard.

Mr. Rouse reminded the Board, under the regulation 41.27, subsection C, the Board would be reviewing these on a case-by-case basis and request additional information from the applicant if needed. Additional information requested from the Board would

determine whether a fictitious name could include a specialty within their title.

Chair McAleer questioned what the definition of specialty might be? He asked the Board where they would draw the line on this. He requested feedback from the Board on what might be generic and less in need of demonstrating expertise than a specialty practice.

Dr. Erickson conveyed to the Board that the sufficiency criteria is not defined. He stated the Board could exercise its own judgement, but it would be most helpful if this was further defined for the public and for the profession. He advised that the Board needed to determine and clarify this for further consideration.

Chair McAleer wanted to begin this discussion in public session. He emphasized the need for input from members of the profession regarding their thoughts and opinions for the Board to consider and possibly incorporating some of the comments to further clarify the regulation.]
