3 * * * 1 2 State Board of Psychology 3 April 14, 2025, 2025 * * * 4 5 [Pursuant to Section 708(a)(5) of the Sunshine Act, at 10:35 a.m. the Board entered into Executive 6 7 Session with Ronald Rouse, Esquire, Board Counsel, 8 for the purpose of conducting quasi-judicial 9 deliberations on a number of matters that are 10 currently pending before the Board and to receive the advice of counsel. 11 * * * 12 13 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State 14 Board of Psychology was held on Monday, April 14, 2025. Donald McAleer, Psy.D., Chair, called the 15 meeting to order at 10:35 a.m. 16 * * * 17 [Donald McAleer, Psy.D., Chair, requested an 18 introduction of Board members. A quorum of Board 19 20 members was present.] * * * 21 [Ronald Rouse, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted the 22 23 meeting was being held in a hybrid format both in 24 person and via live stream teleconference. 25 Mr. Rouse also noted the meeting was being

recorded, and voluntary participation constituted 1 2 consent to be recorded.] 3 * * * 4 Annual Prosecution Report [Carlton Smith, Deputy Chief Counsel, referred to his 5 written Annual Prosecution Report for the 6 7 presentation. He noted the numbers in the report 8 were pulled the first week of January 2025. 9 Mr. Smith stated the number of active licenses 10 was almost 8,400. The number of opened cases in 2024 11 was 149, similar to 2023 with 141 cases opened. The 12 current number of open cases was 193. 123 cases were 13 closed in 2024. The average number of days to close 14 a case in 2024 is 361. The gold standard is about 15 365 days. Mr. Smith outlined the processing of complaints, 16 including BEI investigations and the gathering of 17 18 documents related to the complaint. Charging decisions are based on all information gathered. 19 20 Mr. Smith addressed the types of discipline. He 21 noted a couple reprimand, suspensions, and a 22 voluntary surrender. 23 Mr. Smith noted there are cases where discipline is not imposed. He discussed prosecution not 24 25 warranted cases, noting prosecution considers the

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5 seriousness of the allegations and disciplinary 1 2 history but also considers an expert's opinion in 3 terms of standard of care and their confidence of a 4 violation. 5 Mr. Smith explained that a warning letter will be 6 issued on matters that are not serious. He discussed 7 cases where the Board has no jurisdiction or 8 authority. Sometimes the complaints are withdrawn. 9 He explained why cases are administratively closed. 10 All of this information is published and given to the 11 General Assembly.] * * * 12 Approval of Minutes of the December 2, 2024 meeting 13 14 CHAIR MCALEER: 15 Moving on, I'd like to have approval of 16 the minutes. May we have a motion to accept the minutes? 17 18 ACTING COMMISSIONER CLAGGETT: So moved. 19 20 DR. ZEHRUNG: 21 Second. 22 CHAIR MCALEER: 23 Is there any discussion? Hearing none, 24 roll call for the vote. 25

Murphy, Psy.D., Case No. 24-63-02321. 19 20 This was a matter that was discussed in 21 an Executive Session. 22 And regarding the Proposed 23 Adjudication at Item No. 5 on the 24 agenda, I believe the Chair would 25 entertain a motion to direct Board

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1 Counsel to prepare a final Adjudication 2 and Order consistent with the 3 discussion in Executive Session. 4 ACTING COMMMISSIONER CLAGGETT: 5 So moved. 6 DR. ZEHRUNG: 7 Second. 8 CHAIR MCALEER: 9 Could we have a roll call? 10 11 McAleer, aye; Claggett, aye; Zehrung, 12 aye; Erickson, aye; Bradley, aye; 13 Warner, aye. 14 [The motion carried unanimously.] 15 * * * Matters for Deliberation 16 17 [Ronald Rouse, Esquire, Board Counselor, presented 18 the Request for Extension for Case No. 25-63-004312.] MR. ROUSE: 19 20 And regarding the Request for Extension 21 of Provisional Endorsement License to 22 Practice Psychology of Christina 23 Volstad, Psy.D., Case No. 25-63-004312, 24 I believe the Chair would entertain a 25 motion to grant the extension of Dr.

It is currently under review at the Office 20 of the Attorney General. Dr. Erickson asked for clarification in the 21 22 rulemaking process. 23 Mr. Rouse answered that the Attorney General's 24 office would have 30 days to review the regulation. 25 Afterwards, the public and general assembly may

review. Finally, the Independent Regulatory Review
 Commission (IRRC) will review, revise, and send the
 document back to counsel.

Dr. Erickson inquired about the length of the process to which Mr. Rouse responded with a length approximately 18 months; however, it could be longer or shorter.

8 Mr. Rouse stated that a general revision to the 9 Code of Ethics, 16A-6324, has been documented and an 10 annexation will be reviewed at a future Board 11 meeting.

Mr. Rouse referred to regulation 16A-6323,
Preamble Volunteer License, and stated that counsel
is in the process of updating this document.

Mr. Rouse provided an update to the policy approval of 16A-6327 as of April 09, 2025. The packet is currently being prepared for delivery to the General Assembly and IRRC.

19 Chair McAleer commented that a draft of the 20 Ethical Code's latest revision is available for 21 public comments and the Board awaits revision from 22 the American Psychological Association (APA). The 23 revised code is lengthy and has received significant 24 pushback.

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Mr. Rouse noted that the inclusion of

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aspirational principles in concert with general Code
 of Conduct rules could raise complexities for
 psychologists.

Mr. Rouse addressed an annex regarding general revisions for 16A-6320. This annex reflects amendments to the Professional Psychologists Practice Act of 2016. Mr. Rouse opened the meeting to the Board to discuss potential amendments to the document. Various edits were reviewed and confirmed by the Board.

11 Chair McAleer emphasized the importance of both 12 research and practical training. He noted the 13 various differences. The Board agreed that each 14 specification needs an operational definition to 15 ensure proper understanding of general postdoctoral 16 requirements.

Mr. Rouse noted that most information is unchanged; however, two main options for compliance with postdoctoral requirements are listed. Requirements were reviewed by Mr. Rouse and the Board. Chair McAleer noted a typo in Section 1A.

23 Correction from Fill-time to Full-time. Typos noted 24 were confirmed by the Board. Chair McAleer brought 25 forth concerns of potential training loopholes. The

1 Board seeks to ensure that skills gained in 2 Pennsylvania may be easily transferred and meet the 3 qualifications of other states. 4 Mr. Rouse discussed virtual supervising 5 requirements and implemented the Board's statements 6 into the regulation. 7 Chair McAleer voiced preference for a shorter re-8 examination period to observe short-term growth. He 9 commended the growth of psychology as a field of 10 practice and emphasized the importance of 11 reexamination in a timely fashion. 12 Mr. Rouse concluded the amendments by stating 13 that a licensee must notify the Board of disciplinary 14 action taken in another statein 30 days instead of 90 15 Suspended licensees who are prohibited from days. 16 engaging in counseling services or other mental 17 health practices must notify their clients.] * * * 18 19 Report of Board Chairperson - No Report * * * 20 21 Report of Board Commissioner 22 [Arion R. Claggett, Acting Commissioner, informed the 23 Board of the November 10, 2025 Licensure Expo. He 24 requested that at least two Board members be in 25 attendance to meet with students.

1 Dr. Claggett updated the Board in regards to the 2 new platform, Evoke. Systems Automation was selected 3 as the vendor. Evoke is scheduled for launch in the 4 summer of 2026.] * * * 5 Report of Board Administrator 6 7 MR. ROUSE: I believe the Chair will entertain a 8 9 motion to find that Illinois' 10 Psychology Licensure requirements are substantially equivalent to 11 12 Pennsylvania's and approve the 13 Application to to Sit for the 14 Psychology Licensing Examination of Hollie Duonnolo. 15 16 CHAIR MCALEER: Do we have a motion, please? 17 18 ACTING COMMMISSIONER CLAGGETT: So moved. 19 20 DR. David Zehrung, 25 Ph.D., Secretary was absent for the motion.]

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3 [Thomas Leech II, Board Administrator, addressed EPPP 4 Committee vacancies and requested a nomination to fill 5 any vacancies.

6 Clarification was needed amongst the Board 7 regarding the responsibilities of members on the 8 Continuing Education Committee. Dr. Bradley explained 9 that individuals submit varying degrees of 10 documentation in request of accommodations. Spots on the Committee would include approving or denying these 11 accommodations. Chair McAleer volunteered to fill a 12 13 vacancy.

14 Chair McAleer opened the discussion to the public 15 on the topic of Master's Licensure requirements.

16 Dr. Paul W. Kettlewell informed the Board that 17 both APA and the ASPPB have developed model licensing proposals for master's clinicians. The ASPPB is 18 19 finished while APA is currently nearing completion. Α 20 task force was created by the Pennsylvania Psychologists Association to review and regulate the 21 22 rules of Master's licensure. If legislation passes, 23 the document will move to the State Board for further 24 regulation and establishment.

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The primary issue regarding Master's licensure is

the alignment of both masters and doctoral practices. 1 2 The board discussed that this overlap in duties adds a 3 level of complexity, as competition is introduced in 4 the practice. This leaves many doctoral psychologists 5 at a disadvantage. Further details were being discussed by APA and ASPPB.] 6 7 * * * 8 Upcoming Meeting Dates 9 Donald McAleer, Psy.D., Chair, noted the upcoming 10 2025 meeting dates are April 14, June 16, August 18, October 20, and December 15 of 2025. Meetings for 11 12 2026 are February 16, April 13, June 15, August 17, 13 October 19, December 21.] 14 * * * 15 Adjournment CHAIR MCALEER: 16 I would entertain a motion to adjourn 17 18 the meeting. ACTING COMMMISSIONER CLAGGETT: 19 20 So moved. 21 DR. ZEHRUNG: 22 Second. 23 CHAIR MCALEER: 24 Thank you all, be well. * * * 25
