3 Miscellaneous - Appointment - Drexel University's 4 Henderson Real Estate Institute Presentation 5 [Carter W. Murdoch, PhD, Executive Director, 6 Henderson Real Estate Institute, provided a brief 7 summary of his professional background. He informed Commission members that the Real Estate Institute was 8 funded by the Wilbur C. Henderson Foundation with a 9 10 \$10 million gift to Drexel University. He noted they 11 are a private university currently without licensing 12 and are looking to build a program to enable real 13 estate professionals at an executive level, including 14 capital markets, operations, chief executive officers

Dr. Murdoch explained that their real estate program is tied into the finance department at Drexel University. He reported having approximately 2000 finance and real estate majors, of which 200 or so are dual majors between real estate and finance. He mentioned that they were founded in 2017 and have a small curriculum for a new program.

(CEOs), and chief operating officers (COOs).

Dr. Murdoch stated the Real Estate Institute wants to apply experiential learning through Drexel University to bring in the best of the best to teach

their students how to execute in the field and not necessarily traditional full-time professors. He also reported that a number of legacy peers in the industry were interested in being a part of the program.

Dr. Murdoch explained that Drexel has a five-year program with the average student doing three co-ops and earning about \$20,000 per co-op. He noted being affiliated with 600-700 companies, and 97% of their students take a co-op with 96% having a job after graduating. He mentioned that it gives the employer a chance to test drive the student and the student a chance to test drive the company to see if it is a good fit.

Dr. Murdoch reported academics over the next five years would be financially brutal with possibly a 2-3% reduction in student body going to college per year in the next three years and a 15% clip in the next three to five years.

Dr. Murdoch addressed funding through the initiatives of their alumni and the leaders in Philadelphia who are already part of their real estate council and part of the real estate board he oversees. He noted their dues are basically funding all the new courses, and a new curriculum will begin

in the winter. He also reported that a former boss
wanted to fund an ethics and compliance in real
setate course.]

Miscellaneous - Appointment - Temple University's
 Real Estate Institute's Initiatives and Programs
 Presentation

[Timothy Galbraith, Assistant Director, Temple University's Real Estate Institute, provided a PowerPoint presentation to update the Commission on some of the initiatives they are embarking on at the Real Estate Institute.

Mr. Galbraith addressed their project with the School District of Philadelphia, noting they were awarded a grant to deliver real estate education coursework to high school students of every year at the West Philadelphia High School. He noted they kicked off this past school year with a freshman-year cohort of around 80 students and anticipate 160 this school year.

Mr. Galbraith explained that the freshman-year cohort is designed to introduce students to the career path of real estate and give them a general overview of key concepts in terms of the industry, along with an overview of the various subfields and

fields within the real estate industry.

Mr. Galbraith noted kicking off a sophomore-year cohort with 21 students this year to give students exposure to the professional environment of real estate. He mentioned the Real Estate Institute instructors, Mike Coleman and Rob Luciani, have been teaching the freshmen since last year and will continue to do so this coming year as well.

Mr. Galbraith noted they would begin planning for the junior and senior years for those who proceed from the sophomore year onward. He explained the junior year will be the actual licensure coursework for real estate salesperson licensure and commences the 75 hours to become eligible for the licensure exam upon their graduation and senior year.

Mr. Galbraith thanked the Commission for approving West Philadelphia High School as a satellite location for real estate education for the Real Estate Institute to be able to provide an opportunity for a career path upon graduation.

Mr. Galbraith addressed Branching Up, which is a program that works with students who are incarcerated or reentering society and provides the tools for career focuses once they reenter society. He noted Branching Up primarily trains their students in the

horticulture field but are seeking to expand career paths. He stated Branching Up is interested in partnering with the Real Estate Institute to deliver the licensure coursework but are concerned whether they would be turned away for having a record.

Mr. Galbraith mentioned that the Real Estate
Institute compiled research and believed they would
be able to work with Branching Up and referred to Act
53, which also permits the Real Estate Commission and
other commissions in the state to use 11 various
factors to determine eligibility for an applicant who
has a record. He stated Branching Up will be able to
finally proceed with delivering coursework and will
be meeting with staff at Temple University.

Mr. Galbraith highlighted some of the community and public initiatives at the Real Estate Institute, including a recent lunch and learn as a follow up concerning the National Association of Realtors (NAR) settlement.

Mr. Galbraith noted also partnering with the Eastern Pennsylvania Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Queer (LGBTQ) alliance to hold a continuing education session on October 10, 2024, in order to focus on topics that can educate their professionals on working with diverse populations.

1 Mr. Galbraith mentioned that the Real Estate
2 Institute is also trying to step up their effort to
3 develop more tools for enrollment and educate
4 prospective students on the career path and benefits
5 of entering the real estate industry.

Mr. Galbraith mentioned he is presenting at the KIPP School of Philadelphia Fall College and Career Fair on October 31 to give them an overview of real estate and expand their pool of enrollments.

Mr. Galbraith also mentioned Temple University
Real Estate Institute was in the media addressing
real estate with WHYY and offered to share the link
of that podcast.

Mr. Galbraith announced the Real Estate Institute (REI) is marking its 50th anniversary of their founding and delivering coursework and offered to share the content and information over the years as well.

Vice Chair Sampson thanked Temple University for hosting the Pennsylvania State Real Estate
