12 [Dean Picarella, Esquire, reported on continuing in
13 accordance with the vote and direction given in the
14 prior meeting in drafting regulation 16A-5628,
15 Schedule of Civil Penalties. He hoped to have
16 additional updates in the near future.]

17

18 [Mark Farrell, Esquire, Regulatory Counsel, reported
19 the Commission had four open regulatory packages at
20 various stages in the process in addition to 16A-5628.
21 The packages were 16A-5616, General Revisions; 16A-
22 5625, Act 41 Licensure by Endorsement; 16A-5629,
23 Wholesaling; and 16A-5630, Fee Package. He noted he
24 would continue to push the regulations along and would
25 keep the Commission apprised.

1 Mr. Sampson stated the Commission is receiving
2 more and more complaints of lockbox violations. He
3 asked if a mandate regarding lockboxes could be added
4 to the regulations.

5 Mr. Picarella noted, for Regulatory Counsel, the
6 violations had been addressed under the regulations
7 for incompetence and trustworthiness. He added the
8 Commission was concerned as lockboxes are not
9 specifically mentioned in the regulations.

10 Acting Commissioner Claggett asked what and how
11 hard the process would be to add something specific to
12 the regulations.

13 Mr. Farrell offered to review the General
14 Revisions package to see if small items could still be
15 added. If the General Revisions were past the point
16 of additions, a new regulation package would have to
17 be started.

18 Mr. Michalowski commented lockboxes have changed
19 over time from needing a key to being a code. He
20 added, if a regulation was to be written, the
21 Commission would want to ensure the regulation was not
22 so specific that it was outdated by the time the
23 regulation was final. He also noted lockboxes were at
24 the top of the list to consider for required
25 continuing education (CE) courses.

24 report of Tayler Koch of the Bureau of Finance and
25 Procurement (BFP), was cancelled.]

2 Miscellaneous - Possible mandatory topics for 2026-
3 2028 CE Cycle

4 [Anne M. Rubin, Industry Member, suggested it would
5 important to encompass professional ethics in
6 accessing showings and properties as well as escorting
7 buyers in the mandatory CE course.

8 Ray J. Michalowski, Esquire, Commission
9 Prosecution Liaison, stated he talked with Mr. Fritsch
10 and Hank Lerner about what might be included in the
11 course. He stated the primary set would go around
12 security of the home and matters that are entrusted to
13 the real estate agent. He discussed concerns
14 surrounding keys, lockboxes, leaving buyers by
15 themselves, or even going to the property themselves
16 when not invited. He noted the Commission sees cases
17 being brought before them, because people trust agents
18 with their homes, schedules, keys and access to their
19 lives. He added there have also been cases resolved
20 that were borderline or warning letter level where the
21 case did not need to go before the Commission. He
22 stated the Commission would need to decide how
23 expansive the course would be or if the course would
24 be tightly defined.

25 Chair Cestra commented two hours seemed like a lot

1 of time just to discuss access to the house.

2 Mr. Michalowski replied part of the course could
3 be on confidential information, which he would need
4 industry feedback.

5 It was suggested scams could also be a potential
6 topic.

7 Mr. Michalowski stated there had been one case
8 brought to the Commission regarding scams. He added
9 the topic of scams is taught in some of the elective
10 CE courses. He described the case as well as an
11 incident with one of his bosses being targeted for a
12 scam. He added there is a lot of information out
13 there on scams and he was not sure it was something
14 that the Commission could develop.

15 Timothy Fritsch, Esquire, Commission Prosecution
16 Liaison commented the more he thought about it, the
17 more cases he came up with regarding property
18 security. He added there were many ways in which an
19 agent could put someone's property at risk.

20 Ms. Rubin stated it sounded like a good mandatory
21 topic, which could take two hours, representing
22 clients and protecting their property as well as
23 working with a buyer. She also added the topic could
24 include professional responsibility when accessing
25 listings and protecting their interests.

1 Hank Lerner, Chief Legal Officer, Pennsylvania
2 Association of Realtors (PAR), stated in discussing
3 possible topics, it was noted a couple cycles ago,
4 Commission Counsel provided a few cases which schools
5 were able to use as a basis for presentations. He
6 noted a positive was to have actual cases and not
7 hypotheticals. However, he shared the downside was
8 there was a danger someone might recognize the person
9 in the case, which could overshadow the actual
10 education. The second downside was that a number of
11 the provided cases had multiple elements so sometimes
12 it was unclear what element the disciplinary action
13 was specifically tied to. He suggested developing
14 more generic case studies based off of actual cases.

15 Chair Cestra agreed with the idea of developing
16 generic cases.

17 Mr. Michalowski stated, if the Commission came up
18 with specific topics, the Prosecution team could work
19 with Mr. Picarella to come up with several cases that
20 have either been adjudicated or gone through a Consent
21 Agreement. The cases could then be funneled into more
22 generic cases based on the subject matter.

23 Chair Cestra asked what the timeline should be to
24 develop the course with the renewal cycle starting
25 soon.
