He stated most revisions were 19 administrative changes to match the quidelines. 20 Mr. Farrell referred the Commission to page 25 of 21 the annex, section 35.245 regarding the display of 22 licenses in office. In its October 2025 meeting, the 23 Commission voted to strike the entire section.

stated the statute calls for the display of licenses.

Mr. Farrell proposed the Commission keep the section

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and use relaxed language of "maintaining" which was originally proposed. The Commission discussed the meaning of "display". It was concluded "maintaining" would replace "display". This would allow offices to decide on how they wanted to display licenses such as in a book, on the wall, or on a computer.

The second point was on page 36, section 35.292 under "Duties of licensees generally." Mr. Farrell stated the change in the section would be the insertion of "notify within 48 hours of receiving all written offers, counteroffers, etc." He added, in October, there did not seem to be a consensus on using the timeline of 48 hours. He attempted to soften the 48-hour language by adding phrasing at the end of subpart A3 of 35.292 which stated "or has otherwise directed, in writing, how and when such notification is to be made." He stated this would require notification within 48 hours unless the seller has agreed otherwise in written documentation.

Ms. Cestra preferred it be "timely" as the statute says as in some markets, 48 hours is too long of a time to present an offer due to the number of offers received. Mr. Picarella added the problem with "timely" is that it becomes subjective and could be argued. He further added the idea of 48 hours is

to make sure people are not sitting on offers and are communicating with their clients.

The Commission discussed what constitutes an offer and situations in which 48 hours might not apply. Hank Lerner, Esquire, PAR, added the PAR preferred in the past to not have the 48-hour language included. He added the extra language at the end of A3 helps to identify scenarios where a client may not want to be informed in the 48-hour window. Mr. Lerner suggested changes in wording of "notify" versus "present" and eliminating an extra "in writing," which appeared in another line.

Mr. Farrell summarized the changes to say "notify the consumer, within 48 hours of receipt, all written offers, counteroffers, notices and communications to and from the parties, unless the property is subject to an existing contract and the seller/landlord has agreed in a written waiver or has otherwise directed in writing how and when such notification is to be made."

Mr. Farrell directed the Commission to page 37 related to the business name on advertisements. He stated the Commission had discussed in October changes to deal with social media, electronic advertising and one click away. He researched the

1 topic to develop quick language to cover the subject.

- 2 He recommended not adding language at the current
- 3 time to keep the regulation moving and for the
- 4 Commission regulations committee to include it in a
- 5 | separate package. The Commission agreed to start a
- 6 different package in the future to deal with social
- 7 media and electronic advertising.
- 8 Mr. Farrell next directed the Commission to page
- 9 41, section 35.323. He explained, based on
- 10 discussion in October, the section was to be struck
- 11 | in its entirety with part of the language moving into
- 12 the next page, section 35.333 regarding escrows under
- 13 the "Agreements of sale." Mr. Lerner confirmed the
- 14 language reflects information PAR has had in
- 15 agreements of sale. He added the language reflects
- 16 | the current practice.
- Mr. Farrell asked if there were any other
- 18 questions or concerns related to the annex. Mr.
- 19 Michalowski stated apprehensions concerning section
- 20 35.286 regarding records retention. He asked what
- 21 the definition of "transaction" was from a
- 22 prosecutorial standpoint. He added people would say
- 23 a transaction is when something is signed like a

- 25 office sees many issues where someone has signed a

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contract to be a person's broker or salesperson but 1 2 then does not do anything. When his office asks for 3 the documents regarding the contract, the person will 4 often say it was not a transaction. He asked if the 5 language could include a reference to the written 6 agreements section to show all documentation which 7 needs retained, not just transactions. Mr. Farrell will draft language to capture what Mr. Michalowski's request. 9

- 16 | Appointment Jessica M. Hickok, CEO, ARELLO
- 17 | [Jessica Hickok, Chief Executive Officer, Association
- 18 of Real Estate License Law Officials (ARELLO), gave a
- 19 brief introduction of herself and stated she was
- 20 there to give the Commission an introduction to
- 21 ARELLO and invite them to attend the upcoming
- 22 conference in Miami. She stated ARELLO has been
- 23 around since 1930 and recently has worked on a new
- 24 brand to bolster awareness of themselves as a trusted
- 25 data source to their real estate commissions. They

host different databases related to real estate regulation. The biggest one is the license verification system in which most ARELLO's states participate in but not Pennsylvania. She added there is no charge for real estate commissions to use the system, and she hoped the Commission would consider sharing their public licensure data. She further added they have a number of prop tech companies and MLS who use the API for ARELLO's data to verify licenses.

Ms. Hickock informed the Commission of a second database, the Disciplinary Action Database (DADB). The DADB is not a public database and only ARELLO members can use it. The DADB compiles disciplinary actions and can be used as a verification tool for real estate commissions. She added the DADB can be used as a tool for ARELLO to help craft education for people using ARELLO for credentials.

Ms. Hickok explained ARELLO works with educators on Certified Distance Educator Instructor (CDEI) credentials. ARELLO certifies many online distance education courses for validity and to verify they fit state requirements. ARELLO also has a commissioner college to assist with commissioner training. She added ARELLO compiles all of the information it

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receives, and offers the research papers and reports generated to members through their website.

Ms. Hickok shared some of the activities at ARELLO's conferences include keynote speakers, roundtables, and administrative panels. She added many activities are done in collaboration with the National Association of Realtors as well as other industry groups.

Ms. Cestra asked about reciprocity between states. She stated Pennsylvania is only reciprocal with five states. She inquired if ARELLO could explain why there were not more reciprocal states and if it had happened in other areas besides Pennsylvania where people just opted out.

Ms. Hickok did not have an answer but would follow up. She added most states rely on ARELLO accreditation while Pennsylvania uses Pearson Vue as their exam provider. She stated ARELLO is working with Pearson Vue to make the accreditation stronger. Job Task Analysis (JTA) is used to help build exams and is created by exam providers. Most exams are built by providers who are not familiar with real estate, so ARELLO is working on strengthening the JTA and write their own JTA to improve the validity of national exams. Improving the validity of the exams

will increase reciprocity between states.

Ms. Cestra wanted to know if claimants' names are mentioned in the legal database. She questioned if there was a database where someone could look up different cases and what occurred, not just a particular person.

Ms. Hickok responded the disciplinary action database logs only the disciplinary action against the licensee and the information comes from the direct feed from a state's database. She had ARELLO does have a case law library which refers to case laws. The cases in the library are mostly from ARELLO's law and policy committee and have come through the Attorney General's Office on case laws related to the industry.

Mr. Johnson was concerned about reciprocity as early on there were 10 to 15 states reciprocal to Pennsylvania, and the current number of five is disheartening. Ms. Cestra responded her understanding from Ms. Hickok was more universal CE and test requirements would help. There was some debate over the number of states generally reciprocal, and Ms. Hickok offered to investigate it further for the Commission.

Bill 838, the Private Licensed

19 | School Act Amendment, was discussed. The Bill would

20 amend the Private Licensed School Act of 1986 to

21 exempt real estate and appraiser schools from the

22 definition of private licensed schools. Senate Bill

23 838 certifies the Department of State is the sole

24 regulator for real estate and appraiser schools and

25 makes no changes to the current oversight and

regulatory process administered by the state licensing plans. The Bill passed out of the Senate and awaits consideration by the House.

Mr. Lublin was asked to bring to the Commission's attention the phone number the regulations say must be included in the real estate recovery fund notice in the consumer notice agreement if sale and agency agreements is no longer an active number. He stated the regulations need to be updated. He inquired if the Commission could provide guidance as to if it would be acceptable to update the forms with a different number prior to the regulations being changed; and if so, what number should be used.

Ms. Bowers provided the correct number as 1-833-DOS-BPOA. Mr. Lublin asked if the Commission would go on record to allow PAR to update their forms with the new number in case anyone chose to quibble with them over the number versus the number in the regulation. It was noted the Commission and Counsel could not give advisory opinions.

Mr. Lublin asked where the Commission was on writing new wholesaling regulations. He was informed questions on wholesaling regulations would have to be deferred to Regulatory Counsel Mark Farrell, who was no longer in the meeting. A note was made for Mr.

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   Farrell to provide an update at the next meeting.]
