25 Regulatory Report - Regulatory Status Report

1 [Mark Farrell, Esquire, Regulatory Counsel,
2 Department of State, reported the Commission has five
3 pending regulatory packages, all of them processing
4 as expected.

5 Regulatory Counsel was preparing the remaining
6 documents for General Revisions package, 16A-5616,
7 Mr. Farrell stated the package has had many changes
8 and justifications.

9 He stated the Licensure by Endorsement package
10 was approved at the department level and was at the
11 Governor's Office for review. The package could then
12 be published for public comments.

13 Mr. Farrell discussed the press opinions. He
14 stated Department approval had been given and the
15 Governor's Office was reviewing the package. The
16 goal was to get the regulation on the agenda to the
17 Commission's vote before the end of the year.]

19 Regulatory Report - 16A-4829: Schedule of Civil
20 Penalties

21 [Mr. Farrell discussed the Commission's Schedule of
22 Civil Penalties. He noted meeting with Mr. Picarella
23 and Mr. Michalowski to review the Commission's
24 existing schedule and draft updated language. Mr.
25 Farrell requested the Commission members review the

1 schedule to provide feedback. A workable meeting
2 could be arranged whereby the updates to this package
3 could be discussed.

4 Ray Michalowski, Esquire, Senior Commission
5 Prosecutor, suggested changes to the language with
6 regard to citations in the Schedule of Civil
7 Penalties to ensure the citation moves through the
8 system more quickly. He explained this could be done
9 was by setting a penalty for both the first and
10 second offense. He discussed the fact that certain
11 advertising cases are outdated, particularly with the
12 failure to supervise your associate, your licensee,
13 your salesperson or associate broker. He stated,
14 when the last package was drafted, it was limited to
15 three underlying violations rather, than all
16 violations that could be committed by a licensee.

17 Mr. Michalowski suggested there had been a number
18 of requests to move those numbers up and to expand
19 that package.]

20 ***

21 Regulatory Report - Wholesaling/Act 52 of 2024
22 [Mark Farrell, Esquire, Regulatory Counsel, discussed
23 the Wholesaling Act. This was to be the main focus
24 of the scheduled committee meeting. He strongly
25 encouraged the Commission to review the outline of

1 topics before reconvening for discussion on same.

2 He acknowledged comments from PAR, Pennsylvania
3 Association of Realtors, and Philadelphia Community
4 Legal Services. He constructed a sixth package as a
5 placeholder as a result of working on the General
6 Revisions package and realizing that too many
7 advertising-related issues were coming up within the
8 GR package. This placeholder package of advertising
9 related material would be a separate entity on its
10 own.

13 Civil Penalties.]
