1 Ms. Tully noted the Board entered into Executive 2 Session for the purpose of conducting quasi-judicial 3 deliberations and to receive the advice of counsel on 4 the matters upon which the Board will later vote.]

Roll Call of Board Members/Introduction of Attendees

[Nichole Wray Maloney, Division Chief, provided a

roll call of Board members and introduction of

attendees. A quorum of Board members was present.]

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11 Appointment - Introduction of Deputy Chief Counsel,

13 [Shana Walter, Esquire, Deputy Chief Counsel,

14 Prosecution Division, provided the Board with a brief

15 update of her change in position with the

16 Commonwealth.

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18 Regulatory Report

19 | [Jacqueline Wolfgang, Esquire, Regulatory Counsel,

20 explained the Board had five pending regulations:

21 | 16A-6923, General Revisions; 16A-6924, Volunteer

22 Licenses; 16A-6925, Licensure by Endorsement (Act

23 41); 16A-6927, Licensed Associate Marriage and Family

24 | Therapists and Associate Professional Counselors; and

25 16A-6928, Supervisory Standards. She noted updates

on the regulations in the Board's packet for review.

Ms. Wolfgang discussed the General Revisions package. She reviewed the steps of the package after the Board's approval earlier in the year. She noted the receipt of feedback from OGC Budget and Policy Offices to review with the Board.

Ms. Wolfgang explained the first feedback referred to Section 47.12c (b)(5) and (b)(5.1). She noted the same provision was also drafted for Sections 48 and 49. She read the drafted language to the Board and noted the word "concurrently" had been flagged as being potentially vague and confusing.

Ms. Wolfgang asked for clarification on the Board's intention with the drafted language. She stated the intention was that at least one of the two hours of supervision needed to be done with the supervisee individually.

Ms. Tully confirmed she was not with the Board at the time the changes were drafted; however, she understood the meaning to be one hour of supervision must be done individually and one hour can be done in group supervision.

Ms. Early asked for clarification on how Ms. Wolfgang proposed to solve the issue. Ms. Wolfgang proposed the sentence using the word "concurrently"

be removed entirely and adding language reading "at least one of the two hours in each 40 hours of supervised clinical experience shall be with the supervisee individually."

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The Board agreed with Ms. Wolfgang's proposed revisions. She stated she would ask for a vote on the revisions as a whole at the end of the discussion.

Ms. Wolfgang directed the Board's attention to Section 49.11 regarding examinations. She noted the Board proposed to eliminate a number of examinations and limit the examinations to the two national examinations for professional counseling, the NCE and the NCMHCE. She added the Policy Office raised concerns that eliminating the exams might cause issues with respect to workforce development at a time when the administration is working to strengthen the behavioral health pipeline. She noted there was concern eliminating the exams may increase burdens to licensure. She also noted there may be potential impact on individuals who are already on a path to licensure and now cannot take those examinations.

Dr. Behun explained the standard for other boards in the United States is to offer either the NCE or NCMHCE. He added anyone, who completes the education

requirements under Section 49.2 for licensure in
Pennsylvania, should be able to pass either the NCE
or NCMHCE. He noted overwhelming support for the
changes not just by the Board but also the
Pennsylvania Counseling Association and other
licensed counselors in Pennsylvania.

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Mr. Gross asked, if the changes were to be made, would there be a public notice to allow individuals already in the process the time to complete their exams? Ms. Wolfgang replied a time period was not proposed in the regulation as written but could be given consideration. Ms. Wolfgang proposed the Board consider the exam regulations as a competency piece related to the Code of Ethics as opposed to eliminating examinations. She added the Policy Office was concerned about eliminating exams as there had not been any public comments on the exposure draft. Ms. Wolfgang suggested the Board consider pulling the exam regulations out of the General Revisions package. She noted her concern that the potential controversy surrounding the elimination of certain exams might hold up the General Revisions package.

Mr. DeCriscio noted he had taken the Advanced Alcohol and other Drug Abuse Counselor Examination,

and from his viewpoint, the exam does not cover what one needs to be a professional counselor. He also noted he had not seen any applicants take any exams other than the NCE and the NCMHCE in his four years with the Board.

Ms. Wolfgang stated Mr. DeCriscio's comments were excellent points. She added it would be helpful to research what the Board was considering when the regulation was first drafted. She also noted the rationale behind eliminating certain exams is not addressed in the preamble, which makes the regulation vulnerable.

Dr. Behun reiterated, by the Board offering seven or eight different exam options, it would be operating outside of the standards of other boards who license counselors in other states.

Ms. Wolfgang added she could look for regulatory documents from when the exam decisions were first made to gain insight into the reasoning behind the decisions.

Dr. Behun did not believe the exams listed for elimination are the equivalent of the national standard for licensure.

Ms. Wolfgang suggested pulling the provision from the regulation to allow for additional work on it.

1 She stated more research is needed. She would look 2 into competency as a potential solution.

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Acting Commissioner Claggett agreed with Ms.
Wolfgang's approach. He noted the Board could put
the information in a newsletter.

Ms. Wolfgang stated the last issue in the General Revisions related to other sources of continuing education being in all three chapters, but she directed the Board to Section 47.36a(a). She stated the Board proposed to change the current regulation allowing a licensee to accrue up to 30 hours of continuing education units (CEUs) biennium through services as a preceptor, lecturer or speaker to 15 She noted a preceptor is different than a hours. lecturer or speaker as they are a licensee who provides supervision, mentorship or practical training in a practice or clinical setting to help bridge the gap between theoretical knowledge and real-world experience. She added the Policy Office was concerned that limiting the preceptor hours to 15 might discourage preceptorship and have a negative impact.

Ms. Wolfgang suggested the Board consider separating preceptors from lecturers and speakers. She recommended the Board keep preceptor CEU hours at

1 30 while changing lecturer and speaker CEU hours to

2 | 15. She noted, if approved, the section would be

3 revised and not pulled out of the General Revisions

4 like the exam portion.

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Ms. Early and Acting Commissioner Claggett agreed
with her recommendation of keeping the current
regulation for preceptors while limiting the change
to 15 hours for lecturers and speakers.

Ms. Wolfgang clarified she could come back to the Board again with an amended Annex before moving forward or she could make the amendments and push forward in the regulatory process. She added the Board will still see the amendment changes after the process is moved forward as there are still several steps before the final rulemaking, including a public comment period.

Mr. Gross was not sure about the idea of a preceptor never doing actual CEUs and just receiving credit based on preceptor duties. Ms. Wolfgang noted it was not a change from the current regulations. She added other boards have very similar regulations for preceptors.]

23 Ms. Wolfgang explained the General Revisions

24 regulations has taken a number of years to complete

25 as it is a comprehensive 71-page regulation. If the

exam requirements are treated as its own regulation, it would be about five pages, making the time needed for it much shorter.

Dr. Behun stressed that the counseling exam requirements needed to be changed to the same as the social work and marriage and family therapist requirement of national exams.

Ms. Tully clarified the exam changes were being pulled out of the General Revision package to move the package forward. She noted the Board would be revisiting the exam changes in a separate package after additional research. She also noted this meant the exam portion of the regulation would not be changing from the current regulations with the General Revisions package.

Mr. DeCriscio had similar concerns to Dr. Behun. He added the licensed professional counselors (LPC) on the Board are adamant changes are needed in the Board's LPC exam standards.]

Ms. Tully reviewed why the Board had wanted the information. Vice-Chair Early confirmed the Board wished to make sure they were not outliers in their supervisory requirements and were similar to other states.

The Board decided to take some time to review the 1 information provided and discuss it at the next Board

- Senate Bill 583, seeking to introduce the Social 16

She noted, if they pass, there would be an amendment to the Practice Act, and the Board would work on related regulations.

7 New Business - Act 41 Discussion

8 [Cathy A. Tully, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted the

9 list of applications for consideration at the Board

10 meetings is becoming quite lengthy. For someone to

11 be considered for licensure under Act 41, the first

12 inquiry the Board makes is whether or not the state

13 that issued the license is substantially equivalent

14 to the requirements of the Commonwealth.

15 Ms. Tully stated Board Administration keeps a

16 running list of what states have been considered for

17 which license classes as well as a record of which

18 meeting the state was evaluated. She asked if the

19 Board would be interested in publishing a list of

20 states it has already determined are substantially

21 equivalent. She noted there would be a disclosure

22 stating the Board reevaluates the law from each state

23 for every application.

24 Mr. Gross stated the more information the public

25 has the better people can make informed decisions

about their next steps.

Vice-Chair Early commented the disclosure would also need to state that there is not an automatic approval based on the state being on the substantially equivalent list.

Ms. Tully noted everyone can apply even, if their state is not on the list. She added the Board can still issue provisional denials even if the state is on the list as there are five criteria a person needs to meet to qualify for approval under Act 41. She will start the process for creating a list for publication.

Ms. Tully also suggested the Board consider starting a procedure where Act 41 applications from states, who are not considered substantially equivalent, are delegated to the Application Committee for review. The Committee could review the application, and if the laws are the same as when the Board last considered the state, the Committee could issue the provisional denial. By doing this, the applicant could start the appellate process sooner instead of waiting for a decision from a Board meeting. It was agreed expediting the process would be good for all parties involved.]
