22 [Chair Butler discussed a report regarding changes to

23 Medicare, which will affect provisional licenses and

24 many members. The American Speech and Language-

25 | Hearing Association (ASHA) and the Pennsylvania

1 Speech-Language-Hearing Association (PSHA) have been 2 involved.

Chair Butler continued by stating that any members having a provisional license or in their Clinical Fellowship Year (CFY) will no longer be able to treat patients or bill under the Medicare Part B plan.

She suggested members look at ASHA as they have a quorum and campaign for Medicare 25. Additionally, members can link up to the CMS publication on WWCMS government files for outpatient speech and language pathology.

Chair Butler strongly advised all to review the websites as there is much needed support against this issue passing. She reiterated the need for members to oppose the proposal.

She discussed the upcoming conference for audiologists at their annual conference in September 2025.

Additionally, Chair Butler commented on a telephone scam focusing on reaching out to speech pathologists. She warned members to be very careful about giving out personal information over the telephone.

Chair Butler then introduced the Audiology and

Ms. Jacopetti abstained from 14 15 voting on the motion.] 16 17 18 Appointments - Life Speech Services Regulations 19 Discussion 20 [Rebecca Kruise, SLP, Life Speech Services and 21 Kristin Park, SLP, Collegeville Speech and Hearing, 22 LLC, presented on working with the Board to change 23 the wording in the legislative language regarding 24 aspects of becoming SLPs, Certification of Clinical 25 Competence, (CCC), et cetera, from ASHA and some of

the confusion resulting from the same. She commented that the definition of speech-language pathology in its Pennsylvania legislative format refers to ASHA's definition of same, causing a redundancy in the language. Removing ASHA's definition from the Pennsylvania format would remove the redundancy.

Ms. Park stated the current language from ASHA might be confusing in itself for those desiring to obtain an SLP license in Pennsylvania, because one does not need an ASHA CCC here in order to become an SLP.

She stated no actual changes were being requested of the legislative language itself, but only that the wording of same might be clarified so that those going through the process of becoming SLP's can better understand what they need to do.

Provisional licenses and CCC's wording were discussed so that the language might clarify that anyone completing their supervised professional experience to gain their SLP license would be a provisional licensee, as opposed to what the current language states.

Additionally, any speech pathologist assistant must complete a certain number of semester hours or a CCC. However, according to Ms. Kruise, the general

understanding is that an SLP assistant cannot hold a CCC.

It was emphasized that the goal of this presentation was to help Pennsylvania SLPs know exactly what to do to earn their license. The current legislative language intermingles both the CCC and the PA licensure, two separate entities, in such a way that candidates for SLPs might believe they need both in order to become licensed in PA, when, in fact, this is not so.

Tiffany Moniz, M.A. CCC-SLP, stated obstacles like this have impacted those that have dropped their RCS, because employers sometimes believe that holding a CCC is a mandatory qualification to obtain jobs.

Mr. Eaton thanked all three presenters for their input. He referred to Board Counsel for an explanation on how this process works.

Ms. Goshert stated the Board does not have the power to change legislation. It does have the power to help change regulations. She assured them that the Board would look into this matter further. She requested a copy of their version be sent to her in order to be provided to the Board members for review.]
