16 related fraud in Pittsburgh.

17 Ms. Keefer responded that such matters would fall

18 under the jurisdiction of prosecution and not Board

19 | Counsel due to the Lyness decision, which mandates

20 separation between the two.

21 Dr. Guise asked about actions related to the

22 scheduling of drugs like Medetomidine or Dexdomitor,

23 given their emergence in illicit drug reports from

24 cities such as New York, Philadelphia, and

25 | Pittsburgh.

Ms. Keefer clarified that the board does not schedule drugs and instead follows prevailing standards as outlined in Principle 7D of the Board's regulations.

Dr. Guise asked for clarification on the scope of practice for veterinary technicians, particularly under direct supervision and referenced advanced directives.

Ms. Keefer read from 49 Pa. Code § 31.31, stating that a certified veterinary technician may perform certain duties under direct or indirect supervision, as designated. When asked about situations where a veterinarian is uncomfortable with indirect supervision, Keefer explained that the board cannot provide advisory opinions and recommended that the veterinarian consult legal counsel.

Ms. Roberts confirmed this, and counsel emphasized that the Board cannot interpret regulations for individuals due to existing case law.
