Directive Regarding the Uniform Reporting of Voting System Malfunctions to the Department of State

Directive 1 of 2026

The following Directive is issued April 6, 2026, by the Secretary of the Commonwealth (Secretary) pursuant to authority contained at Sections 201(e) and 1105-A(a) of the Pennsylvania Election Code, 25 P.S. §§ 2621(e), 3031.5(a):

- 1) All counties must report to the Secretary, no later than 60 days after every election (this includes all primary, general, municipal, and special elections), any electronic voting system malfunction reported to the county by any source or otherwise known to the county which occurred during an election, including during the casting of votes or the tabulation or reporting of results.
 - a. Malfunctions shall be reported to the Secretary in the Voting System Malfunction Report form attached as Appendix A to this Directive.
 - b. If no voting system malfunctions occurred in a given election, the county must submit a declaration to the Department of State (Department) that it has no malfunctions to report by completing the final section of the form attached as Appendix A to this directive.

NOTE: Any system errors or anomalies observed during testing or outside the voting or tabulation process may be reported to the Secretary. The form prescribed herein should not be used for such a report.

- 2) For purposes of this Directive, electronic voting system malfunctions include any anomaly that indicates a voting system component is not operating per system specifications. This does not include irregularities resulting from human error, except where the voting system is designed to correct that human error but did not. See also the exclusions for isolated issues described in Part 3 below. Malfunctions within the scope of this Directive include:
 - a. Recurring scanning, printing, or ballot marking errors that indicate a voting system component is not operating correctly.
 - b. Tabulation errors that, after reasonable investigation during post-election reconciliation, cannot be conclusively attributed to human error.
 - c. Equipment failures that require reconfiguration of voting system settings, such as touchscreen recalibration.
 - d. Recurring paper jams that occur on precinct or central tabulation equipment and printers used to print ballots requiring poll worker intervention to clear the jammed paper or ballot.
 - e. Counties shall report on the attached Voting System Malfunction Report:
 - a description of each type of malfunction and nature thereof;
 - source(s) for the report;

- time span the malfunction occurred;
- location (including precincts affected);
- voting system component(s) affected;
- number of voters/ballots affected; and
- any actions taken to resolve the malfunction and whether resolution was achieved.

For the purposes of reporting, each malfunction may be grouped by type, with the number of voters affected cumulated across instances of the same malfunction. For example, if a touchscreen needed recalibration five times, affecting two voters each time, this is to be reported as one malfunction, occurring multiple times, affecting an aggregate of 10 voters.

- 3) For the purposes of this Directive and for reporting to the Secretary, voting system malfunctions DO NOT include:
- a. Isolated paper jams in printers and other voting system peripherals.
 - b. Isolated paper jams in precinct and central scanners/tabulators.
 - c. Scanner errors where local election officials have determined that the ballot was incorrectly inserted into the scanner.
 - d. Scanner errors where local election officials have determined that the ballot was incorrectly or inadequately marked. This is a system feature and is not considered a system anomaly.

NOTE: The Department strongly recommends that the events listed in section 3 be reported to the county board of elections for purposes of training and quality control. They may be reported to the Secretary, but county elections officials should not use the form prescribed herein.

- 4) Voting system malfunctions or the declaration of no malfunctions must be reported to the Secretary on the attached Voting System Malfunction Report in Appendix A.
- 5) To effectively carry out the requirements of this Directive, counties must have a mechanism in place for voters, poll watchers, and other election observers to report malfunctions to local polling place officials or to county officials, when applicable. Counties must also have a formal mechanism for polling place officials to report voting system malfunctions to the county board of elections.
- 6) The Department will post all received Voting System Malfunction Reports on its website within 105 days after each respective election, redacted as necessary for purposes of election security, confidentiality, and preventing misinformation.
