Members of the General Assembly:

The Pennsylvania Voter Registration Act was signed into law on June 30, 1995. In 1999, the Department of State continued its ongoing efforts to efficiently and effectively administer provisions of the Act.

In 1999, our counties accepted more than 481,000 new voter registrations, which brought the number of registered voters to an all-time high of 7.48 million Pennsylvanians.

The Department of State is committed to fulfilling its responsibilities under the Pennsylvania Voter Registration Act and to promote voter registration, awareness and outreach activities across the Commonwealth. Governor Tom Ridge has proclaimed September as Voter Participation and Awareness Month in Pennsylvania to recognize the importance of citizen involvement in the electoral process.

We also continue with our Pennsylvania Voter Hall of Fame program. Since 1995, nearly 5,000 Pennsylvanians from 28 counties have been inducted into the Pennsylvania Voter Hall of Fame for exercising their right to vote in every November election for 50 consecutive years or more. Under its Vote With a Vet and Student Mock Election initiatives, the Department has teamed up with veterans, high school and elementary school principals, teachers and students to underscore the importance of voting among our youth. We look forward to your participation in these programs.

Introduction

The Pennsylvania Voter Registration Act (PVRA) was signed into law on June 30, 1995. This important event marked the beginning of a five-year legacy of impressive advancements.

The Pennsylvania Department of State has worked diligently with the 67 county election offices, other Commonwealth agencies designated with voter registration responsibilities, and the public-at-large to fulfill the requirements of the act.

In 1999, the number of registered voters rose to an all-time high of 7.48 million Pennsylvanians. With that, the Department has increased its efforts to ensure fair, honest and efficient administration of laws relating to the PVRA.

Toward that end, the following represents a summary of several important aspects of the PVRA.

Department of Transportation

The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) is a key player in efforts to administer the "motor voter" requirements of the PVRA. Under PVRA, citizens of the Commonwealth can complete an application to register to vote while applying to receive or renew their photo license.

This innovative process has offered an easy and convenient way for a growing number of Pennsylvanians to participate in the electoral process. In 1999, more than 400,000 Pennsylvania citizens chose to make application to register to vote at the Commonwealth's photo licensing centers. This makes PennDOT the largest recipient of applications among all sources of voter registration applications.

New Voter Registration/Photo License Contract

In 1999, the Departments of State and Transportation partnered in a joint Request For Proposal (RFP) to acquire the services of a new vendor to operate the photo license and voter registration programs.

A joint-department committee hopes to complete contract negotiations by the summer of this year and achieve full contractual implementation by the summer of 2001.

Voter Registration Outreach

In 1999, the Departments of State and Transportation also co-produced a brochure to inform consumers about the voter registration process at photo license centers.

The brochure, which provides a comprehensive, easy to understand guide to the motor voter process, was distributed to members of the General Assembly, all county voter registration offices and other offices responsible for voter registration.

How to Register at PennDOT Photo License Centers

The following procedures are followed when applying to register to vote at PennDOT:

- Customers arrive at a PennDOT photo license center with a driver's license application card containing a printed, two-dimensional bar code. The bar code is scanned by a computer which identifies customers who will be at least 18 years of age by the date of the next election. The computer provides a prompt asking whether the individual wishes to register to vote. Customers who choose to apply for registration are asked to confirm their county of residence, indicate a party preference (if they have one) and to provide their telephone number and race (not a requirement). The applicant is asked to sign a declaration that the information is true and correct.

The transaction is recorded on an electronic keypad. Applicants receive a receipt indicating pertinent information about their registration. The receipt provides a paper record of the transaction and a direct link to the Department of Transportation should a problem occur during the process of registering to vote. Citizens and county election officials continue to report the value of this receipt in tracking down data to complete the voter registration application process.

- The PennDOT computer system stores the completed voter registration applications and transmits the data to the Department of State's contracted vendor which electronically sorts applications by county, prints, and mails them to the appropriate county voter registration office.

In 1999, the two departments sent 21,000 voter registration forms to photo licensing centers across the state. This cooperative effort gave photo license visitors the opportunity to make application to register to vote, without having to receive or renew a photo license.

In 1999, a total of 400,737 motor voter applications were forwarded to county voter registration officials. In addition to processing new applications, PennDOT also provides change of address information to the Department of State, which is then forwarded to the appropriate county voter registration office. In 1999, the Department of State transmitted 924,817 change of address requests to county voter registration officials.

Agency Registration

During 1999, the Department of State continued to work with state operated public assistance and disability agencies that provided voter registration opportunities to their clients.

These agencies include: County Assistance Offices; Women, Infants & Children Nutrition Clinics; District Offices of the Office of Vocational Rehabilitation; District Offices of the Bureau of Blindness & Visual Services; State Mental Hospitals and State Mental Retardation Centers; Area Agencies on Aging; Contractors for the Bureau of Blindness & Visual Services; Centers for Independent Living; County Mental Health and Mental Retardation Offices; and Student Disability Services Offices of the State System of Higher Education.

In 1999, the agency voter registration program was expanded to include additional offices providing services to persons with disabilities. These include the Offices of Special Education and the ADA Complementary Para Transit programs.

To assist these new agencies, the Department of State offers a guide detailing the responsibilities and duties of mandated voter registration agencies. In addition to the guide, the Department of State furnishes these agencies with voter registration mail application forms, posters encouraging voter registration and brochures describing the voter registration process which are distributed to clients.

The Department of State also conducted training sessions and provided technical assistance to help these agencies implement their new programs. In addition, the Department also publishes a semi-annual newsletter, *Voter Registration Update*, which is distributed to all agencies.

Published twice each year, the newsletter provides important information to each agency site coordinator regarding voter registration procedures and deadlines.

Agency Recognition Activities

In 1999, the Department of State continued its efforts to recognize agencies that implement the requirements of voter registration under the PVRA. *The Agency Recognition Program* acknowledges the services provided by Commonwealth voter registration agencies and their employees.

The first step of the program requires each agency site which offers voter registration opportunities to complete a self-assessment checklist and return it to the Department of State. If the checklist shows that the agency is providing all the required voter registration services, the Secretary of the Commonwealth presents the office with a Voter Registration Achievement Certificate. In 1999, 145 agencies received achievement certificates from the Secretary.

Upon earning the Achievement Certificate, the agency is then eligible to receive an award from the Secretary for outstanding voter registration service. The Outstanding Voter Registration Award recognizes agencies which have gone "above and beyond" requirements to provide voter registration opportunities to their clients. A total of 14 agencies received Outstanding Voter Registration Awards in 1999.

Compliance Litigation Update

The Department of State continues to implement the provisions of a stipulation agreement with the United States Department of Justice and group of private plaintiffs concerning the Commonwealth's compliance with the National Voter Registration Act (NVRA).

Stipulation Agreement

On October 28, 1999, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania signed a stipulation agreement with the Justice Department and private plaintiffs whereby the Commonwealth agreed to designate as voter registration agencies under the NVRA state-funded special education programs primarily serving students with disabilities.

Remaining issues with the United States Department of Justice and private plaintiffs on the PVRA were resolved in *United States v. Commonwealth*, 95-CV-382 (E.D. Pa.) and *Association of Community Organizations for Reform Now (ACORN) v. Ridge*, 95-CV-7671 (E.D. Pa.) in a final opinion issued on January 14, 2000. The ruling required the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to designate as voter registration agencies under the NVRA the transit authority offices within the Commonwealth that provide state-funded ADA Complementary Para Transit programs.

Training

The Department offers training, materials and guidance to all designated offices and programs that provide voter registration services to clients with disabilities.

Five Year Notice

In addition, as part of the settlement agreement, and in accordance with Section 1901 (b)(3) of the PVRA, counties are now permitted to send out notices to registered voters who have not voted or appeared to have not voted during a five-year-period.

The notice states that the citizen must contact the county voter registration office within two federal elections or their registration will be cancelled. The notice must also include information on how to contact the county voter registration office and how to register elsewhere if the citizen has relocated. The notice must be used in conjunction with, and not as an alternative to, other voter removal programs such as National Change of Address (NCOA) and Mass Confirmation mailing as provided under the PVRA.

The five-year notice provision is an effective way for our counties to identify citizens who no longer reside in their jurisdiction. This information is critical in assisting the counties and correcting their voter registration lists.

Legislative Initiatives

House Bill 1686

Introduced on June 16, 1999, House Bill 1686 will allow more options in the PVRA for county voter registration offices to cancel registered voters who are deceased. The bill allows for the cancellation of registered deceased voters from information obtained from newspaper obituaries; notification from relatives; knowledge by voter registration staff of a death, and other sources.

While still in the General Assembly, if passed and signed by the Governor, House Bill 1686 would provide a tremendous opportunity for county election staff to update their voter registration lists. Currently, the PVRA only allows for the cancellation of a deceased voter whose name appears on a list provided by the Department of Health.

After several meetings with election officials from the County Legislative Committee, and attendance at their 1999 conferences, the Department has compiled the following proposed amendments to the PVRA. These changes will make enforcement of the PVRA, and other related election laws, easier and more efficient to serve the citizens of the Commonwealth.

Suggested Amendments to the PVRA:

- Clarify that voters who move may use "fail-safe" provisions only one time.
- Clarify that the "ten-day" rule does not apply to those voters who circulate or sign nomination petitions or papers.
- Include a deadline for changes of address received by the Department of Transportation to be effective for the next election.
- Allow counties to implement an annual mailing program or a biennial mailing program that is in conformance with the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 to identify electors whose addresses may have changed.
- Eliminate the requirement that the Secretary of the Commonwealth set fees for public lists, which are prepared and distributed by the counties.
- Change the requirement that counties provide for computer inquiries about registered voters into an option.

Information Accessibility

The Department maintains a close working relationship with counties, members of the General Assembly and legislative staff in striving to make voter registration related information easily accessible and Bureau of Commissions, Elections and Legislation staff is ready to assist them.

The Commonwealth's 67 county election and voter registration offices receive regular updates on issues relating to all aspects of election administration. Registration information and statistics can be found on the Department website at www.dos.state.pa.us.

Voter Outreach Initiatives

Vote With a Vet

A critical component of voter registration work is voter outreach and education -- particularly to our young.

To reach younger voters, the Department, under the direction of Governor Ridge, created the *Vote With a Vet . . . Register and Vote Program*, which links military veterans with youth through a shared awareness approach. Under the program, detailed biographies of Pennsylvania veterans and voter registration forms are sent to participating *Vote With a Vet* Pennsylvania schools.

As a result, students not only learn an important history lesson from veterans who provided military service, but they learn about the connection between their right to vote and the sacrifice of Pennsylvania's veterans.

In 1999, the Department distributed more than 6,000 voter registration forms and biographies to age-eligible students. Created to encourage registration of young voters, *Vote With a Vet* is the latest effort of the administration to reverse the trend of voter apathy.

PA Voter Hall of Fame

Administered by the Department of State, the Pennsylvania Voter Hall of Fame program was established to generate increased awareness and encourage Pennsylvanians to exercise their right to vote.

This program publicly honors Pennsylvanians who have voted in every November election for 50 consecutive years or more, and invites them to share their stories. In turn, the men and women of the Voter Hall of Fame become ambassadors for voter participation encouraging others to participate in the democratic process.

In September of 1997, the Department of State and the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission dedicated the Pennsylvania Voter Exhibit and Voter Hall of Fame. Located within the main offices of the Department of State in Harrisburg, the exhibit documents the state's political heritage. The names of those Pennsylvanians inducted into the Voter Hall of Fame are added to a book which is part of the permanent exhibit.

Appendices

Statistics for the period covered by this report are contained in Appendix I through Appendix VII.

- Appendix I contains voter registration figures by county and political party as of December 31, 1999.
- Appendix II contains a comparison of voter registration totals from 1997 - 1999 as of the close of registration prior to the November Elections.
- Appendix III contains data for the various voter registration methods. Total applications include new registrations, changes of address, changes of name or party regardless of whether the application was valid, rejected or a duplicate. Valid applications include only new registration applications which were accepted by the county voter registration commissions. This appendix includes a line graph depicting various methods of application from 1996 - 1999.

- Appendix IV contains data relative to list maintenance activities in the counties for the period covered by this report. These activities include the number of changes of address received from PennDOT and processed, the number of address verification notices mailed in accordance with Section 1901 (d)(2) of the PVRA, the number of five year notices mailed and the number of responses to these notices, the number of registration files marked inactive at the end of 1999, and the number of active and inactive voter registrations which were canceled. (The motor voter litigation settlement agreement permits the counties to send out five year notices in accordance with Section 1901 (b)(3) of the PVRA.)

- Appendix V contains data for “motor voter” applications broken down by political party. This information is provided directly from DataCard Corporation, the contracted vendor who processes the applications for the Departments of State and Transportation. These statistics relate to the number of individuals who applied to register to vote at a photo license center. Because it is a centralized computer process, statistics can be provided by political party. Also, the total number of applications as provided by DataCard may differ from the counties’ total applications received from PennDOT for a variety of reasons, including not having been received by the counties until the next reporting period.
- Appendix VI contains the number of changes of address received by PennDOT which were forwarded to the county voter registration commissions. These numbers differ from the numbers the counties report (Appendix IV) because they include all changes reported to PennDOT regardless of whether or not the individual was registered.
- Appendix VII depicts a breakdown of the distribution of the voter registration mail application.

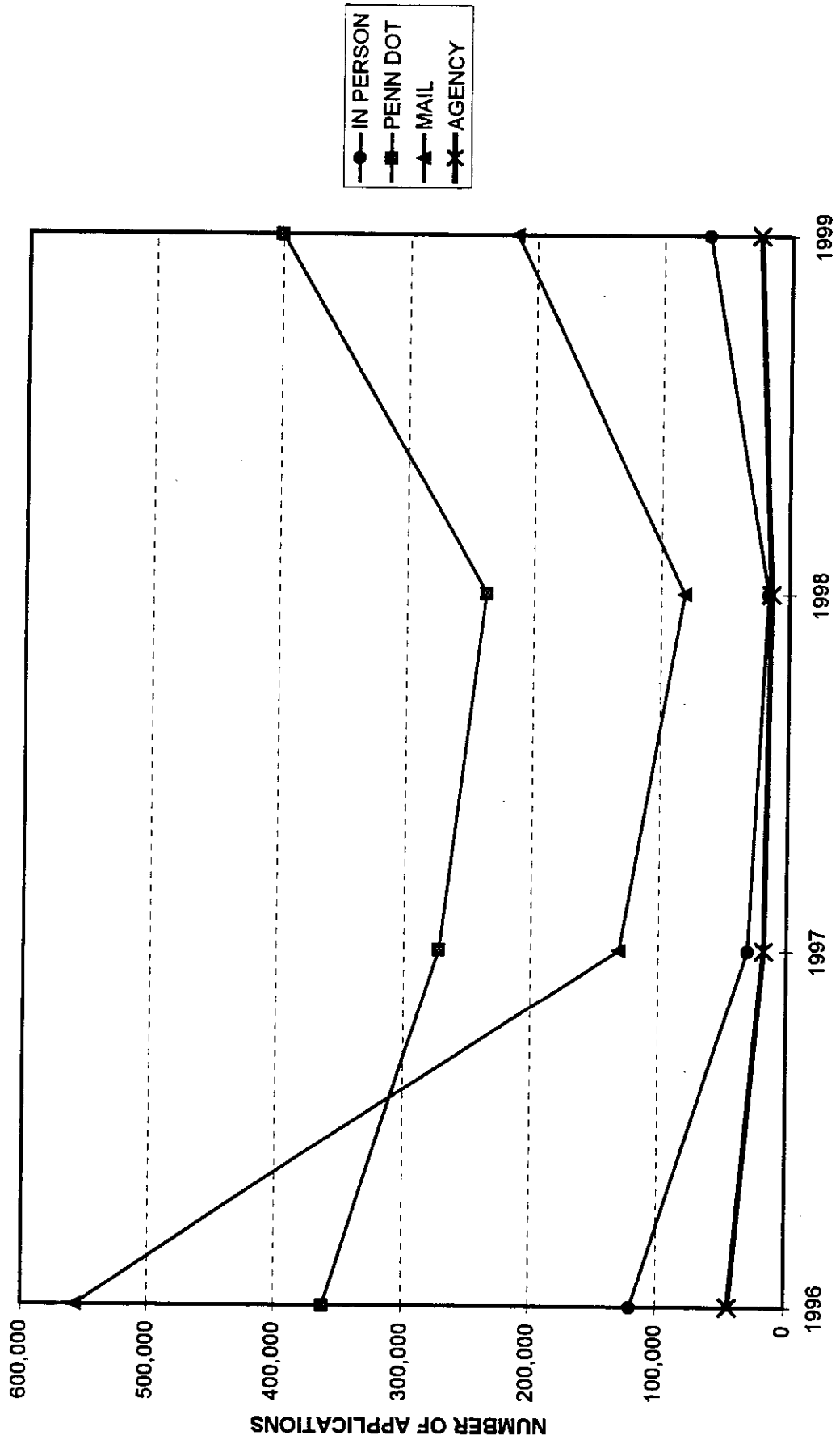

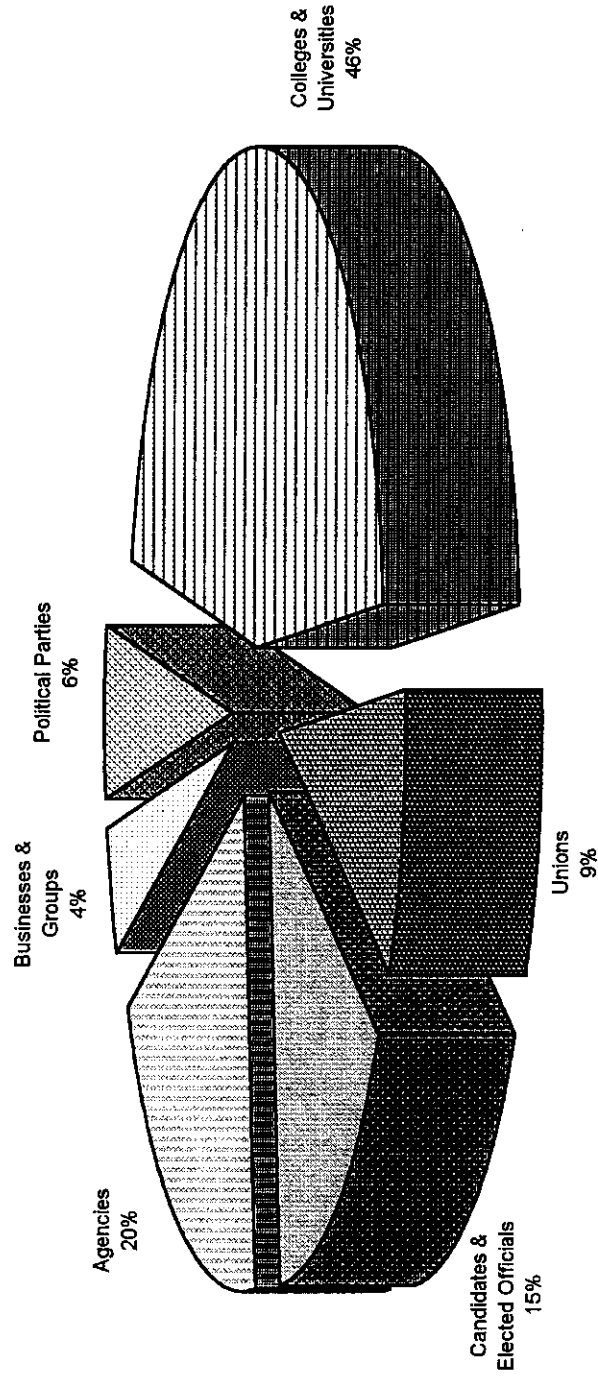
