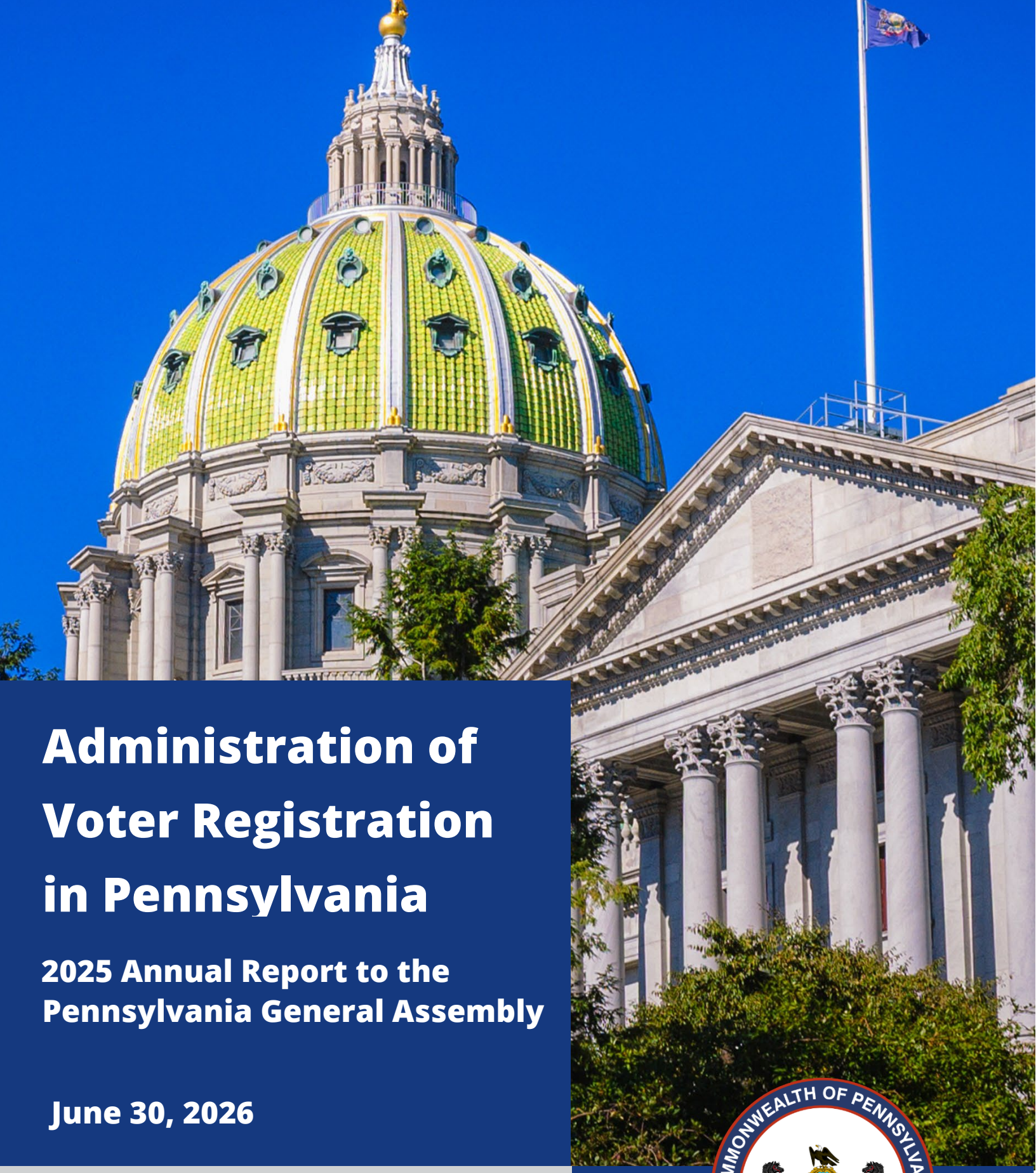

Dear Members of the General Assembly:

As Secretary of the Commonwealth, I am pleased to report on the administration of voter registration in Pennsylvania for calendar year 2025.

The administration of voter registration in Pennsylvania is a joint effort between county and state officials. In 2025, the Department of State worked with the Commonwealth's 67 county election boards and voter registration commissions to provide voter registration opportunities to eligible residents of Pennsylvania and to enhance our efforts to ensure the accuracy of voter rolls. This partnership between state and county officials promotes civic participation while maintaining the integrity of our elections.

To achieve these dual complementary purposes, the Department supports counties in a variety of ways, including providing voter education materials, making available official voter registration and mail ballot application forms both in print and online in multiple languages, and distributing data to counties identifying voters who may have moved and voters who are deceased. The Department also continues its collaboration with various state agencies designated under the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 (NVRA), and those designated under Executive Order 2022-03 as Voter Registration Distribution Agencies, to administer voter registration programs. The Commonwealth's implementation of automatic voter registration processes through the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation continues this work of providing greater access to qualified electors through a method that keeps Pennsylvania's voter records secure, verified, and up to date.

The Department remains committed to fulfilling its responsibilities under both the NVRA and Pennsylvania's voter registration law. Under my leadership, the Department will continue to promote voter registration and civic engagement through its outreach efforts across the Commonwealth and will continue to provide the tools counties need to maintain the accuracy and integrity of their voter rolls.

Executive Summary

In 2025, the Department of State (Department) worked closely with the public, each of the 67 county boards of elections, government agencies consigned voter registration responsibilities, and voter registration advocacy organizations to help ensure all eligible Pennsylvanians who wanted to register to vote could do so. This report summarizes registration data and initiatives by these groups to support voter registration administration in Pennsylvania. The data contained in this report reflects transactions processed through the Statewide Uniform Registry of Electors (SURE) system between January 1, 2025, and December 31, 2025.

As of December 31, 2025, Pennsylvania had approximately 8.92 million registered voters. This represents a 0.58% increase in the number of registered voters since the end of 2024 and a 2.2% increase since the end of 2021, the last year succeeding a presidential election. Since 2021, the number of voters registered as members of the Democratic Party decreased, the number of voters registered as members of the Republican Party increased, and the number of voters who chose to be unaffiliated or registered with a non-major party increased.

Pennsylvania voters registered in 2025 through a variety of methods, demonstrating the success of the Department's efforts to expand opportunities for Pennsylvanians to obtain or update a voter record. A total of 469,001 applications were submitted to counties through the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation ("PennDOT") via its automatic voter registration ("AVR") program, where Pennsylvanians can register or update their registration as part of a one-stop process during PennDOT interactions.

Other voter registration methods also continued to prove popular. Approximately 50,484 applications for registration as a new voter were submitted online, and approximately 16,183 applications for registration as a new voter were submitted on paper forms.

The Department also continued its partnership with other government agencies designated under federal and state law to facilitate registration and to update voter rolls when individuals use those agencies' services. A total of 15,972 registration applications were submitted through these partner agencies (not including PennDOT), with County Assistance Offices (CAOs) providing the majority of these submissions.

Pennsylvania also took steps to ensure that its voter rolls remain up to date. During 2025, counties sent 437,599 notices to registered voters relating to list maintenance, the process

by which Pennsylvania's counties ensure that their voter rolls are kept up-to-date. The Department also forwarded to the counties approximately 492,142 PennDOT transactions indicating that a voter changed their address. 338,295 registrations were cancelled throughout the year.

Lastly, the Department's commitment to civic engagement extended to rewarding voters who have shown continuous commitment to the franchise. In 2025, a total of 627 Pennsylvanians from 10 counties were inducted into the Pennsylvania Voter Hall of Fame, which honors voters who participate in at least 50 consecutive November elections. The list of inductees has now reached 27,225 total members.

All data referenced in this report are available in the appendices. Data from previous years can be found in the respective annual reports, available online at dos.pa.gov.

Opportunities for Improvement

The Commonwealth has made great strides over the past several years in modernizing voter registration and voter list maintenance activities, but there is more work to be done.

- The Department believes county election officials would benefit from the ability to utilize additional data available through the Department's Electronic Registration Information Center (ERIC) membership, including data regarding deceased registrants. However, county access to such data requires amendments to Pennsylvania's voter registration law, codified at 25 Pa.C.S. § 1505.
- The Department continues to prioritize the modernization of the SURE system to improve the convenience, speed, accuracy, and integrity of voter registration and list maintenance processes. In 2025, the Department entered into a contract with a new vendor, Civix, to develop a comprehensive and integrated voter database management system. The Department is working towards a successful and secure transition.

Voter Registration Statistics

Through the SURE system, county voter registration commissions maintain a complete list of all eligible registered voters in the Commonwealth. As of December 31, 2025, there were 8,920,027 registered voters. The charts in this section represent a high-level snapshot of the change in voter registration over both the previous calendar year and the four-year period since the end of 2021. Details broken down by county and party can be found in Appendices A and B.

The chart below (Figure 1) depicts change in voter registration over the four-year period since the end of 2021 and whether that change represented growth or decline in party affiliation. The 2021 numbers were carried over from the 2021 Annual Report on Voter Registration; therefore, they are as of December 31, 2021.

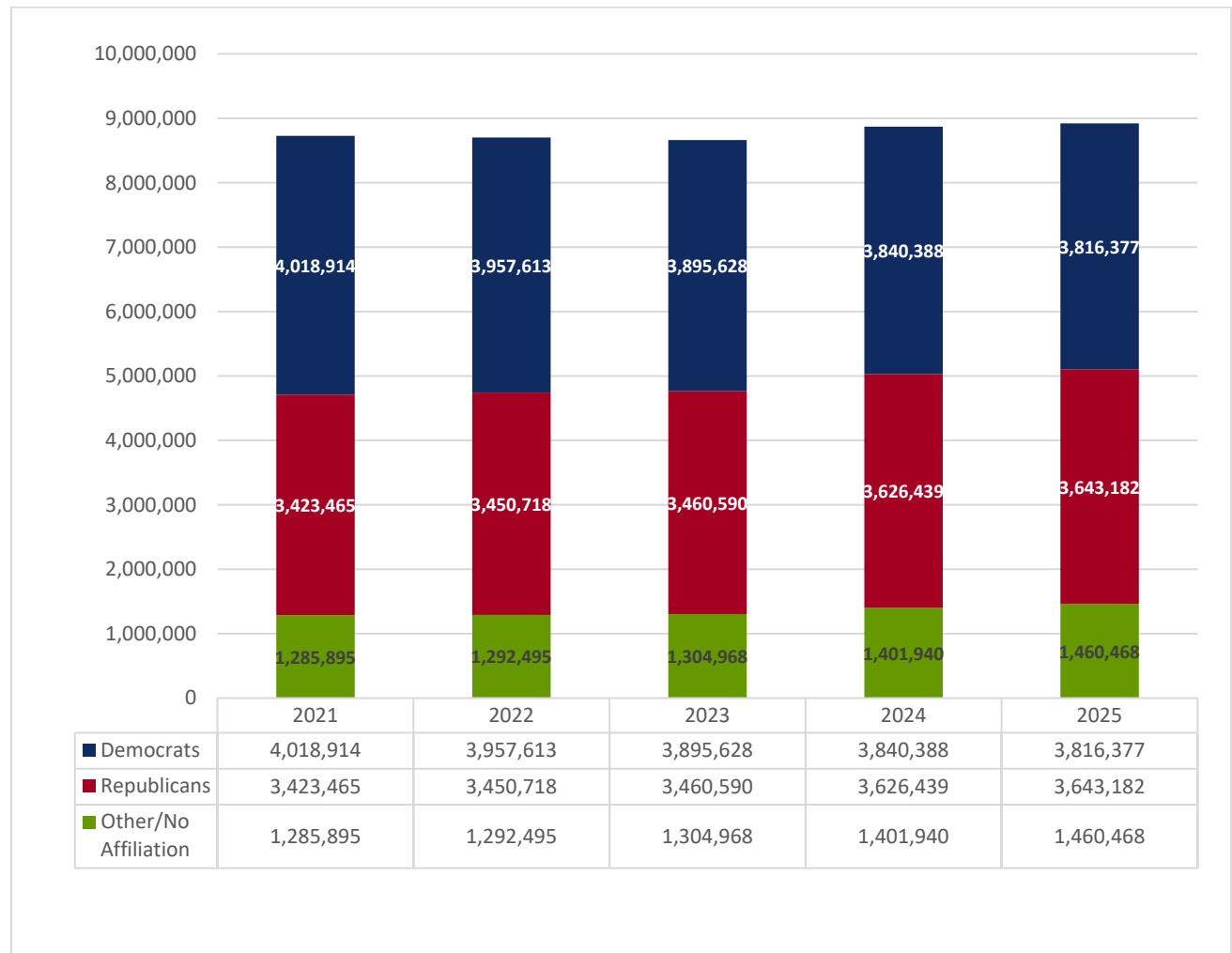


Figure 2: Total Voter Registration by Party Since 2021

The chart below (Figure 2) displays registrants by party affiliation each year from 2021 to 2025.

Areas of Growth and Decline

This section shows the voter registration growth and decline as compared to the previous year and over a four-year period. The charts are done in two parts: 1) growth and decline in registration for this year as compared to the previous year, and 2) growth and decline in registration over the period between the end of 2021 and the end of 2025. For each

section, the charts list counties within each category with the largest rate of growth or decline when compared to either last year's totals or totals from 2021. The tables show the growth or decline for all 67 counties.

Largest Overall Registration Growth and Largest Overall Decline Since 2024

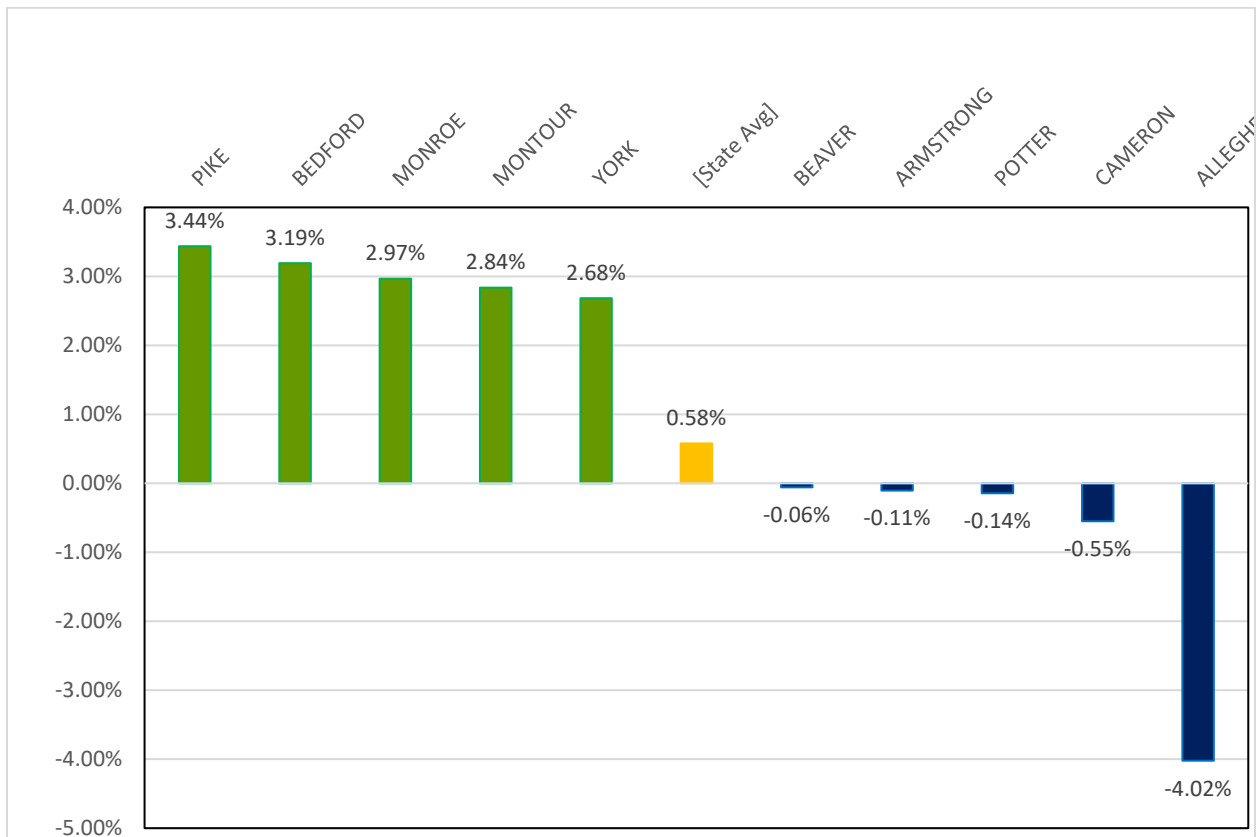


Figure 3: Counties With Largest Overall Registration Growth and Largest Overall Decline Since Last Year

The chart below (Figure 3) shows the five counties with the largest overall registration growth and the five counties with the largest decline since last year.

Largest Overall Registration Growth and Largest Overall Decline Since 2021

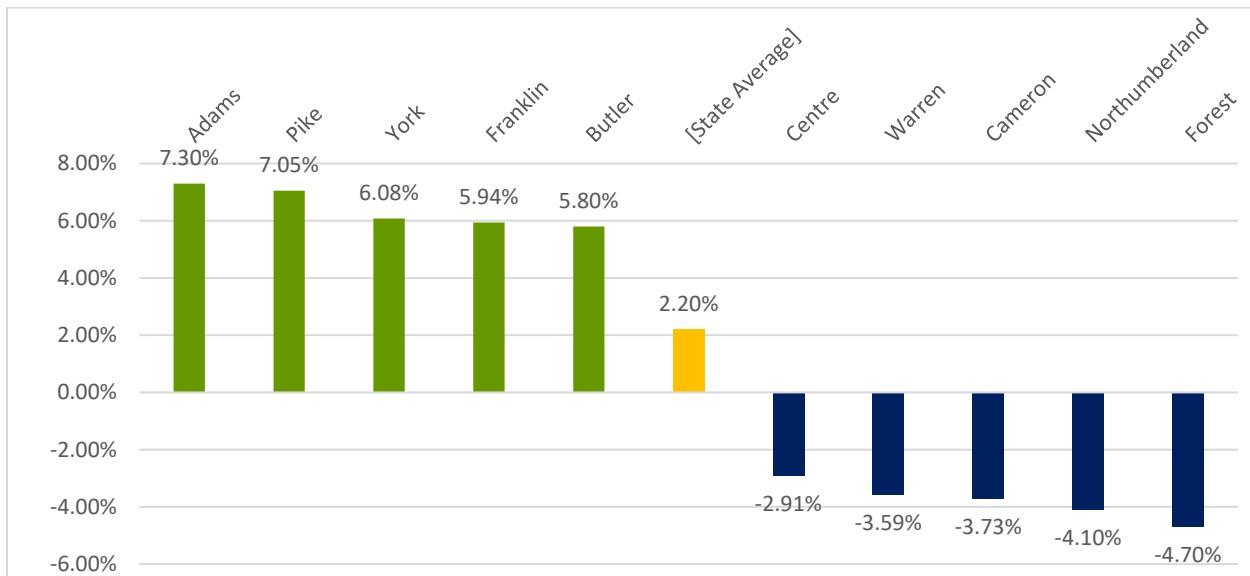


Figure 4: Counties With Largest Overall Registration Growth and Largest Overall Decline Since 2021

List Maintenance

This section summarizes voter list maintenance activities conducted during the 2025 calendar year. Generally, the practice of “list maintenance” encompasses the different methods that county election and voter registration officials use to manage voter registration rolls and ensure they are accurate. Both state and county election officials follow careful and appropriate steps, in compliance with federal and state laws, to determine whether a voter should be transferred to a new address, marked as *Inactive*, or removed from the registration rolls.

List Maintenance Mailings

During 2025, counties sent approximately 437,599 notices to voters: 59,802 Five-Year Notices; 119,057 National Change of Address (NCOA) Notices; 6,497 Duplicate Notices; 42,038 In-State Update Notices; 27,331 Out-of-State Update Notices; and 182,874 Address Verification Notices (AVNs).

When reviewing list maintenance activity summaries below, please note that voter responses to most notices generally fall into six broad categories:

- **Non-Response:** The voter did not respond to the mailed notice.
- **Returned Undeliverable:** The postal service was unable to deliver the notice by mail, and the notice was returned as undeliverable to the county voter registration commission.
- **Returned Confirmation:** The voter responded to the notice and confirmed their eligibility at their address of registration.
- **Voter Moved Within County:** The voter responded to the notice and confirmed they moved to a new address within the same county.
- **Voter Moved Out of County:** The voter responded to the notice and confirmed they no longer reside in the county but live elsewhere in Pennsylvania.
- **Voter Moved Out of State:** The voter responded to the notice and confirmed that they moved outside of Pennsylvania.

Figures in this section are representative only of actions taken on or before December 31, 2025, as recorded by counties in the SURE system. If additional responses to notices were received after that date, they will not be represented in the below point-in-time data.

2025 Five-Year Notice Responses ¹

The Five-Year Notice (FYN) is a statutorily required, one-step mailing process. It is sent via forwardable mail. The purpose of this notice is to contact voters who have not had any activity on their record and have not voted within the past five years. Upon generation of this notice, the voter's record remains on the rolls but is updated to *Inactive* status for a statutorily defined period. If the voter does not take any action with respect to their record or does not vote before the passage of this period, the voter's record is cancelled in SURE. The FYN provides an opportunity for the voter to respond, which results in activity that allows the county to reinstate the registrant to *Active* status. Upon a return to *Active* status, the voter record is no longer on track to be cancelled.

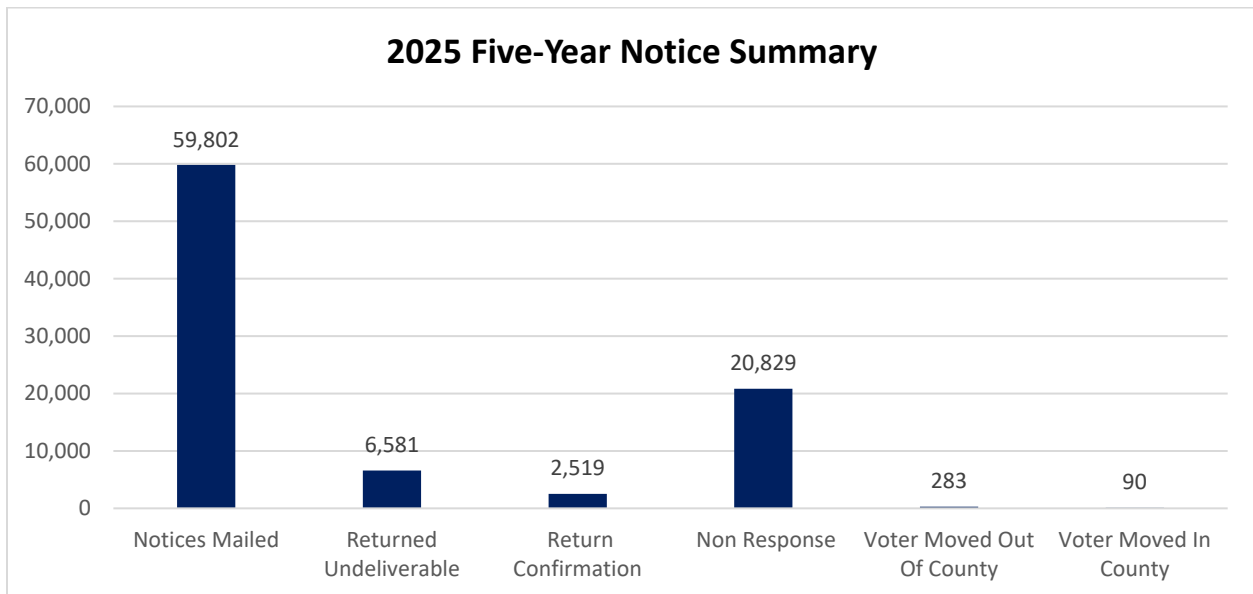


Figure 5: 2025 Five-Year Notice Summary

Overall, approximately 3,590 voters who were mailed FYNs voted, re-registered, or took some action reinstating them to *Active* status after the notice was mailed out. Appendix D1 represents the activity recorded by counties on Five-Year Notice mailings.

2025 NCOA Notice Summary²

The NCOA Notice is a statutorily required two-step mailing process. The notices in each step of the process are sent via forwardable mail to the address of registration. The first mailing, based on data received from the U.S. Postal Service (USPS) through its National Change of Address Program, is a notice which requires the voter to specify whether they have moved. Then, depending on their response, county officials update their records accordingly. These notices provide an opportunity for the voter to confirm their address or provide an update with their updated information to county officials.

Following the initial NCOA Notice mailing, county officials send a second notice to voters who did not respond to the first mailing, or where the initial NCOA notice was returned as undeliverable. This second notice is commonly referred to as the Address Verification Notice (AVN). With the mailing of the AVN, the record is marked *Inactive*, triggering a waiting period before the voter record can be removed from the registration rolls. The period lasts until two federal general elections have passed. If the voter takes an action to update their record or votes within the waiting period, the voter record is returned to *Active* status, and the voter record is no longer scheduled for cancellation. But if, for example, a voter was marked as *Inactive* in 2025 during list maintenance activities, and they do not make any changes on their record or vote, the voter would be removed after the 2028 general election. Appendix D2 represents the activity recorded by counties on NCOA mailings.

² The SURE system allows counties to queue an Address Verification Notice (AVN) for mailing even if the county has not marked the NCOA record as a non-response. Thus, the figures for the results of NCOA Notice mailings presented in this section (and in Appendix D2) may not reconcile with the total number of NCOA Notices mailed. 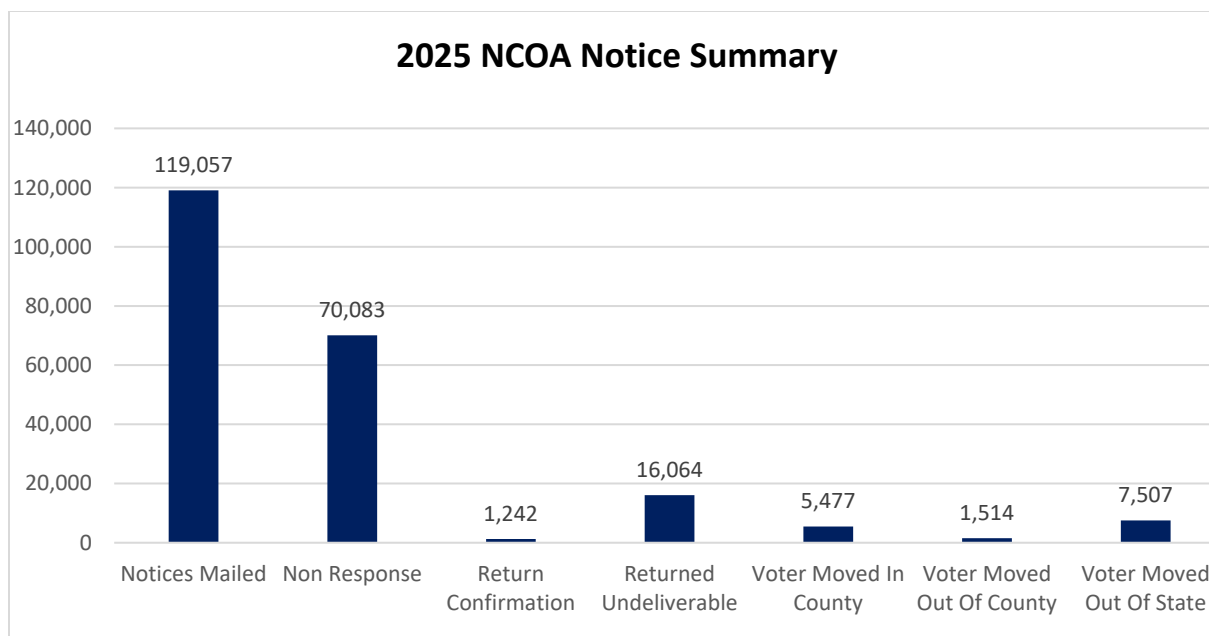


Figure 6: 2025 NCOA Notice Summary

2025 ERIC Duplicate Notices³

As part of the Department's membership in the Electronic Registration Information Center (ERIC), it receives and distributes data on potential duplicate voter records to county officials. Because ERIC is a consortium of member states, and because there is no national voter registration database, ERIC is in a unique position to compare, without access to personally identifiable information, the verified data provided by member states to locate records of voters who may be potentially registered in more than one state. It also provides a report on voters who may be registered in more than one Pennsylvania county.

These pairs of voter records are identified for further review by county officials, who determine whether the same person is potentially registered in more than one jurisdiction.

³ Because generating an ERIC Duplicate Notice inactivates the voter, it is not necessary for county officials to record non-responses. Thus, the figures for the results of the ERIC Duplicate Notice mailings presented in this section (and in Appendix D3) may not reconcile with the total number of ERIC Duplicate Notices mailed.

If the county identifies the registrant as potentially duplicated in another jurisdiction, a notice is sent to the voter's address on record.

During the 2025 calendar year, Pennsylvania counties mailed 6,497 notices of potential duplication.

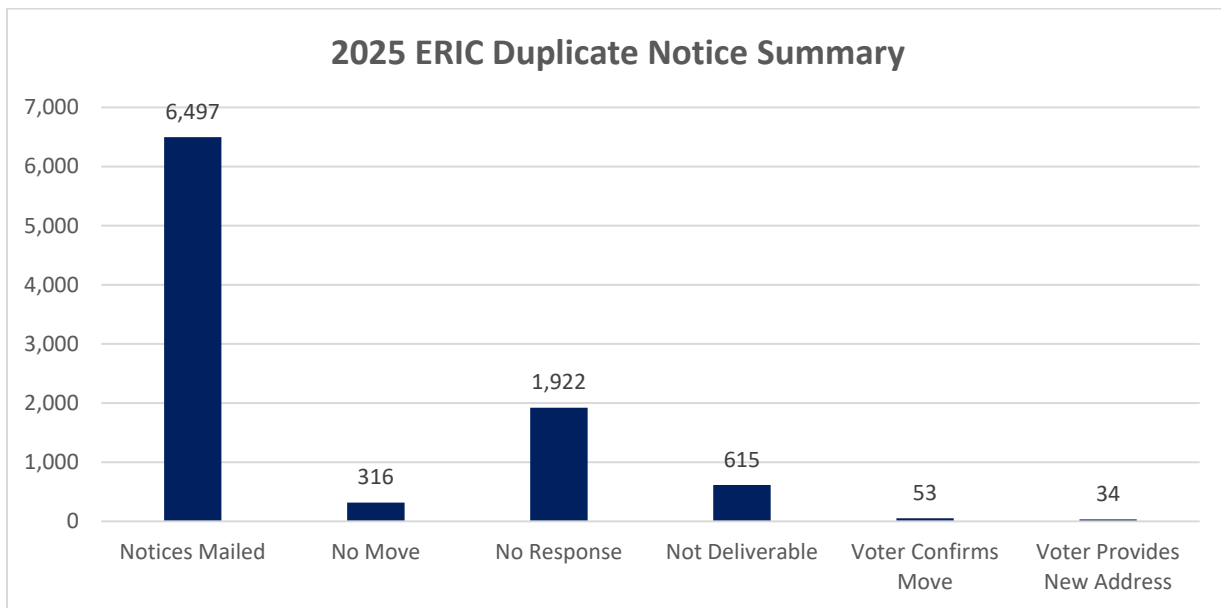


Figure 7: 2025 ERIC Duplicate Notice Summary

The chart below (Figure 7) represents a summary of the mailing responses. Appendix D3 represents the activity recorded by counties on ERIC Duplicate Notice mailings. After review, county officials update the voter's record to reflect the voter's response (or lack thereof) to the notice.

2025 ERIC In-State Moves

In addition to comparing voter registration information, ERIC provides a report with data comparing voter registration information with PennDOT information to identify voters who may have moved without updating their voter registration. This report is also provided to counties.

The process for determining whether this new information accurately reflects a voter's current status involves a one-step mailing procedure. Once the notice is queued and confirmed, the affected voter records are updated to *Inactive* status. Depending on the response – or nonresponse – to the mailer, the voter's record may be updated to *Active*,

remain in *Inactive* status, or be *Cancelled*. During 2025, approximately 42,038 notices were mailed to voters. Appendix D4 represents the activity recorded by counties on ERIC In-State Move mailings.

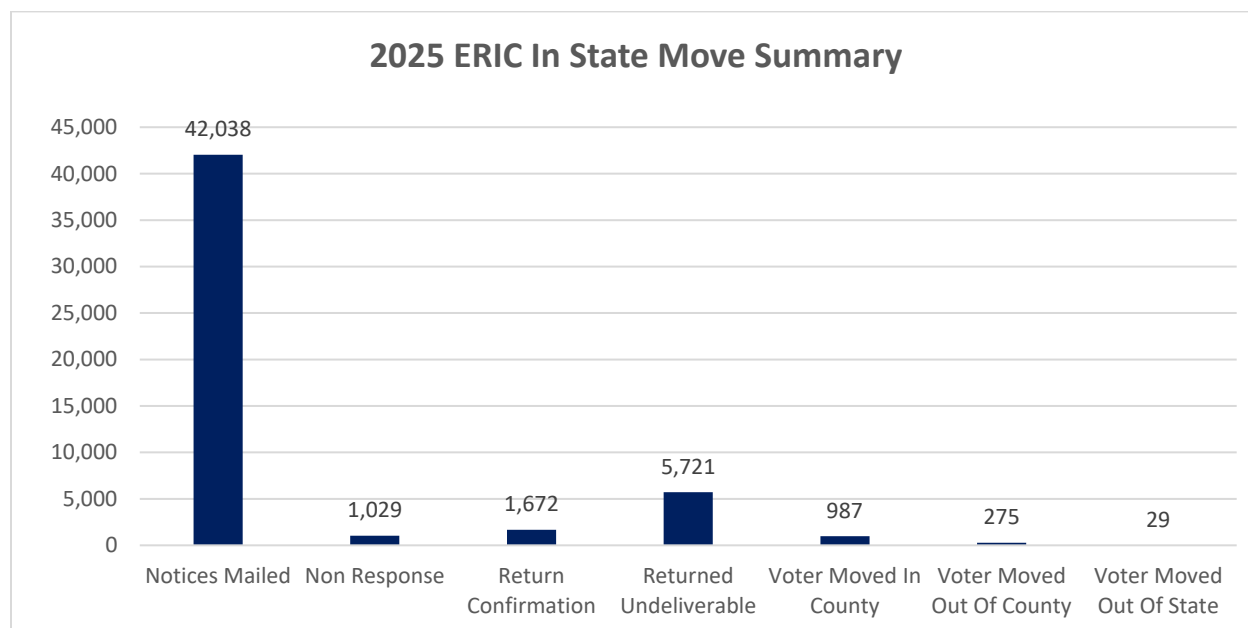


Figure 8: 2025 ERIC In-State Move Summary

2025 ERIC Out-of-State Moves

The data for potential out-of-state updates or moves are provided by ERIC. This process captures information where a voter within Pennsylvania appears to match another record from out of state that contains newer information. This may be an indication that the voter no longer resides in the Commonwealth. Therefore, any identified registrants are sent a notice to confirm their move or affirm their status as a Pennsylvania voter.

This process involves a single mailing from the county election office. Once the notice is prepared for sending, the affected voter records are updated to *Inactive* status. Depending on the response to the mailer or non-response, the voter's record may be updated to *Active*, remain in *Inactive* status, or be *Cancelled*. During 2025, approximately 27,331 notices were mailed to voters. Appendix D5 represents the activity recorded by counties in the SURE system on ERIC Out-of-State Move mailings.

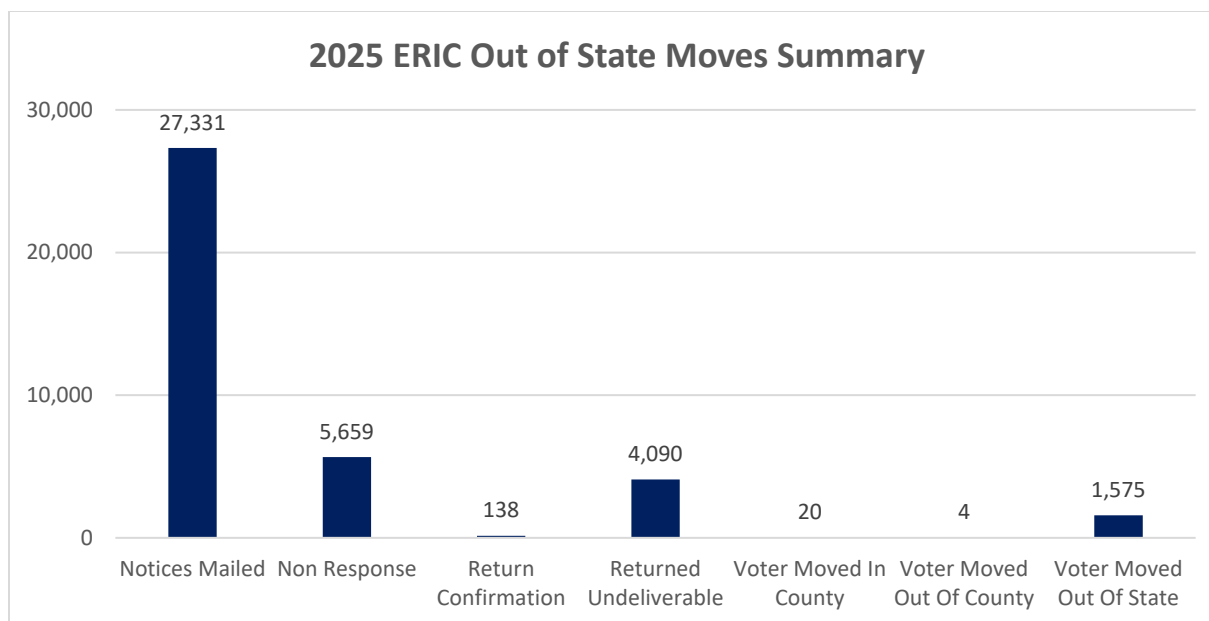


Figure 9: 2025 ERIC Out-of-State Moves Summary

2025 Address Verification Notices (AVNs)⁴

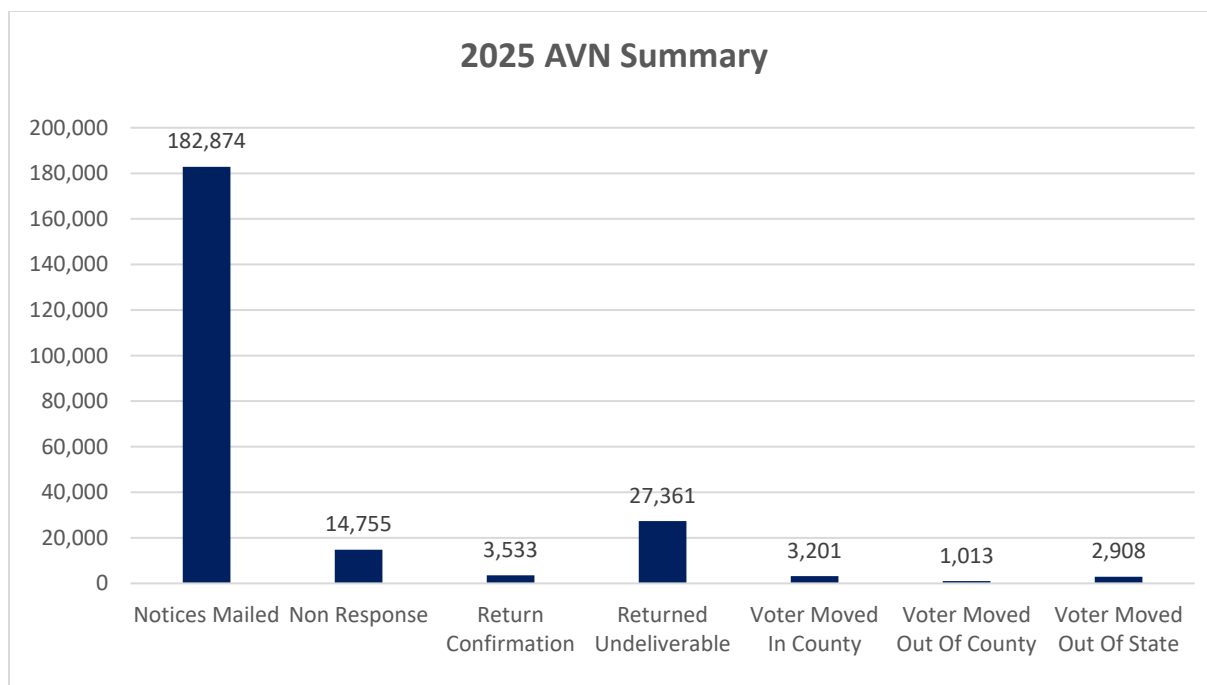


Figure 10: 2025 AVN Summary

An additional list maintenance tool is the AVN, which is used in multiple circumstances to determine if a voter is still eligible to vote at their documented address. In addition to the activities described above with respect to voters who have potentially moved, counties send AVNs to *Inactive* voters when an initial contact attempt is returned as undeliverable. For example, if the USPS returns a voter identification card to the county because it was undeliverable to the address associated with the registrant, an AVN may be sent to the voter. In 2025, county officials mailed approximately 182,874 AVNs to voters. The chart below (Figure 10) summarizes the responses received by county officials as of December 31, 2025. Appendix D6 represents the activity recorded by counties on AVN mailings.

PennDOT Change of Address Summary

In addition to registering to vote through more traditional means such as paper or online voter registration, the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 (NVRA) requires states to incorporate voter registration opportunities into the driver's license application process at state motor vehicle authorities. As part of that process, voters have an opportunity to update their voter registration with their latest information to ensure the voter registration rolls are accurate.

During the 2025 calendar year, approximately 492,142 voter address change applications were processed by county officials. Appendix D7 represents the activity recorded by counties in the SURE system on PennDOT change of address transactions.

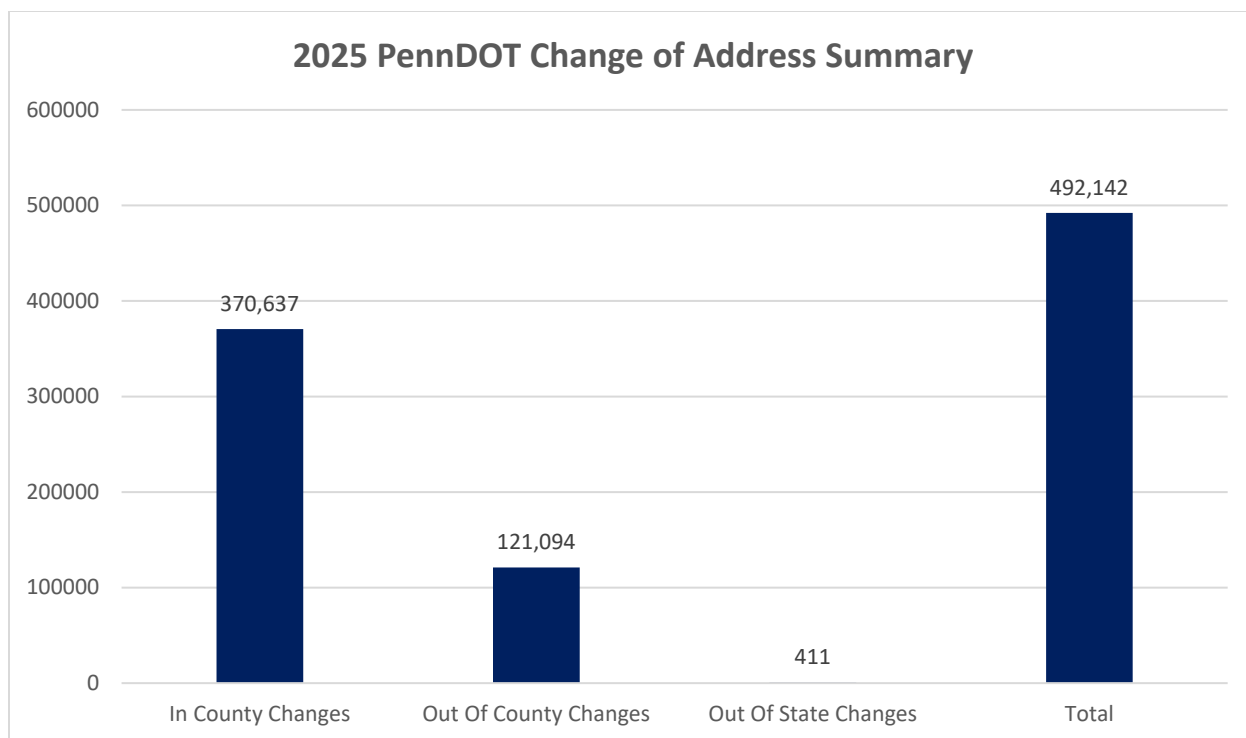


Figure 15: 2025 PennDOT Change of Address Summary

Voter Registration Cancellations

During 2025, the SURE system recorded approximately 338,295 voter registration cancellations. When a voter registration is cancelled, the record is tagged in the SURE system to identify the reason for cancellation. The record of an *Active* voter may be cancelled if, for example, the voter confirms they have moved out of state.

The records of *Inactive* voters, including those marked *Inactive* following the list maintenance activities described above, must be cancelled, under federal law, if the voters have failed to vote in two consecutive general (even-numbered year) elections. Table 3 represents the total number of cancellations by reason for the state. Figures in this section are representative of actions taken on or before December 31, 2025, as recorded by the counties in the SURE system. See Appendix D for details broken out by county.

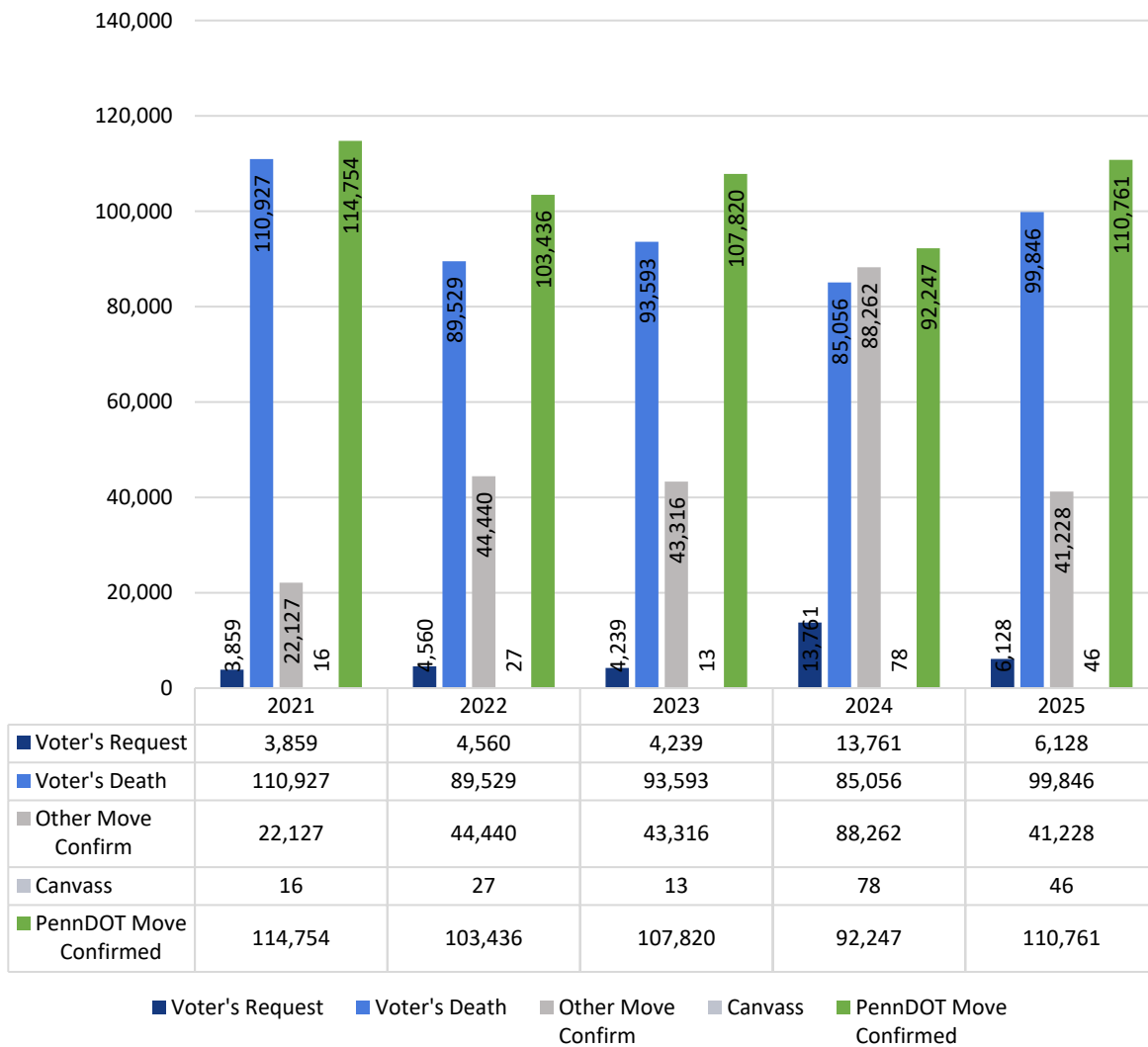


Figure 12: Common Active Voter Registration Cancellations

Common Inactive Voter Registration Cancellations by Status and Year

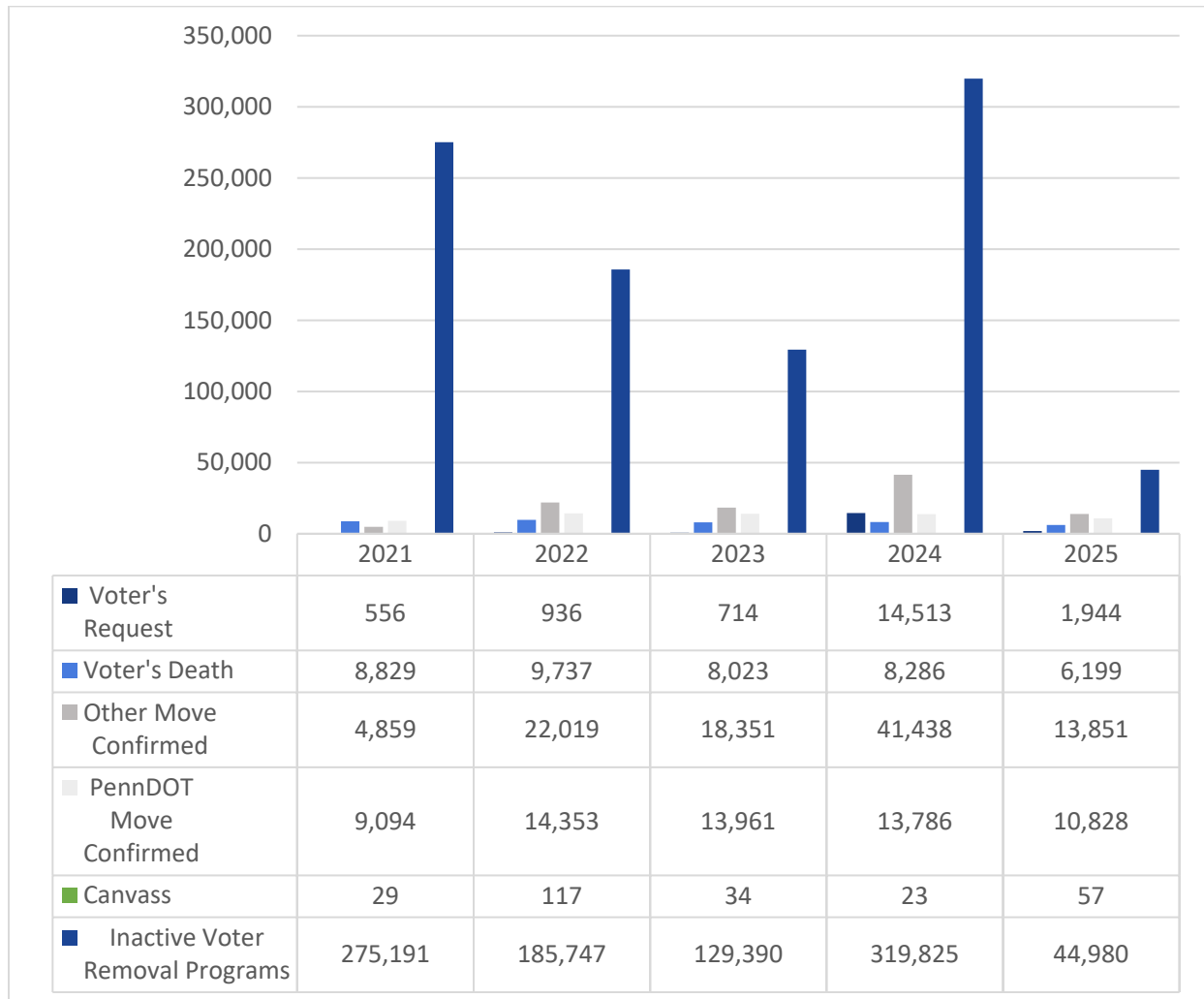


Figure 13: Common Inactive Voter Registration Cancellations

National Voter Registration Act (NVRA)

NVRA Agency Registrations

The National Voter Registration Act (NVRA) requires, *inter alia*, that:

“(1) Each state shall designate agencies for the registration of voters in election for Federal offices.

“(2) Each state shall designate as voter registration agencies –

(A) all offices in the state that provide public assistance; and (B) all offices in the state that provide state-funded programs primarily engaged in providing service to persons with disabilities.” 52 U.S.C. § 20506.

Pennsylvania, through its voter registration law, has incorporated these requirements for all elections. See 25 Pa.C.S. § 1325.

Accordingly, the Department continues to work with the covered agencies to ensure that the requirements of federal and state law are met.

The Department also works with PennDOT regularly to ensure that eligible citizens can register to vote or update their voter registration when they use PennDOT services.

PennDOT

Since 1995, PennDOT has played an integral role in voter registration through what is commonly known as the “Motor Voter” registration process. In 2003, the process became electronic. Motor Voter provides Commonwealth citizens with an opportunity to apply to register to vote while receiving or renewing their driver’s license or photo ID at a PennDOT center, as well as the opportunity to update their registration at a PennDOT center or during a PennDOT transaction online.

PennDOT voter registration applications are organized into two primary groups: 1) initial applications to register to vote (otherwise known as new applications); and 2) Change of Address applications to update the registrant’s address on an existing record (otherwise known as change applications).

Automatic Voter Registration at a PennDOT Center

PennDOT customers visit a photo license center with a driver's license application card provided by PennDOT. The application card contains a printed two-dimensional bar code. The bar code is scanned, and the computer system determines the customer's age and U.S. citizenship status. It determines if the customer will be at least 18 years old by the date of the next election, has a verified Pennsylvania residential address, and is a U.S. citizen. If the PennDOT customer meets all these requirements, they are presented with Motor Voter screens.

The Motor Voter screen then again asks the customer to confirm that they are a U.S. citizen. If they affirm that they are, the next screen asks them to confirm that they will be at least 18 years old by date of the next election and that they meet Pennsylvania's residency requirement. It also informs the customer that unless they opt out, they will be shown a series of screens to confirm their information and submit a voter registration application to their county elections office.

- Customers must confirm that they are U.S. citizens and qualified to register to vote in the Commonwealth.
- Customers are asked to confirm their county of residence and indicate a party preference. The customer is then offered the opportunity to submit optional information (telephone number and race).
- Customers are advised of the penalty for furnishing false information and are asked to sign a declaration that the information they have provided is true and correct to the best of their knowledge.
- At the end of the AVR process, customers are provided with a receipt indicating pertinent information about their voter registration application, including the date on which they applied at the photo license center. The receipt instructs customers to contact their county voter registration office if they do not receive a voter identification card within two weeks.

Completed applications are transmitted electronically to the Department which, in turn, forwards them to individual county voter registration offices via the SURE system. For more details on applications received from PennDOT license centers, see Appendix E.

The process described above reflects the changes implemented on September 19, 2023. Previously, eligible registrants had to choose to opt into the process. As of September 19, 2023, enhancements require customers to opt out. They also made the process more

inclusive and user-friendly, including through the addition of more than a dozen languages, bringing the total number of available languages to 31.

A total of 469,001 AVR applications were submitted through PennDOT in 2025, compared to PennDOT's pre-AVR submissions of 185,015 voter registration applications in 2021. A total of 133,656 new registrations were processed and approved by county elections offices, and 203,840 voter record updates were processed in 2025. Out of the new voter registration applications processed, 42,983 were Democratic, 39,520 were Republican, and 51,153 belonged to other parties or registered with no affiliation.

NVRA Agencies

Since 2010, the Department has used computer-compatible voter registration forms with its partner agencies, which allow the Department to identify the source agency of registrations. The Department is thus able to track its efforts and ensure that partnership efforts comply with the requirements of the NVRA and the Pennsylvania voter registration law.

On December 2, 2017, the Pennsylvania Department of Human Services (DHS) became the first Commonwealth agency to publicly deploy an online voter registration service with the Department. Through this online service, DHS clients submitted more than 14,900 applications in 2025. The Department of State also worked with the Department of Labor & Industry's (L&I) Office of Vocational Rehabilitation and the Department of Health's (DOH) Women, Infants and Children (WIC) program to deploy online services. In 2025, the Department worked with Pennsylvania Health Insurance Exchange Authority ("Pennie") to integrate voter registration screens in their application process for eligible citizens residing in Pennsylvania. The Department continues to look for other opportunities to modernize voter registration with state agencies. Table 4 (below) shows voter registration applications processed by counties from NVRA agencies. Appendix C2 shows the voter registration applications processed from each agency by county.

Online Voter Registration

The Pennsylvania Online Voter Registration (OVR) application was deployed August 27, 2015. The OVR application provides residents of Pennsylvania with the opportunity to register to vote or change an existing voter registration online and to electronically submit voter registration data to their county voter registration office for processing.

During the 2025 calendar year, approximately 163,233 voter registration applications were submitted through the OVR application on the Department's website, including 47,961 applications for new voters.

Web Application Programming Interface

A Web Application Programming Interface (Web API) was created for individuals and organizations that wish to develop a website to gather voter registration application data during voter registration drives. The Web API application works as an analog to third-party submission of paper voter registration forms and requires the registrant to input the information necessary for the county to process the application. As is the case with paper registration submissions, entities that submit electronic applications through the Web API do not have direct access to the SURE system. This tool also interacts with PennDOT to capture signatures from valid driver's licenses and, if necessary, sends a correspondence when the signature cannot be located.

The Department manages a rigorous certification process to ensure that individuals and organizations wishing to use the Web API tool meet Department-identified testing and security standards prior to being approved for access to the Web API. The Department also revised its guidance on voter registration drives in September 2025 to ensure that organizations are utilizing best practices.

During the 2025 calendar year, approximately 50,252 voter registration applications were submitted through the Web API, including 37,428 applications for new voters.

Comparison of Voter Registration Methods

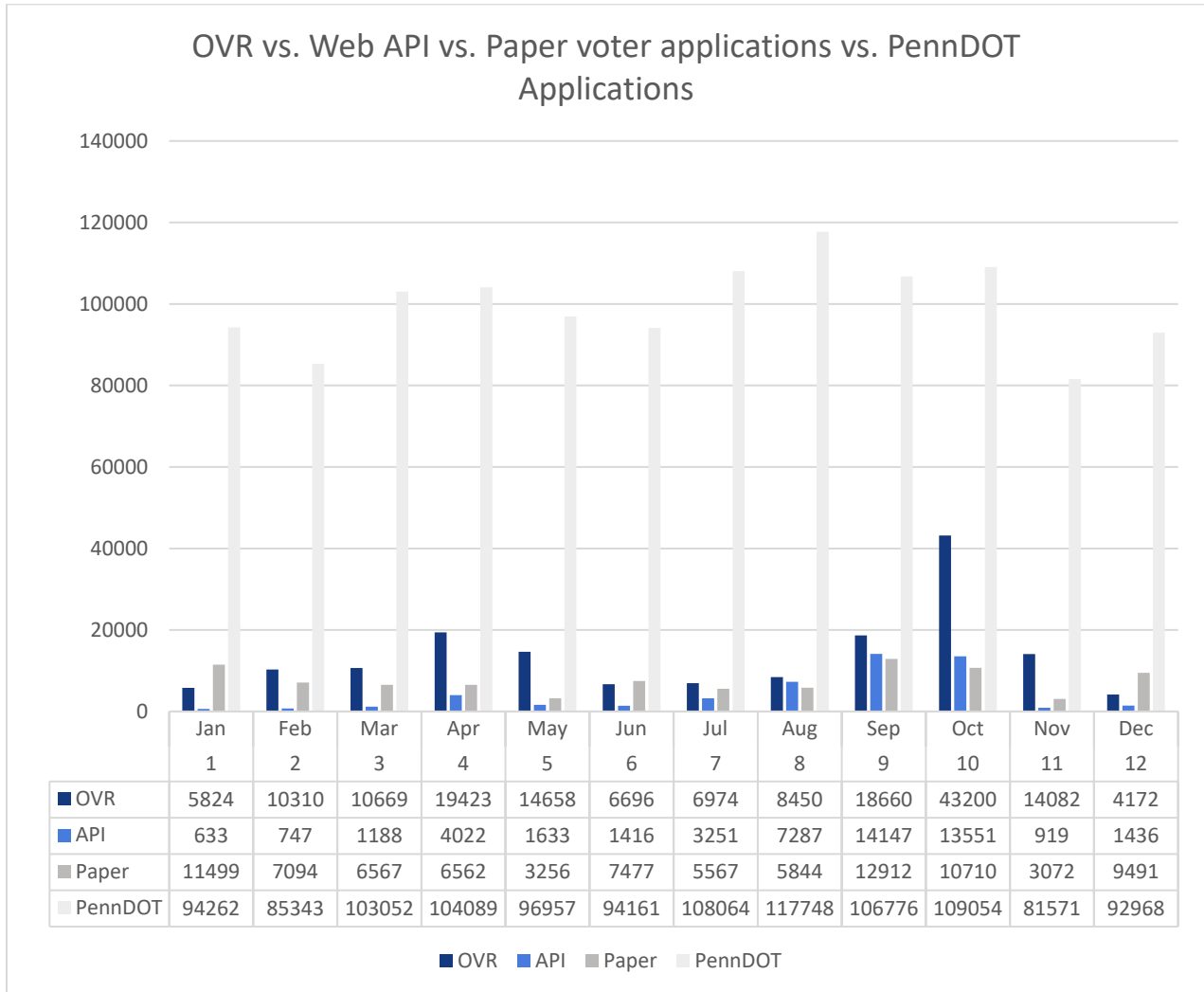


Figure 15: OVR vs. Web API vs. Paper vs. PennDOT Applications in 2025

The chart below (Figure 15) depicts a general comparison of total applications submitted through OVR, Web API, and paper forms. In addition to method of registration, these statistics are also broken down by month to highlight volume throughout the election cycle.

These numbers will not reconcile with the total OVR registrations processed in the voter registration system because they do not represent the final disposition of the applications submitted via OVR; rather, this chart reflects the total number of applications submitted. Numbers may diverge, for example, where a registrant submits duplicate applications that are declined after processing.

Demographics of Online Voter Registration

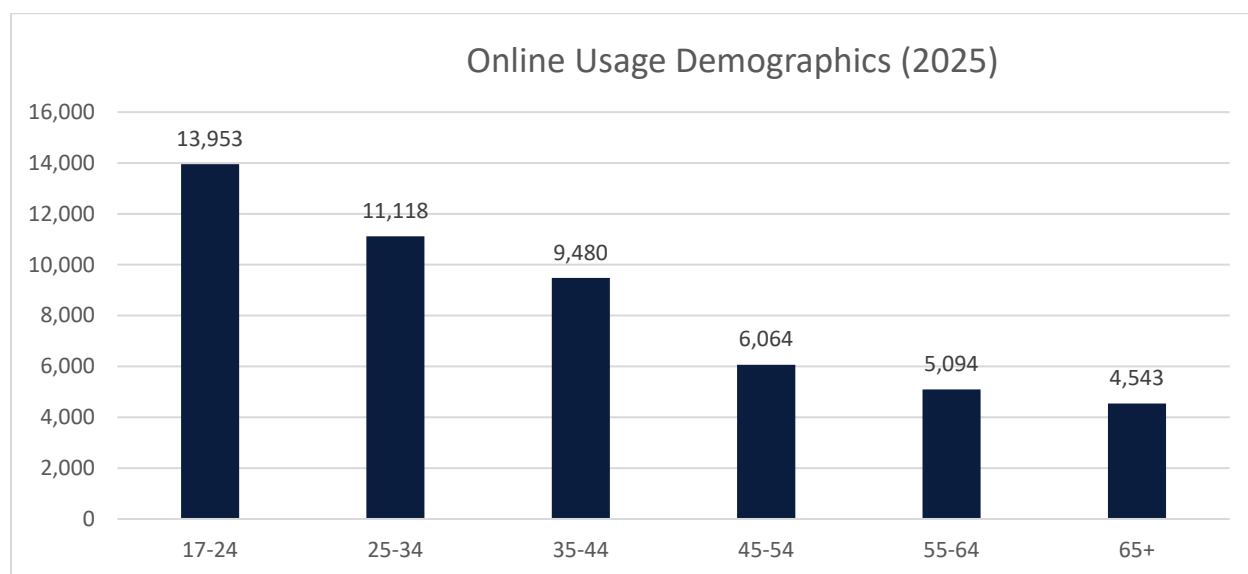


Figure 16: Demographics of OVR/Web API Use

Voter Hall of Fame

The Pennsylvania Voter Hall of Fame program is administered by the Department of State's Bureau of Elections. The program was established to promote awareness of voting and to encourage all eligible Pennsylvanians to exercise their right to vote. The Voter Hall of Fame publicly honors Pennsylvanians who have voted in at least 50 consecutive November elections. The inductees serve as ambassadors in their communities – leading by example and encouraging participation in the electoral process. In 2025, the Department inducted 627 citizens from 10 counties into the Voter Hall of Fame.

Conclusion

The administration of voter registration in the Commonwealth relies on a collaborative approach between the Department of State and Pennsylvania's 67 counties. By providing resources and sharing expertise, the Department works with county election officials to promote the secure, efficient, and inclusive composition of voter rolls. Well-maintained voter rolls lead to well-conducted elections.

This report reflects the hard work of the Department and its county partners to expand voter registration opportunities and to ensure the accuracy of Pennsylvania's voter rolls. At the same time, this report details the ways in which the Department hopes to improve on these advances by working with its state and local partners to maintain a voter registration system that accurately and completely reflects the eligible voters of this Commonwealth.
