Purple Star School Designation Information

Purple Star Schools is a program that supports military-connected children as they relocate to new schools due to a parent's change in duty station. This designation is given to Local Education Agencies (LEAs) and Private/Non-public schools for their commitment to serving active-duty military families and students. If your LEA or school is interested in applying for this designation and serving military families and military connected students, email RA-EDMILITARYFAMK12@pa.gov to request an application.

Join Us for Remake Learning Days Across PA from May 1-23, 2025!

Celebrating its 10th anniversary in 2025, Remake Learning Days (RLD) is a global learning festival that brings families, kids, community leaders, and educators together to share the benefits of collaborative, hands-on learning. Founded in 2016 in Pittsburgh, PA by Remake Learning, this celebration highlights transformative experiences and opportunities for youth to develop their sense of creativity, perseverance, curiosity, and fun alongside others. Between May 1-23, the festival features 750+ FREE hands-on learning events designed for kids of all ages. Across Pennsylvania, events will be hosted at libraries, schools, tech centers, parks, museums, play spaces, community centers and more. Youth and families can choose from a variety of activities such as recording podcasts, programming robots, creating art, exploring the outdoors and more. Explore the events calendar now to find an event that works for you.

Through seven festivals hosted across the Commonwealth, RLD collaborates on several <u>statewide</u> <u>initiatives</u> including the Career Ready PA Backpack Challenge, providing K-12 learners an opportunity to earn artifacts for their career portfolios, as well as state agency events through the PA Department of Education, PA Department of Agriculture, PA Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, Labor and Industry, PA Council on the Arts, Office of Commonwealth Libraries, Career and Technical Education, Game Commission, PA FFA Foundation, PA STEM Lab, and more.

Parents and youth can participate as <u>Ambassadors</u>, and schools can partner virtually with other schools in the STEM design challenge, <u>discoverED</u>. As part of the PAsmart initiative, RLD helps provide a touchpoint and deeper experiences centered on employability skills, STEM hands-on learning, and career readiness, as well as provides equitable access for all youth and families to free and live events across the Commonwealth.

Open Your Eyes to Litter in a Watershed: Revisions to the activity book, Open Your Eyes to Litter in a Watershed, are complete! Designed for kids in grades 2-4, the book focuses on how illegal dumping and littering affects watersheds. The book includes vocabulary, activities, journal prompts and fun activities that reinforce the concept of a watershed and how litter impacts the people and animals who live there. Litter Free School Zone: Schools in Pennsylvania can keep their school grounds litter free with Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful's Litter Free School Zone Program. Responsibilities include planning two litter sweeps per school year and can include supporting activities like creating and caring for pollinator and rain gardens. Flexible Instructional Days (FID) Survey Now Available

As per Section 1506 of the Public School Code, the Department of Education is required to issue an annual survey on the efficacy of flexible instructional days (FID) to each public school entity with an accepted application for the 2024-25 school year.

A SurveyMonkey link will be sent to the Superintendent/CEOs/Directors of all those public school entities by no later than April 30, 2025. The survey must be submitted by **June 30, 2025**, *regardless of whether an FID was implemented during the 2024-25 school year*. Please check your spam or junk mail folder because some email security settings will direct SurveyMonkey surveys to these folders or in some cases, a setting can be assigned to opt-out of surveys, preventing you from submitting this required survey.
