## College Application "Last Call for Fall" To Be Held July 10

The Pennsylvania College Application Campaign's "Last Call for Fall", sponsored by the Pennsylvania Department of Education, will take place this July at community colleges across the state. As part of the American College Application Campaign (ACAC) initiative, this program seeks to increase the number of first-time college applicants--especially first-generation college students, students from low-income families, and students who may not otherwise consider college.

"Last Call for Fall" offers a last-chance opportunity for graduating seniors and community members, to apply to college while financial aid is still available for this fall. Students planning to attend community colleges must submit their FAFSA by August 1 to be eligible for Pennsylvania State Grant funding.

## School Bus Safety Grants Now Available

The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) announced that \$1.2 million is available in a new grant program to help increase school bus safety. These funds are made available through the newly established School Bus Safety Grant Program.

Grants from the program can be used to promote and increase school bus safety, education, and training, as well as pay for education, training, and other associated costs related to an individual earning their commercial learner's permit, commercial driver's license, or school bus endorsement for the purpose of driving a school bus in Pennsylvania.

Independent school bus contractors, school entities, and municipalities are eligible to apply for grants from the program. Eligible organizations can apply online at [grants.pa.gov](https://grants.pa.gov) beginning June 2 through midnight on **July 3, 2025**.
