As we settle into the 2025–2026 school year, I'm excited to share a few moments and milestones the Department has been celebrating and tell you about some of the work ahead.

- Over the past month, the Department joined in supporting [Library Card Sign-Up Month](#), which served as a reminder that our libraries are not just repositories of books, but vibrant community hubs, discovery centers, and safe spaces for learners of all ages.
- September was also Better Breakfast Month, which culminated in the [Governor's School Breakfast Challenge celebration](#). Through this initiative, championed by the Shapiro Administration, we are working to guarantee that all 1.7 million students in Pennsylvania have access to a free, nutritious breakfast each morning.

- I'm especially proud to share that in September we also recognized the inaugural class of 2025 Pennsylvania Blue Ribbon Schools, honoring 13 schools across the Commonwealth for exemplary performance and closing achievement gaps. This recognition reflects the hard work of the entire school community and shines a light on the environments where learners are challenged, supported, and inspired to succeed.
- This October, we look forward to continuing our support for nationally observed themes like National School Bus Safety Week (Oct. 20–24). Last month, [I visited Rohrer Bus in Duncannon](#) to thank drivers for the critical daily work they do and to underscore the importance of safety and awareness when driving near buses and in school zones.
- We also look forward to joining schools in marking Digital Citizenship Week (Oct. 20–24), a time for educators to continue helping students build the knowledge and skills needed to use digital devices safely, ethically, and effectively. In today's world, this work is essential in teaching learners to think critically, engage responsibly, and develop social and emotional skills that extend into the digital sphere.
- Finally, during U.S. Media Literacy Week (Oct. 27–31), the Department will highlight the importance of critical thinking, responsible media consumption, and informed participation in civic life. As part of this work, we encourage educators to explore the Department's Information and Media Literacy Toolkit, which provides classroom-ready resources to strengthen students' ability to analyze and question the media they encounter. The toolkit is set up to support critical thinking and to enable learners to be more effective and responsible consumers and creators of information.

Thank you for all you do to uplift learners across Pennsylvania. I hope the new school year has energized you with fresh ideas and renewed purpose. The Department is here to support you, celebrate your successes, and partner with you in making this a year of strong outcomes for every student.

- [**Federal Depository Library Program: Constitution Day**](#): Offers lesson ideas, educational materials, and guides to help educators teach about the Constitution.
- [**Library of Congress Classroom Materials**](#): Features classroom-ready materials and professional development to help teachers effectively use primary sources from the Library's vast digital collections.
- [**National Archives: America's Founding Documents**](#): Provides access to original founding documents, including the Constitution, with background information and teaching resources.
- [**National Constitution Center: Constitution Day Resources**](#): Offers lesson plans, activities, and interactive resources for students of all grade levels.
- [**POWER Library**](#): Provides primary sources and educational materials, including resources like *Introduction to U.S. History: The American Revolution*, available statewide for Pennsylvania schools and libraries.

PennDOT Announces Annual Innovations Challenge

The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) announced its ninth annual [Innovations Challenge](#), which encourages students to use their problem-solving, creative and strategic-thinking abilities to solve real-world transportation challenges in a competition among their peers. The Innovations Challenge is open to all students in grades 9-12, regardless of their school's learning model.

For this year's challenge, students are asked to develop a concept for the use of artificial intelligence (AI) in work zones to dramatically improve safety for work crews and road users. The concept must outline how PennDOT can use smarter systems to prevent crashes and protect those who are working to build a better Pennsylvania. The concept should also take into consideration cost-benefit information, statewide deployment implications, as well as public outreach.
