Item SD-1: Does the infant toddler or preschool Early Intervention program have a system in place to monitor the effective and efficient provision of services on the IFSP/IEP?

Infant Toddler and Preschool El Criteria

There is evidence, related to the provision of IFSP/IEP services, that the infant toddler or preschool Early Intervention program is effective through:

- Strategies for oversight and monitoring of the delivery of services as designated on the IFSP/IEP,
- Strategies for ensuring regular communication with families about their child's participation in Early Intervention, i.e., communication logs go home daily/weekly, documentation logs of contact with families; notes/reports that document the conversation with families, etc.,
- Procedures for informing the family of community activities, resources, advocacy services, local support groups and family networks,
- Processes for reviewing documentation of service delivery (i.e., session notes, attendance records) to ensure that documentation meets all requirements,
- Processes for reviewing service coordination notes to ensure that documentation meets all requirements (Infant/Toddler Only),
- The use of PELICAN and other local data to review, evaluate and revise strategies and processes on an ongoing basis, and
- Strategies to ensure that activities focused on the provision of services on the IFSP/IEP occur in a fiscally responsible manner.

 - o a strategy for an existing child/family outcome/goal,
 - a separate goal specific to the service coordination service,
 - o in the child/family information section of the IFSP and/or
 - o in the progress monitoring section of the outcome/goals
- a service coordination note has been completed after any meeting or other contact with, or on behalf of, an infant/toddler and their family/caregiver.
- service coordination note documentation is:
 - o written in a professional, accurate, unbiased, and objective manner and written so that others can understand what is being documented.

Item SD-6: Does the infant toddler or preschool Early Intervention program meet requirements for documenting the delivery of Early Intervention services?

Infant Toddler El Criteria

There is evidence that documentation of service delivery meets the following criteria:

- Completed by an Early Intervention professional, when services are delivered to a child in a professional, accurate and unbiased manner without acronyms or jargon,
- Provided to the family/caregiver at the end of the session if a home-based session or provided to the family/caregiver within a reasonable timeframe if a family member is not immediately available at the end of the session,
- Offers suggestions for the family or professionals to complete between sessions,
- Written legibly so that the family and other team members can understand what is being documented, and
- Indicates when the next visit is scheduled.

Preschool El Criteria

There is evidence that documentation of service delivery meets the following criteria:

- Completed by an Early Intervention professional, in a professional, accurate and unbiased manner with no acronyms or jargon when services are delivered to a child,
- For classroom teachers
 - provided documentation of the delivery of service (i.e., attendance sheets), - only in specialized settings
- For Itinerant staff supporting ECE, home, Head Start
 - provided documentation of the individual session of the child, (i.e., MA log),
- Offers suggestions for the family or professionals to complete between sessions, and

Directions for Finding Evidence

During the Verification, review the records of 5% of children using a *standard record sample*. At least 10 records should be reviewed at minimum but no more than 30 records. Look for documentation that the documentation of service delivery met criteria or documentation can be found in sample materials, communication logs that are sent home to families (may not be in the child record). Review information for the last full quarter regardless of the date of the IFSP/IEP.

There is evidence of the following:

- Progress monitoring information was used to determine:
 - Any lack of expected progress toward the outcomes/goals, and
 - Whether it was necessary to modify or revise the expected results, outcomes/goals, instruction/teaching strategies or Early Intervention services as identified on the IFSP/IEP as needed to maintain or increase rate of attainment or skill level.
- the status of the child's progress on each outcome/goal using the following criteria:
 - We still need to work toward this outcome/goal. Let's continue with what we have been doing,
 - We still need to work toward this outcome/goal. Let's discuss new ways to get there,
 - Our situation has changed; we no longer need to work on this outcome/goal,
 - We are satisfied that we have finished this outcome/goal and have dated when the outcome/goal was met,
 - o Other.
- Data was presented to the family in a written report in a manner that is understandable to the family/caregivers and describes progress in specific, functional terms.

- All appropriate restraints are reported to the Bureau of Early Intervention Services (BEIS),
- Restraints or intrusive strategies are used only in cases of danger to child or others,
- Parental consent is obtained prior to the use of restraints or intrusive procedures,
- An IEP team meeting is held within 10 program days (based on preschool Early Intervention calendar) to create or revise behavior goals or plan if restraints are used, and
- When restraints are used, the program reports usage to their BEIS Advisor within 24 hours.
