children and youth experiencing homelessness in Pennsylvania
July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025

87% of identified children and youth were enrolled in school

13% of identified children and youth were ages 0-5 not yet enrolled in kindergarten

18% of identified children and youth were unaccompanied



Enrolled children and youth experiencing homelessness made up approximately 2.7% of PA's public school population

ECYEH Snapshot

27% of children and youth identified as having a disability

14% of children and youth identified as being an English Learner

5% of children and youth identified as being migrant

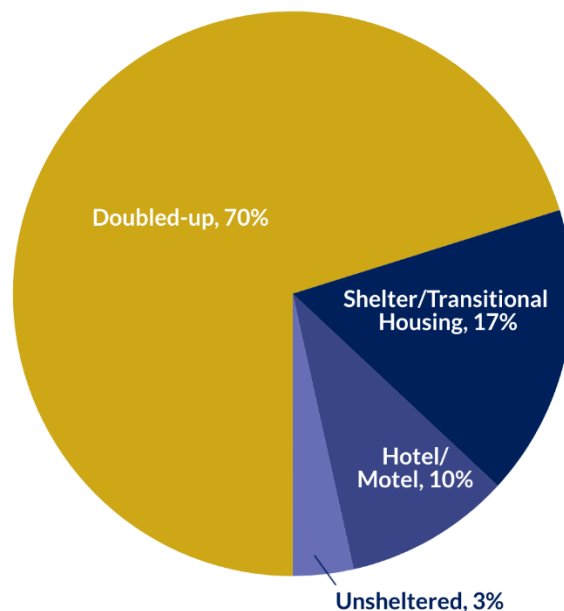
25% of enrolled students experienced barriers to school enrollment, attendance, or academic success

79% of enrolled students remained in their school of origin

72% Grade 12 Graduation rate

ECYEH Program Outcomes and Impact

50% of students enrolled in school for 10+ days had a 90% attendance rate

3% of students in Grades 7-12 dropped out of school

22% of students assessed scored proficient or advanced levels on state literacy assessments in 2024

14% of students assessed scored proficient or advanced levels on state math assessments in 2024

649 LEAs, shelters, pre-K programs, and agencies received direct ECYEH services

90% of identified children and youth received services at the individual level
