
## Pennsylvania Migrant Education Program (PA-MEP)

### Meeting A Growing Need

PA-MEP student enrollment **grew 35%** over three years — from 5,268 to 7,098



On average, **90% of eligible children and youth** received services each year

### Supporting the Most Vulnerable



On average, **one in three students** experienced homelessness



**50%** had a **Priority for Service** designation



PA-MEP students were **more than twice as likely to drop out** then the total student population

### Observing Steady Growth



Increasing percentages of students in grades 3-8 scored at the **proficient or advanced levels** on state reading and math assessments



On average, **90% of Grade 12 students** have **graduated** over the past three years



The number of students who have earned or were pursuing their high school equivalency diploma has **doubled** over the past three years



Kindergarten readiness has shown modest but steady growth over the past three years with an average of 46% demonstrating readiness

### Preparing Future Leaders

On average, **128 students** attended **youth development (CAMP)** programs each year



PA-MEP students represent **over 15 languages** - bringing **unique perspectives** to PA's classrooms
