To Whom It May Concern:

The Penn-Delco School District hereby provides notice to the Pennsylvania Department of Education of a planned furlough action as a result of a programmatic change/curtailment of program. The School District previously offered a very dated Library Science/Media Literacy course in grades 6-8 at Northley Middle School. In response to community interest and student needs, the district is increasing its STEM course and program offerings and moving away from a less relevant program of studies that includes Library Science.

This alteration of an existing educational program/course necessitates the furlough of a teacher who possesses no other professional certification that could be accommodated through an internal transfer. This limited furlough will result in the furlough of one (1) Penn-Delco employee of the 281 professional teaching staff currently employed. The district made a best faith effort to find another teaching position, but the affected individual has never elected to pursue additional certification. The Penn-Delco School District intends to initiate its new *Project Lead the Way* Courses at the Middle School for the 2021-2022 School Year.

Copies of relevant Board Actions indicating Board Support via unanimous approval for the proposed changes are attached.

The presiding officer at each public board meeting will follow these guidelines:

- Public participation shall be permitted only as indicated on the order of business in the procedures of this board, or at the discretion of the presiding officer on a given issue.
- Participants must be recognized by the presiding officer and must preface their comments by an announcement of their name, address, and group affiliation, if appropriate.
- All statements shall be directed to the presiding officer; no participant may address or question board members individually.

- The public participation in the beginning of the agenda will be limited to 15 minutes total and to three (3) minutes per person, on agenda topics only.
- **The public participation at the end of the agenda will be limited to 30 minutes total and to three (3) minutes per person.**

The presiding officer may interrupt or terminate a participant's statement when the statement is too lengthy, personally directed, abusive, obscene, or irrelevant.

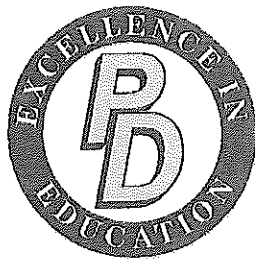


WHEREAS, the aforementioned programmatic change will make it necessary to decrease the number of employees within the District;


