



Environmental Inspection Report

D. THREATENED AND ENDANGERED SPECIES

Pennsylvania Natural Diversity Inventory (PNDI) reviews are required for all TGC Pond Owner Environmental Inspection Reports. A PNDI Project Environmental Review Receipt must be included with the Environmental Inspection Report.

As part of the Environmental Inspection, the inspector/consultant shall include documentation showing that he or she completed an online PNDI Environmental Review (or submitted a "Large Project" review request) and resolved any endangered and threatened species conflicts with the required agencies before submitting the Environmental Inspection Report to the PFBC and notified the applicable agency(ies) regarding potential impacts to special concern species or resources as directed on the PNDI receipt.

Where potential impacts are identified, the Receipt will provide appropriate jurisdictional agency contact information to facilitate further review and coordination. The PNDI Receipt lists a specific agency contact as well as the types of information that the jurisdictional agency will request to further research the area and resolve any issues. A clearance or recommendation letter from the jurisdictional agency/ies indicated on the Potential Impact Receipt is required as proof that the applicant consulted with the jurisdictional agency/ies regarding the potential impacts to threatened or endangered species. The clearance or recommendation letters must be submitted along with the PNDI Receipt to the PFBC with the Inspection Report.
