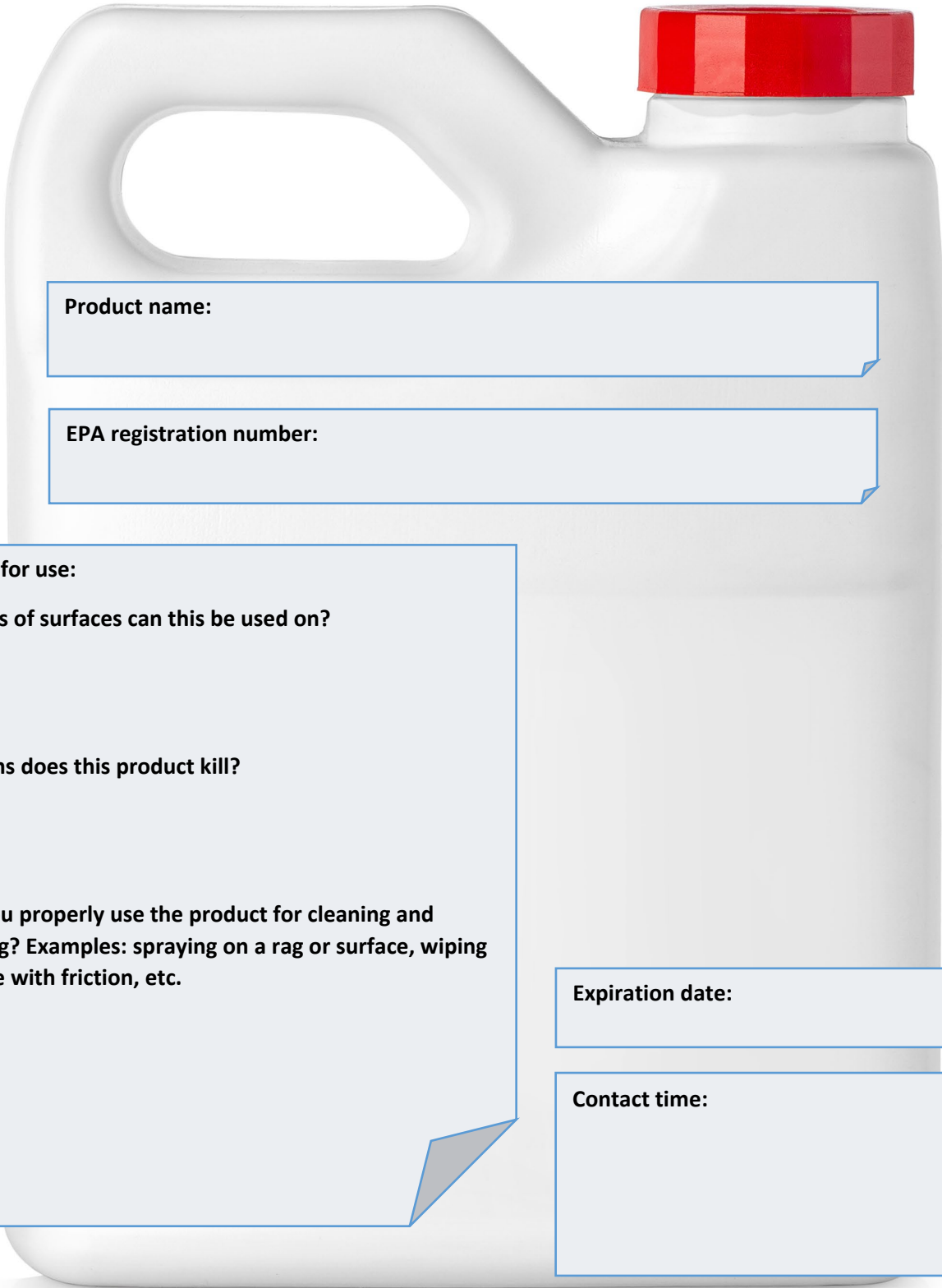
Examine an Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)-registered disinfectant in use at your facility to complete this activity.
