

# Ryan White Part B Program

The Department receives an annual grant from the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) for the oversight of Core Services and Support Services.

## WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

To be eligible for Ryan White Part B Services in PA, you must:

- ✓ Be a resident of Pennsylvania;
- ✓ Be within the income guidelines (Most individuals are eligible under these limits)
- ✓ Have a diagnosis of HIV

- Other home-related services

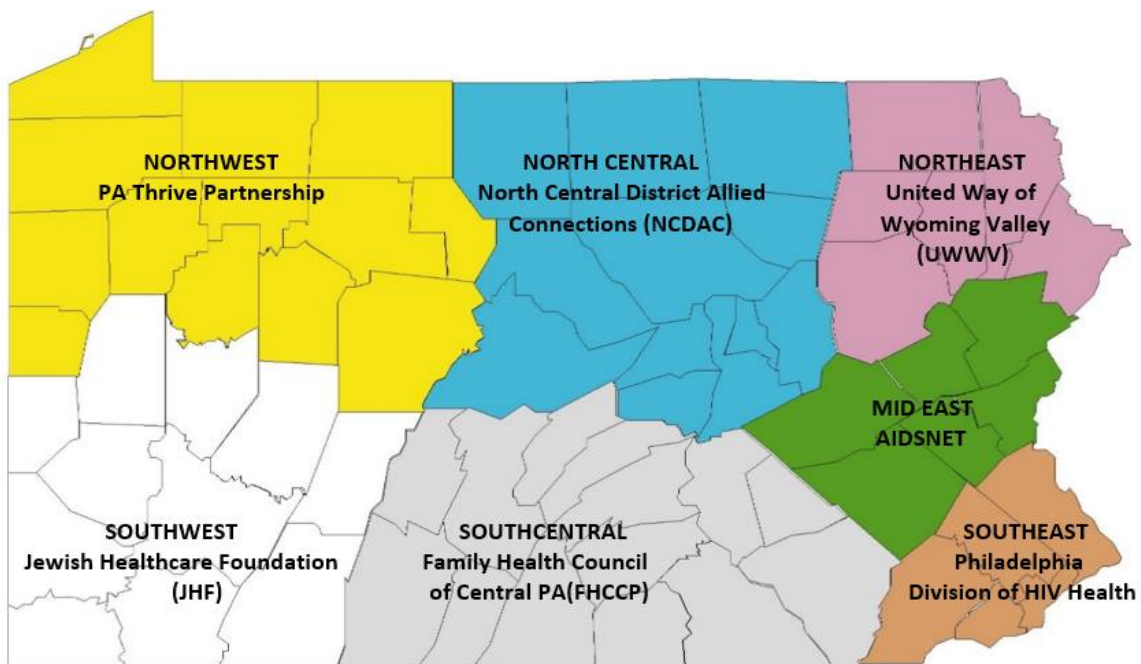

## SPECIAL PHARMACEUTICAL BENEFITS PROGRAM (SPBP)

The SPBP falls under the Care section and provides pharmaceutical assistance, and in certain cases, specific lab services and Medicare Part C and D premium payments to low-to-moderate income individuals with a diagnosis of HIV who are underinsured or uninsured and are not eligible for pharmacy services under the Medical Assistance (MA) Program.
