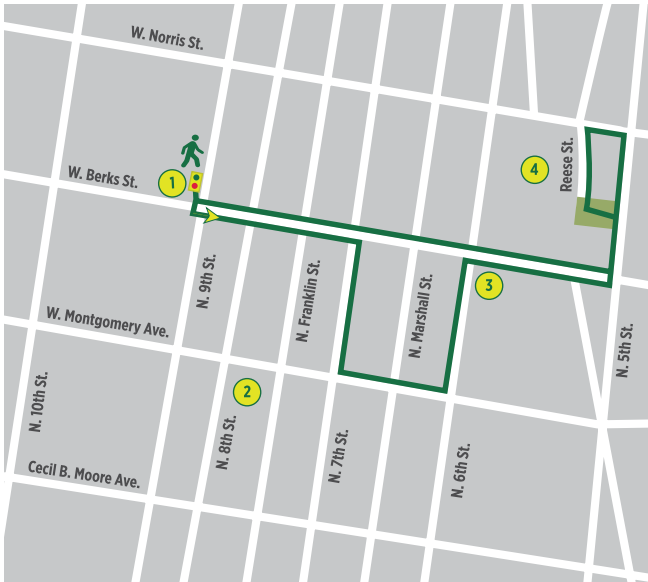


Paseo Verde Loop Route

Paseo Verde

Paseo Verde is one of the first mixed-use, mixed income transit oriented development (TOD) projects in Philadelphia. It earned the first Platinum-rated Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Neighborhood Development in the western hemisphere. The building is notable for demonstrating that green sustainable design can be affordable and create a healthy foundation for an inviting community. In addition to apartments, this building includes commercial space, a health center, a local pharmacy and a social service office operated by Asociacion Puertorriquenos en Marcha (APM).

R.W. Brown Community Center

Also known as “The R,” this community center provides an array of youth and family focused programming. Inside, one can find a competition-sized swimming pool, full-size gymnasium, stage, computer center and various classrooms providing lessons ranging from arts and crafts and music to Microsoft office and internet safety.

Indego Bike Station

The City of Philadelphia launched Indego public bike share in 2015. This location is one of hundreds of self-service stations found throughout the city. Indego bikes are available year round, 24/7. Bikes may be borrowed and returned to any station!

Borinquen Plaza

This commercial plaza contains Cousin’s Supermarket, TruMark Financial Credit Union, a laundry facility and an outdoor stage. Borinquen Plaza is one of the only supermarket development projects by a non-profit and was built in 2009 to address both the food desert and financial desert in the area. Cousin’s Supermarket is now a center of ethnic food and culture for the community, providing quality groceries, fresh produce and halal meats.
