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Foreword

The Juvenile Court Judges' Commission (JCJC) is pleased to present the eighth edition of its Juvenile Court Annual Report. Prior to the publication of the 2017 report, Pennsylvania juvenile court statistics were presented in a yearly series entitled Pennsylvania Juvenile Court Dispositions. The series, which ran from 1972 to 2016, focused primarily on juvenile court dispositions.

Each year, the Juvenile Court Annual Report undergoes a series of enhancements to better capture and quantify the work of juvenile justice professionals across Pennsylvania. In 2021, a new chapter was introduced to highlight longitudinal trends and youth outcomes. In 2022, the report expanded to include metrics related to school-based delinquency allegations, allegations involving weapons, and Youth Level of Service/Case Management Inventory $^{\text{M}}$ (YLS) risk levels and criminogenic needs. A key case processing metric, the time from written allegation to disposition, was also added. Finally, in 2023, statistics related to hearings, diversion from adjudication, and delinquency placements were incorporated.

This year, we are pleased to announce the addition of another set of new metrics, all featured in Chapter 2 of this report. Section 2 introduces a new case processing measure: the length of time from receipt of the written allegation to the first hearing on the case (when a hearing occurs). This metric joins two existing case processing metrics that have historically been in the report: total length of time from first hearing to disposition and total length of time from allegation to disposition. These case processing metrics are intended to help jurisdictions evaluate the time it takes for cases to progress through key decision points.

Section 5 presents two new metrics related to the movement of youth into and out of residential placement. Page 52 displays the placement population on the first day of every month in 2024. This page also displays the number of youth released from placement each month. These data points aim to support system stakeholders in understanding placement trends, evaluating the use of out-of-home care, and identifying opportunities for strengthening community-based alternatives.

The presentation of the data in this report is intended to help summarize various juvenile court trends within the Commonwealth and therefore includes written narrative, as well as charts and graphs. The data within this year's report are generally organized in a manner that reflects the chronological processing of juvenile court delinquency cases, from allegation through disposition. Some of the data are organized and presented by county class to help readers make comparisons across counties of similar size and demographic composition. Aggregated data for each of Pennsylvania's 67 counties for certain data points are available within the appendices.

The JCJC would like to extend its deepest appreciation to the juvenile courts and juvenile probation departments across the Commonwealth. Without their support, this report would not be possible. It is with great pleasure that we dedicate this report to the judges, juvenile probation officers, victim advocates, district attorneys, defenders, service providers, and other professionals who work on a daily basis in the Pennsylvania juvenile court system.




Chapter 1- Incoming Cases

Section 1: Delinquency Allegations

- 1. The unit of count for this section is a written allegation. A written allegation is the document submitted by a law enforcement officer or other person to allege a youth has committed an act of delinquency. Multiple allegations may result in a single disposition. Allegations are synonymous with the term "case" in the Pennsylvania Juvenile Case Management System (PaJCMS).
- 2. Written allegations in this section were filed with a juvenile probation department between January 1, 2024, and December 31, 2024.
- 3. In Pennsylvania, juvenile court jurisdiction extends over individuals who have been alleged to have committed a delinquent act, as defined by 42 Pa.C.S. § 6301 *et seq.*, on or after their 10th birthday and prior to reaching 18 years of age. Juvenile court supervision can extend until the individual is 21 years of age if the individual is currently under supervision. Age, for purposes of this section, was calculated from the youth's date of birth to the date of the offense in the written allegation.
- 4. Data for this report were compiled from PaJCMS on March 27, 2025. Any delinquency allegations received by a juvenile probation department in 2024, and entered into PaJCMS after this date, will not be included in these statistics. The numbers published in this report, therefore, may not reflect current numbers within the system.
- 5. Finally, the reader should be cautioned that, beginning in 2020, figures were likely impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Figures dropped significantly in 2020 and 2021 before returning close to pre-pandemic levels in 2022.




2024 Delinquency Allegations




* The Number Of Delinquency Allegations Received By Juvenile Probation Departments Has Returned To Pre-Pandemic Levels

There were 20,875 delinquency-related allegations in Pennsylvania in 2024. This total represents a 7.2% decrease from 2023 and a 38.9% increase from 2020. After allegations significantly decreased during the COVID-19 pandemic, allegations generally returned to pre-pandemic levels beginning in 2022.

Almost one-third (32.9%) of the total allegations received in 2024 occurred in five counties (see map on page 4). These jurisdictions are: Allegheny, Dauphin, Delaware, Philadelphia, and York.

Between 2020 and 2024, the rate of juvenile delinquency allegations as a percentage of the Pennsylvania juvenile population aged 10-17 increased by 20.0%, from 1.0% to 1.2%.* Please refer to Appendix 3 for juvenile population figures.



Delinquency Allegations and Juvenile Totals, 2024

In 2024, 16,348 juveniles accounted for 20,875 delinquency allegations in Pennsylvania. This equates to an average of 1.28 delinquency allegations per juvenile. County-level rates of delinquency allegations per juvenile in 2024 ranged from 1.0 to 1.65 (see Appendix 3).

Delinquency Allegations and Juvenile Totals, 2024






Delinquency Allegations by Gender, 2024

Juvenile delinquency allegations in Pennsylvania primarily involve males. In 2024, almost three in four (72.3%) delinquency allegations submitted to juvenile probation departments involved males, while a little over one in four (27.7%) involved females.

Delinquency Allegations by Race and Ethnicity, 2024


In 2024, White Non-Hispanic youth represented the largest racial/ethnic category for all delinquency allegations.

However, in comparison to the racial/ethnic distribution of all juveniles in Pennsylvania aged 10-17, the representation of Black Non-Hispanic youth is disproportionate: 11.9% of the total population versus 38.3% of all delinquency allegations.*

When excluding Philadelphia County and Allegheny County, Black Non-Hispanic youth represent 6.8% of the juvenile population, but 30.5% of all delinquency allegations. See Appendix 4 for the number of delinquency allegations by race and ethnicity for each county.

Delinquency Allegations by Race and Ethnicity, 2024












Delinquency Allegations by Age at Offense, 2024

Less Than 1 In 10 Delinquency Allegations Were For Youth Under The Age Of 13

Sixteen-year-olds accounted for 22.3% of all juvenile delinquency allegations in 2024, representing the most allegations for any age group. Juveniles aged 17 accounted for 21.9% of all juvenile delinquency allegations, while 15-year-olds accounted for 20.2% of all juvenile delinquency allegations. Less than 10% of all delinquency allegations were for youth under the age of 13.



Delinquency Allegations by Offense Type, 2020-2024

All Offense Types Increased Over The Past Five Years, But Person Offenses Increased At The Greatest Rate

The following information was compiled based on the most serious alleged offense for each juvenile delinquency allegation received in Pennsylvania between 2020 and 2024. That is, only one offense per delinquency allegation is counted in the figures below. These alleged offenses are broken into four offense categories: Person, Property, Drug, and "Other."

Between 2020 and 2024, the number of allegations received for Person Offenses increased at the highest rate (50.5%), followed by "Other" (50.1%), Property (29.4%), and Drug (7.7%).



Note: The "Other" Offenses category includes but is not limited to: Public Order Offenses such as Disorderly Conduct or Weapon on School Property, Firearms Offenses, and Certifications from the minor judiciary that a juvenile failed to comply with a lawful sentence imposed for a summary offense.




Delinquency Allegations by Most Serious Alleged Offense Grade, 2024

Most Delinquency Allegations Are For Non-Felony Offenses

These alleged offenses are grouped according to the following charge grades: Felony, Misdemeanor, and Ungraded/Summary.

More than two-thirds (67.9%) of delinquency allegations received in 2024 were for non-felony offenses. Misdemeanors accounted for slightly more than half (51.7%) of all delinquency allegations, while felonies accounted for 32.1% of all delinquency allegations.


Delinquency Allegations by Most Serious Alleged Offense Grade, 2024




School-Related Delinquency Allegations, 2024

There were 5,478 delinquency allegations received in 2024 with a most serious alleged offense identified as school-related, which is 26.2% of all delinquency allegations.




School-Related Delinquency Allegations by Gender, 2024

& Girls Account For A Disproportionate Share Of School-Based Delinquency Allegations

Females comprised a higher proportion of school-related juvenile delinquency allegations than all juvenile delinquency allegations received in Pennsylvania in 2024. As noted on page 8, in 2024, 27.7% of all juvenile delinquency allegations involved females. However, 34.3% of school-related allegations involved females.


School-Related Delinquency Allegations by Gender, 2024

School-Related Delinquency Allegations Involving Weapon, 2024







One In Ten Delinguency Allegations Involved A Weapon

There were 2,148 delinquency allegations received in 2024 with a most serious alleged offense that involved a weapon, which is 10.3% of all delinquency allegations.




Delinquency Allegations Involving a Weapon by Type, 2024

Firearms Were The Most Commonly Reported Weapon


Among the 10.3% of delinquency allegations received in 2024 with a weapon involved in conjunction with the most serious alleged offense, firearms were the most frequently used weapon, utilized in a little more than half (52.1%) of incidents.




Youth Level of Service/Case Management Inventory™ (YLS) Assessments, 2024

The Top Criminogenic Need Of Youth Entering The Juvenile Justice System In 2024 Was Education/Employment

The use of the Youth Level of Service (YLS) is the cornerstone of Pennsylvania's Juvenile Justice System Enhancement Strategy (JJSES). The tool, which is a validated research-based assessment, is designed to determine a juvenile's risk to reoffend and the presence of criminogenic needs. The YLS measures 42 static and dynamic risk factors, divided into eight domains, that have been identified as most predictive of youthful reoffending. Generally, youth are assessed at the time they enter the juvenile justice system. Upon completion of the YLS assessment, youth are assigned a numeric score and risk level (e.g., low, moderate, high, or very high) and their top criminogenic needs (those factors recognized as driving their delinquent behavior) are identified. These results assist juvenile probation officers in targeting a juvenile's specific needs through treatment, interventions, and services.

The domains with the largest percentages of juveniles scoring moderate or high risk were Education/Employment (75.7%), Personality/Behavior (67.9%), and Leisure/Recreation (64.4%). The domains with the highest percentage of juveniles scoring low risk were Prior Risk (86.0%), Family Circumstances/Parenting (82.8%), and Attitudes/Orientation (68.1%).






Distribution of Risk Level of Initial YLS Assessments, 2024

More Than Half Of Youth Entering The Juvenile Justice System In 2024 Were Identified As Low Risk To Reoffend

In 2024, 57.7% of youth with an initial YLS assessment scored as low risk to reoffend, while 37.0% scored as moderate risk to reoffend. Approximately 5.2% scored as high risk to reoffend, while less than 1% (0.1%) scored as very high risk to reoffend.

Section 2: Secure Detention

In accordance with the Juvenile Court Judges' Commission's Standards Governing Secure Detention, all counties report their secure detention admissions to the Commission. Beginning in 2019, the detention data was extracted from the PaJCMS. Prior to 2019, this data was extracted from the secure detention database at the Juvenile Court Judges' Commission's Center for Juvenile Justice Training and Research, which was populated with data reported directly from juvenile detention centers each month.

When interpreting the data contained in these tables, the reader should note the following:

- 1) The unit of count is the admission of a youth to a secure detention center.
- 2) A juvenile who is admitted to a secure detention center and subsequently transferred to another secure detention center without release is counted as two admissions.

Codes Related to JCJC Standards Governing the Use of Secure Detention Under the Juvenile Act

Each month, all juvenile detention centers report a Statement of Facts and Reasons that must accompany every probation-authorized admission to secure detention. Below are the Section Codes related to this process.

100 Codes	Circumstances under which secure detention may be authorized on the basis of an alleged offense or the child's current status with the court or prior record.
200 Codes	Circumstances under which secure detention may be authorized on the basis of a child's status as an absconder or fugitive, on the basis of a child's record of failing to appear at previous juvenile proceedings, or because of extraordinary circumstances which require secure detention to prevent a child from absconding.
300 Codes	Circumstances under which secure detention may be authorized on the written request of the child or child's attorney.
400 Codes	Circumstances under which secure detention may be ordered pending disposition, subsequent to a finding that a child committed a delinquent act or is a delinquent child.
500 Codes	Circumstances under which secure detention may be ordered following disposition pending transfer to placement.
600 Codes	Circumstances under which secure detention may be authorized on the basis of the child's status, pending or subsequent to a disposition review proceeding.
Code 701	Circumstances under which secure detention may be authorized on the basis of extraordinary and exceptional circumstances.




Secure Detention Admissions, 2020-2024

Between 2020 and 2022, Pennsylvania experienced a notable decline in secure detention admissions, largely influenced by the COVID-19 pandemic. In 2023, admissions began to rebound, and by 2024, statewide numbers had returned to their 2020 levels—resulting in a five-year net change of 0%.

Allegheny County saw a significant increase in detention admissions coinciding with the July 2024 opening of the Highlands Juvenile Detention Center. However, even with this increase, Allegheny County's 2024 admissions were still 51.0% lower than in 2020.

Philadelphia County experienced a more moderate recovery, with admissions increasing by 12.2% from 2023 to 2024 and by 29.8% compared to 2020. This steady upward trend reflects a gradual return to pre-pandemic patterns.

When excluding Allegheny and Philadelphia Counties, overall statewide admissions increased by 5.2% from 2023 to 2024 but remained 4.9% below 2020 levels. Together, Philadelphia and Allegheny Counties account for 46.3% and 7.9%, respectively, of all secure detention admissions statewide.

The Median Length Of Stay In Detention Decreased Between 2023 And 2024

In 2024, the statewide median length of stay in secure detention was 13.0 days, which is two days less than the median in 2023. The table below shows the median length of stay by county, from greatest to least number of days. Multiple counties with identical lengths of stay are listed alphabetically. This data, sorted by greatest to least number of admissions, can be found in Appendix 12.



Secure Detention Admissions by Standard Section Codes, 2024

In 2024, the majority of secure detention admissions were authorized under the 100 and 200 Codes – 39.1% and 29.2%, respectively. This trend has remained consistent since 2017.

Special attention is given to the utilization of Codes 206 (extraordinary circumstances), 701 (extraordinary and exceptional circumstances), and Unknown/Other. In instances where secure detention is authorized under Codes 206 or 701, the juvenile probation officer is required to provide a detailed written explanation of the reasons that necessitate secure detention. These codes were intended to be utilized in limited circumstances where the other codes are not applicable.





Secure Detention Admissions by Standard Section Codes, 2020-2024


The utilization of Codes 206, 701, and admissions with an Unknown/Other Code accounted for 19.7% of all secure detention admissions in 2024. The utilization of Code 206 decreased from 16.5% in 2023 to 14.9% in 2024. The use of Code 701 decreased from 6.7% in 2023 to 4.2% in 2024. The Unknown/Other Codes* increased

from 0.4% to 0.6% for that same time period.

Code 206 - The child presents extraordinary circumstances requiring secure detention to prevent him/her from absconding. (Such circumstances may include, but are not limited to: the child's age, character, mental condition, ties to the community, the nature of the child's family relationships, drug or alcohol addiction, and substance abuse.)


Code 701 - Circumstances under which secure detention may be authorized on the basis of extraordinary and exceptional circumstances.

*Unknown/Other - As reported in the secure detention introduction, since 2020, detention admission data has been extracted from PaJCMS. This data was validated for accuracy, which resulted in the Unknown/Other code decrease. For the majority of 2024 cases, the county reported the detention admissions were handled via a court order during a hearing, and no secure detention code was appropriate under these circumstances.


Section 1: Court Hearings

- 1. The unit of count for this section of the report is a juvenile court hearing, which can be conducted by a judge or a juvenile court hearing officer. A single youth may be involved in a number of hearings within a calendar year containing multiple allegations. In addition, a youth may be referred on more than one occasion and receive only one hearing. Therefore, the reader is cautioned NOT to attempt to interpret hearings as the number of youth who are processed by the court or the number of offenses referred to the juvenile justice system. Hearings in this section occurred between January 1, 2024, and December 31, 2024.
- 2. Data for this report were compiled from the PaJCMS on March 27, 2025. Any hearings conducted by a juvenile probation department in 2024, and entered into PaJCMS after this date, will not be included in these statistics. The numbers published in this report, therefore, may not reflect current numbers within the system.
- 3. Finally, the reader should be cautioned that, beginning in 2020, figures were likely impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Hearing figures decreased significantly in 2020 and 2021, but have increased since 2022.




Total Court Hearings Held, 2020-2024

There were 40,790 juvenile court hearings in Pennsylvania during 2024. This represents a 2.1% increase from 2023. Between 2020 and 2024, juvenile court hearings increased by 28.4%.

Adjudication And Disposition Review Hearings Were The Most Common Types Of Hearings Held




The most common type of juvenile court hearing in 2024 was an Adjudication hearing (41.6%). Disposition Reviews (40.6%) and delinquent Placement Reviews (11.5%) were the next most common types of juvenile court hearings.

The vast majority of juvenile court hearings in 2024 were conducted in person (96.4%). There were 1,202 juvenile court hearings held over video (2.9%) and 276 hearings conducted over the phone (0.7%).

Types of Hearing Format, 2024






Section 2: Delinquency Dispositions

- 1. The unit of count for this section of the report is the disposition. A disposition is defined as an allegation of delinquency disposed of by the juvenile probation department and/or the court. Any one youth may be involved in a number of dispositions within a calendar year containing multiple allegations. In addition, a youth may be referred on more than one occasion and receive only one disposition. Therefore, the reader is cautioned NOT to attempt to interpret dispositions as the number of youth who are processed by the court or the number of offenses. Dispositions in this section occurred between January 1, 2024 and December 31, 2024.
- 2. In Pennsylvania, juvenile court jurisdiction extends over individuals who have been alleged to have committed a delinquent act, as defined by 42 Pa.C.S. § 6301 *et seq.*, on or after their 10th birthday and prior to reaching 18 years of age. Juvenile court supervision can extend until the individual is 21 years of age if the individual is currently under supervision. Age, for purposes of this section, was calculated from the juvenile's date of birth to the date of the offense in the written allegation.
- 3. Only the most serious delinquency offense is captured in the delinquency disposition data.
- 4. Data for this report were compiled from the PaJCMS on March 27, 2025. Any delinquency dispositions received by a juvenile probation department in 2024, and entered into PaJCMS after this date, will not be included in these statistics. The numbers published in this report, therefore, may not reflect current numbers within the system.
- 5. Dispositions of pending/deferred and termination of court supervision/case closed, not court ordered, are not included in these statistics.
- 6. The unit of disposition count was modified in the 2017 report to more accurately reflect the outcomes of delinquency allegations. If two allegations were disposed of on the same date, and resulted in the same disposition, these were counted as one disposition. If two allegations were disposed of on the same date, but had two different dispositions, these were counted as two dispositions. The reader is cautioned NOT to compare this year's disposition figures to reports prior to 2017.
- 7. Finally, the reader should be cautioned that, beginning in 2020, figures were likely impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Figures dropped significantly in 2020 and 2021 but increased 48.2% between 2021 and 2024.




2024 Delinquency Dispositions





2024 Delinquency Dispositions by County Class





Delinquency Dispositions, 2020-2024

There were 18,211 delinquency dispositions in Pennsylvania during 2024. This represents a 1.6% decrease from 2023. Overall, there was a 25.9% increase in delinquency dispositions from 2020 to 2024 as delinquency dispositions returned to pre-pandemic levels. Allegheny County reported an increase of 11.9% from 2023 to 2024, and Philadelphia County reported a 14.0% decrease for this time period. The remaining counties reported a 0.9% decrease.



Percentage of Juvenile Population Receiving Delinquency Dispositions, 2020-2024


Between 2020 and 2024, the rate of juvenile delinquency dispositions as a percentage of the Pennsylvania juvenile population increased by 9.1%, from 1.1% to 1.2%. Please refer to Appendix 21 for juvenile population figures.



Delinquency Dispositions and Juvenile Totals, 2024

There were 16,007 youths accounting for 18,211 delinquency dispositions in Pennsylvania in 2024. This equates to an average of 1.14 delinquency dispositions per alleged delinquent juvenile. The county-level rates of delinquency dispositions per alleged juvenile in 2024 ranged from 1.0 to 1.38 (see Appendix 21).

Frequencies of Statewide Delinquency Dispositions, 2024



Frequencies of Statewide Delinquency Dispositions, 2024






Delinquency Dispositions by Source of Allegation, 2024


Delinquency Dispositions by Source of Allegation, 2024

Legal representation provided by Public Defenders continued to be the most common form of representation in delinquency proceedings (64.2% in 2024). Legal representation was provided by Court Appointed or Private Counsel in 35.8% of delinquency proceedings. (*An entry of "Court Appointed" includes cases where counsel other than the public defender was appointed by the court.*) In less than 1% of all delinquency proceedings, the attorney was not present for the proceedings.




Most Serious Alleged Offenses by Type, 2024

The following information was compiled based on the most serious alleged offense for each juvenile delinquency disposition in Pennsylvania between 2020 and 2024. Only one offense per delinquency disposition is counted in the figures. As mentioned previously, the total number of dispositions increased by 25.9% from 2020 to 2024, and decreased by 1.6% from 2023 to 2024. The number of alleged offenses within the Property Offense category was the only offense category that increased (1.7%) from 2023 to 2024. Alleged Drug Offenses showed the largest decrease (5.6%), followed by Person Offenses (2.8%), and "Other" Offenses (0.9%).

Since 2020, "Other" Offenses have shown the largest increase (31.5%). Person Offenses have also increased considerably (29.4%) over this five-year period, followed by Property Offenses (29.3%) and Drug Offenses (3.8%).

Note: The "Other" Offenses category includes but is not limited to: Public Order Offenses such as Disorderly Conduct or Weapon on School Property, Firearms Offenses, and Certifications from the minor judiciary that a juvenile failed to comply with a lawful sentence imposed for a summary offense.




Most Serious Substantiated Offenses by Type, 2024

Substantiated Drug Offenses Have Decreased 17% Since 2020

From 2023 to 2024, the number of Substantiated Offenses increased across all offense types. Property Offenses increased the most (11.6%), followed by Drug Offenses (3.8%), then "Other" Offenses (3.5%), and finally Person Offenses (0.4%).

The total number of substantiated offenses in 2024 was greater than in 2020 (6,674 vs. 5,326). Person, Property, and "Other" Offenses were above their respective 2020 levels, while substantiated Drug Offenses decreased in number since 2020.






Delinquency Dispositions Most Frequent Alleged Offense Categories, 2024

The chart below shows the most frequent alleged offense categories for 2024. Only the most serious charge per disposition is depicted, with the chart showing the top ten offense categories. Simple Assault was the most frequent charge with 12.8%, followed by Non-Payment of Fines (12.8%), Theft-Related (11.8%), Possession of Drugs (9.1%), and Weapons Offenses (7.0%).

Note: Theft-Related Offenses include: Theft, Theft by Unlawful Taking, Theft by Deception, Theft by Extortion, Theft by Receiving Stolen Property, Theft of Services, and Theft from a Motor Vehicle. Weapons Offenses include: Firearm-Related Offenses, Possession of an Instrument of Crime, and Possession of Weapon on School Property.

Delinquency Dispositions Most Frequent Alleged Offense Categories, 2024






New Allegation Dispositions Diverted from Adjudication, 2024

Three Out Of Four Delinquent Allegations In 2024 Were Diverted From Adjudication

In 2024, there were 13,808 allegations diverted from adjudication (75.8%). Although the number of diverted allegations decreased from 13,935 in 2023 to 13,808 in 2024, the proportion of allegations diverted increased during this time period from 75.3% in 2023 to 75.8% in 2024. Between 2020 and 2024, the total number of allegations diverted increased from 10,610 to 13,808. During that same time period, the proportion of new allegation dispositions diverted from adjudication increased by 4.3% from 72.7% in 2020 to 75.8% in 2024.

New Allegation Dispositions Diverted from Adjudication, 2020-2024




First-Time Justice-Involved Youth Diverted from Adjudication, 2024

The Overwhelming Majority Of First-Time Justice-Involved Youth Are Diverted From Adjudication

Most youth (83.8%) involved with the juvenile justice system for the first time in 2024 were diverted from adjudication. Additionally, the percentage of first-time justice-involved allegations diverted from adjudication increased 3.6% from 80.9% of all allegations in 2020 to 83.8% of all cases in 2024.

First-Time Justice-Involved Youth Diverted from Adjudication, 2020-2024






Non-Felony Offenses Diverted from Adjudication, 2020-2024

The Majority Amount Of Non-Felonies Are Diverted From Adjudication

The majority (85.3%) of non-felony allegations were diverted from adjudication in 2024. In 2024, there were 10,303 non-felony offenses diverted from adjudication, a 1.2% decrease from the 10,430 non-felony offenses diverted from adjudication in 2023. Between 2020 and 2024, the number of non-felonies diverted from adjudication increased 27.2% from 8,099 to 10,303. During the same time period, the percentage of non-felonies diverted increased 4.4% from 81.7% in 2020 to 85.3% in 2024.

Non-Felony Offenses Diverted from Adjudication, 2020-2024




Non-Person Offenses Diverted from Adjudication, 2020-2024

More Than Three Out Of Four Non-Person Offenses Are Diverted From Adjudication

In 2024, there were 9,653 non-person offenses diverted from adjudication. This represents a 0.7% decrease from the 9,721 non-person offenses diverted in 2023. However, the percentage of non-person offenses diverted from adjudication increased by 0.2 percentage points from 77.6% in 2023 to 77.8% in 2024. The total number of non-person offenses diverted increased from 7,615 in 2020 to 9,653 in 2024. The percentage of non-person offenses diverted increased 2.1 percentage points from 75.7% of non-person offenses diverted in 2020 to 77.8% of non-person offenses diverted in 2020 to 2024.

Case Processing Metrics

In juvenile justice, it is critical that cases are processed in a timely fashion. Adolescents experience time differently than adults. Prompt case resolution helps a youth maintain the cognitive connection between their actions and the system's response. Case processing delays also disrupt critical aspects of a youth's life, including school, social and peer connections, family stability, and access to needed services. Finally, when a case is continued multiple times, it can prolong uncertainty for youth, often leading them to perceive the system as unfair and unpredictable.


While the Pennsylvania Juvenile Act and the Pennsylvania Rules of Juvenile Court Procedure specify case processing timeframes for certain types of cases, it is imperative that courts monitor the length of time for a case to achieve specific milestones, including:

- 1. Length of time from receipt of written allegation to first hearing (when applicable).
- 2. Length of time between first hearing and disposition (when applicable).
- 3. Length of time from receipt of written allegation to disposition, including by disposition type.



Length of Time Between Allegation and First Hearing, 2024

In 2024, nearly two-thirds (61.8%) of cases in which a hearing was held had their first hearing within 90 days of receipt of the delinquency allegation. An additional 25.6% of cases had their first hearing between 91 days and 180 days after receipt of the delinquency allegation, indicating that most cases had their first hearing within six months of receipt of the delinquency allegation. An additional 6.9% of cases had their first hearing between 181 days and 270 days after receipt of the delinquency allegation, while an additional 2.8% of cases had their first hearing between 271 days and 365 days after receipt of the delinquency allegation. Approximately 2.9% of cases had their first hearing more than a year after receipt of the delinquency allegation.



Allegation to First Hearing Median Days by Hearing Type, 2024

In 2024, the median length of time from the receipt of the delinquency allegation to the first hearing, for cases in which a hearing was held, was 70 days. Depending on the type of hearing held, the median length of time to that hearing differed substantially.

When Transfer to Criminal Proceedings was the first hearing on the case, the median length of time to the hearing was 53 days. For first hearings of Disposition Only and Adjudication, the median times were 60 days and 63 days, respectively. When the first hearing on the case was a Consent Decree hearing, the median length of time from delinquency allegation to the hearing was 93 days. Finally, when Disposition Reviews and Placement Reviews were the first hearing types on the case, the median length of time to the hearing was 165 and 179 days, respectively.




Length of Time Between First Hearing and New Allegation Disposition, 2024

* The Median Length Of Time From The First Hearing On A Delinquency Allegation To The New Allegation Disposition Was 30 Days In 2024

In 2024, just over half (50.3%) of all dispositions occurred within 30 days of the first hearing on the case. In less than 12% of dispositions, the first hearing on the case occurred more than 180 days prior to the disposition date. The median length of time to disposition from the first hearing on the case was 30 days.

Length of Time Between First Hearing and New Allegation Disposition, 2024






Length of Time Between Allegation and Disposition, 2024

Nearly Half Of New Allegation Dispositions Occur Within 90 Days Of Receipt Of The Delinquent Allegation

In 2024, 31.2% of dispositions occurred within 60 days of the delinquency allegation. Approximately 14.5% of dispositions occurred between 61 days and 90 days after the delinquent allegation, while 29.3% occurred between 91 days and 180 days after the delinquent allegation. An additional 17.7% of dispositions occurred between 181 days and 365 days after the allegation. Approximately 7.4% of dispositions occurred a year or more after the allegation.



* The Median Length Of Time From Allegation To New Allegation Disposition Among Consent Decree Dispositions Was 112 Days

In 2024, the median length of time from allegation to disposition was 64 days for informal adjustment dispositions and 112 days for consent decree dispositions. The median length of time to probation dispositions was 121 days, while the median length of time to placement dispositions was 65.5 days. Among transferred to criminal proceedings dispositions, the median length of time from allegation to disposition was 175 days.


Males Account For Nearly Three In Four Delinquency Dispositions

Juvenile court dispositions in Pennsylvania continue to primarily involve males (71.8%). As reflected in the charts below, the proportion of males receiving delinquency dispositions related to new allegations increases as the disposition type becomes more restrictive. While females account for 36.2% of Informal Adjustment dispositions, they accounted for only 13.1% of Placement dispositions and 5.6% of Transferred to Criminal Proceedings dispositions.

Selected Dispositions by Gender, 2024






Delinquency Dispositions by Age at Disposition, 2024

Seventeen-year-olds accounted for 4,109 (22.6%) of all juvenile delinquency dispositions in 2024, representing the most dispositions for any age group. Juveniles aged 16 accounted for 3,860 (21.2%), while 15-year-olds accounted for 3,331 (18.3%) of the dispositions.

Delinquency Dispositions by Age at Disposition, 2024






Delinquency Dispositions by Educational Status, 2024



Delinquency Dispositions by Highest Grade Completed, 2024






Delinquency Dispositions by Family Status, 2024


In juvenile delinquency dispositions, youth whose parents were reported as never married represented the largest group (51.1%). In only 13.1% of cases, the parents were reported as married at the time of disposition. The majority of youth (48.8%) resided only with their mother, while only 15.2% of juveniles resided with both parents.

Section 4: Race and Ethnicity

On the following pages, data on race and ethnicity trends related to juvenile court dispositions are provided. A few points of clarification regarding the reading and interpretation of this data should be noted.

The Juvenile Court Judges' Commission's Center for Juvenile Justice Training and Research collects data on race and ethnicity from each of Pennsylvania's 67 counties. The collection of this data is done in concert with the protocols outlined in *Guidelines for Collecting & Recording the Race and Ethnicity of Juveniles in Conjunction with Juvenile Delinquency Disposition Reporting to the Juvenile Court Judges' Commission* (National Center for Juvenile Justice, 2006). As such, race and ethnicity are collected and recorded as two separate and distinct sets of data.

Trends related to both race and ethnicity are presented within the following charts, graphs, and tables. References to racial or ethnic groups are defined as follows:





Total Delinquency Dispositions by Race and Ethnicity, 2024

In 2024, White Non-Hispanic youth represented the largest race and ethnicity category for all delinquency dispositions. However, in comparison to the race and ethnicity distribution of all youth in Pennsylvania ages 10-17, the representation of Black Non-Hispanic youth is disproportionate: 11.9% of the total population versus 38.1% of all delinquency dispositions. When excluding Philadelphia County and Allegheny County, Black Non-Hispanic youth represent 6.8% of the juvenile population, but 30.2% of all delinquency dispositions. 


Race and Ethnicity by Decision Point, 2024

The following chart shows the distribution of various juvenile justice system decision points by race and ethnicity. To better contextualize the representation of a specific race at a given decision point, the overall youth population (aged 10 - 17) of the state is used as a benchmark. For example, White Non-Hispanic youth account for 58.4% of the youth population, but only 39.8% of written allegations, 18.0% of secure detention admissions, and 31.4% of placement dispositions.

White Non-Hispanic youth represent a large portion of decision points diverting youth from formal court involvement. Conversely, Black Non-Hispanic youth and Hispanic youth represent a larger portion of the most severe decision points (e.g., transferred to criminal proceedings) and those decision points which include removal from the home (detention and placement).

Section 5: Delinquency Placements

- 1. The unit of count for this section of the report is a delinquency placement disposition (placement disposition). A placement disposition is defined as an allegation of delinquency disposed of by the court to a residential placement facility. Any one youth may be involved in a number of placement dispositions within a calendar year containing multiple allegations. In addition, a youth may have multiple referrals disposed of at once and receive only one placement disposition. Therefore, the reader is cautioned NOT to attempt to interpret placement dispositions as the number of youth who were placed by the court. Placement dispositions in this section occurred between January 1, 2024 and December 31, 2024.
- 2. A placement disposition is used when a juvenile is removed from the home and ordered to a placement facility. Scenarios in which a youth is transferred from one placement facility to another placement facility are not included in these figures. See Section 6 for more information on these scenarios.
- 3. A placement disposition can occur as a new allegation disposition (i.e., the first disposition on a case) or as the result of a review hearing.
- 4. On pages 59 and 61, data are provided to describe the trends in the use of different placement facility types (e.g., residential treatment facilities, secure residential services) affiliated with the placement disposition that occurred in 2024. If the placement type was not known at the time of the placement disposition (e.g., the juvenile was ordered to a facility, but a bed was not currently available), that case is excluded from the total counts on these pages. The reader is therefore cautioned that placement disposition counts may differ from placement type counts.
- 5. Data for this report were compiled from the PaJCMS on March 27, 2025. Any placement dispositions that occurred in 2024 and were entered into PaJCMS after this date will not be included in these statistics. The numbers published in this report, therefore, may not reflect current numbers within the system.
- 6. Finally, the reader should be cautioned that, beginning in 2020, figures were likely impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Placement disposition figures dropped significantly in 2020 and 2021 but have increased slightly since then.




Delinquency Placements Including Disposition Reviews, 2020-2024

The Use Of Residential Placement As A Disposition Remains Low

Between 2020 and 2024, delinquency placements declined 5.0% statewide. Philadelphia County's placement dispositions increased 33.6% since 2020, Allegheny County's placement dispositions decreased 16.9%, and the remaining counties' placement dispositions increased 1.7%.

Delinquency placements declined between 2020 and 2021 before increasing 26.6% between 2021 and 2024.






Delinquency Placements as a Percentage of Dispositions, 2020-2024


Delinquency placements as a percentage of total dispositions, including disposition reviews, decreased from 5.1% in 2020 to 4.4% in 2024. Delinquency placements as a percentage of dispositions increased slightly from 4.3% to 4.4% from 2023 to 2024.

Philadelphia County placements as a percentage of total dispositions decreased from 4.1% in 2020 to 3.7% in 2024 but increased from 3.6% in 2023 to 3.7% in 2024. Allegheny County placements as a percentage of total dispositions decreased slightly from 4.4% in 2020 to 4.3% in 2024 and remained constant at 4.3% between 2023 and 2024. In all counties other than Allegheny and Philadelphia, the percentage decreased from 5.6% in 2020 to 4.7% in 2024 and increased from 4.6% in 2023 to 4.7% in 2024.






2024 Delinquency Placements as a Percentage of Dispositions Including Disposition Reviews






Placement Population on First Day of the Month, 2024

On average, approximately 1,135 youth were in placements on the first day of each month in 2024. In January 2024, the number of juveniles in placement on the first day of the month was 1,066. By May, the number of youth in placement on the first day of the month had increased 9.1% to 1,163 youth, before steadily decreasing 3.4% through September to 1,124 youth. Between September and December, the number of youth in placement on the first day of the month increased 4.4%, from 1,124 to 1,174.



Releases from Placement by Month, 2024

Throughout 2024, an average of 113 youth per month were released from placement. Statewide, between January and March, the number of youth released from placement decreased 22.0%, from 109 releases to 85 releases, before increasing 90.6% through June. Between June and September, the number of youth released from placement decreased from a high of 162 releases to a low of just 91 releases, a decrease of 43.8%. Between September and December, releases increased 16.5%, from 91 juveniles released from placement to 106 youth released from placement.





New Allegation Placements vs. Disposition Review Placements, 2024

The following chart depicts the relative percentage of placements that resulted from new allegations versus disposition review proceedings. A disposition review is a hearing conducted by the court regarding a previous disposition which did not result in out-of-home placement.

The percentage of placements resulting from both new allegations and disposition reviews is shown for each county by county class.

More than half of delinquency placements statewide (54.9%) were ordered as a result of a disposition review. This figure, however, was notably influenced by Philadelphia County, which accounted for 20.8% of all delinquency placements statewide, and where 71.0% of all delinquency placements were ordered as a result of a disposition review.

Across all other county class groups, the average distribution of delinquency placements was 49.3% from new allegations and 50.7% from disposition reviews. Class 2, Class 2A, Class 4, Class 5, and Class 7 are the county class groups with a majority of delinquency placements originating from disposition reviews.

Delinquency Placements by Type, 2024 Including Disposition Reviews

Beginning in 2016, the collection of delinquency placement-related data was enhanced within the PaJCMS. All residential placement programs are now categorized by licensed service types, which are determined by 55 PA Code Chapter 3140. For the purposes of this report, there are three overarching service types: Community Based, Institutional, and "Other."

Community Based Category:

- Community Residential Service/Group Home
- Foster Care
- Supervised Independent Living
- Transitional Living

Community Residential Service/Group Homes, YDC Secure, and General Residential Services were the most frequently used programs in 2024, comprising 71.9% of all delinquency placements.



Delinquency Placements by Type, 2024






First-Time Justice-Involved Youth in Placement with a Delinquent New Allegation Disposition or Review Disposition, 2020-2024

Only 2.6% Of First-Time Justice-Involved Youth Were Disposed To Placement In 2024

In 2024, only a small fraction, 2.6%, of first-time justice-involved youth were placed in out-of-home care. The proportion of first-time justice-involved youth referred to placement has decreased from 3.1% in 2020 to 2.6% in 2024. While that share remained constant between 2023 and 2024, the number of first-time justice-involved youth directed to placement increased slightly from 608 in 2023 to 627 in 2024.

Percentages of First-Time Justice-Involved Youth in Placement with a Delinquent New Allegation Disposition or Review Disposition, 2020-2024






First-Time Justice-Involved Youth in Placement by Most Serious Charge, 2024

First-Time Justice-Involved Youth With A Delinquency Placement Were Most Likely To Have Committed A Person Offense

In 2024, Person Offenses were the most common most serious charge for first-time justice-involved youth ordered to placement (45.8%), followed by Property Offenses (30.6%) and "Other" Offenses (16.6%). Drug Offenses (7.0%) were the least common most serious charge among first-time justice-involved youth in placement.

Note: The "Other" offenses category includes but is not limited to: Public Order offenses such as Disorderly Conduct or Weapon on School Property, and Firearms Offenses.


First-Time Justice-Involved Youth in Placement by Most Serious Charge, 2024

First-Time Justice-Involved Youth in Placement by Facility Type, 2024






Section 6: Delinquency Disposition and Placement Reviews

Outcomes of Delinquency Disposition Reviews, 2024

A disposition review is a hearing conducted by the court regarding a previous disposition. More than half of delinquency placements resulted from disposition reviews (see page 57); less than one in 20 disposition review proceedings resulted in a delinquency placement. The vast majority of disposition reviews resulted in an order of Continued on Previous Disposition.

Outcomes of Delinquency Disposition Reviews as a Percentage of Total, 2024








A placement review is a hearing conducted by the court regarding a previous disposition which resulted in out-of-home placement.

The majority of delinquency placement review proceedings resulted in an order of Continued in Previous Placement 67.5% (N=3,451). Released from Placement was the outcome in 26.5% (N=1,354) of placement reviews, and Transferred to Another Placement occurred in 6.0% (N=304) of placement reviews.

In the small percentage of placement reviews in which a transfer to another placement was ordered, most transfers were to a Community Residential Service/Group Home.

Section 7: Dependency Dispositions

Dependency Dispositions, 2024

Since 1991, the Juvenile Court Judges' Commission collects information on dependency cases processed by juvenile probation departments. These figures do not reflect the total number of dependency cases in the Commonwealth. For the purpose of the annual report, a dependency case is defined as a new referral that is processed by the juvenile probation department that does not have accompanying delinquency allegations.

Only the counties that report dependency dispositions are shown in the tables in this section.

Most dependency cases resulted in an Informal Adjustment (61.1%). "Other" (11.7%) and Placement (11.0%) dispositions were the next most common outcomes among dependency cases.

The "Other" category includes dispositions of Transfer to Another Juvenile Court, Accepted Courtesy Supervision, Community Service Only, and Referred to Another Agency/Individual.

Sixteen-year-olds accounted for 60 (21.2%) of all dependency dispositions in 2024, representing the most dependency dispositions for any age group. Youth aged 17 accounted for 54 (19.1%), while 15-year-olds accounted for 53 (18.7%) of the dependency dispositions.

Chapter 3- Juvenile Justice Trends

Overview

As Pennsylvania systematically integrates data-driven policies and practices at every stage of the juvenile justice system, stakeholders continually track the performance and outcomes of such activities to ensure they are promoting positive outcomes for youth. These metrics provide a clear picture of the impact of various initiatives on key justice measures, such as the crime rate and recidivism.

In this chapter, longitudinal data are presented to demonstrate long-term changes over time at several key decision points throughout the system, including arrest, written allegation, secure detention, disposition, and placement. While Chapters 1 and 2 of this report include five years of trend data, this chapter includes ten years to allow for a more robust analysis of change over time.


This chapter also provides a summary of the impact of the juvenile justice system on Pennsylvania's youth, as measured by the change in the youths' risk level and score on the YLS from the initial assessment to the closing assessment, as well as recidivism. The figures in this chapter related to these two measures only provide a small snapshot of these important juvenile justice system outcomes. In addition to drawing upon data retrieved from the PaJCMS, this section also utilizes data collected by the Pennsylvania State Police Uniform Crime Reporting System (arrest figures); the United States Census Bureau (juvenile population figures); the Pennsylvania Department of Human Services' Office of Children, Youth, and Families (delinquency placement days of care and expenditures); and the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts (recidivism rates). Given the variety of external sources utilized for the figures in this chapter, county-level statistics are not available in the Appendix.

Finally, the reader should be cautioned that, beginning in 2020, figures in this chapter were likely impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Section 1: Arrest Rates for Violent Crimes


- 1. The unit of count for this section of the report is based on an arrest. Any one juvenile may be involved in a number of arrests within a calendar year. An arrest does not automatically result in a written allegation to the juvenile justice system. In addition, a youth may be referred to the juvenile justice system without being arrested. Finally, a youth may be arrested on more than one occasion and receive only one written allegation to the juvenile justice system. Therefore, the reader is cautioned NOT to attempt to interpret arrests as the number of youth who are referred to the juvenile justice system or the number of offenses.
- 2. Arrests in this section occurred between January 1, 2015, and December 31, 2024.
- 3. Only the most serious offense is captured in the arrest data.
- 4. For the purposes of this report, violent crime includes the offenses of murder, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault.
- 5. The juvenile population information used to calculate the arrest rate was retrieved from the United States Census Bureau. Before the 2022 Pennsylvania Juvenile Court Annual Report, population figures were retrieved from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. From the 2022 report forward, population figures are now retrieved from the United States Census Bureau. As such, the reader is cautioned when comparing population figures in the 2022, 2023, and 2024 reports to previous Pennsylvania Juvenile Court Annual Reports. At the time of publication of this report, the United States Census Bureau had not yet published 2024 population figures. Consequently, 2023 population figures were utilized, which can be retrieved here: https://data.census.gov.
- 6. The violent crime arrest rate per 100,000 youth is calculated by dividing the total number of arrests for violent crimes by the total number of juveniles aged 10–17 in the state, then multiplying the resulting figure by 100,000.
- 7. The arrest data in this section were retrieved from the Pennsylvania State Police's Uniform Crime Reporting System (UCR). These figures are available online at https://www.ucr.pa.gov/PAUCRSPUBLIC/home/index.
- 8. Data for this report were compiled from the Pennsylvania State Police's Uniform Crime Reporting System and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention on March 7, 2025. Any changes to those systems after this date will not be included in these statistics. The numbers published in this report, therefore, may not reflect current numbers within the respective systems.



Juvenile Arrest Rates for Violent Crimes, 2015-2024

* The Arrest Rate For Violent Crime Is Down 41.5% Since 2015, Despite Recent Upticks

Between 2015 and 2024, the juvenile arrest rate for violent crime decreased 41.5%, from 236 arrests per 100,000 juveniles in 2015 to 138 arrests per 100,000 juveniles in 2024. The violent crime arrest rate per 100,000 juveniles decreased 2.4% from 2023 to 2024.

Section 2: Secure Detention


- 1. Beginning in 2019, the detention data contained in this report were extracted from PaJCMS. Prior to 2019, this data was extracted from the secure detention database at the Juvenile Court Judges' Commission's Center for Juvenile Justice Training and Research, which was populated with information reported directly from juvenile detention centers each month.
- 2. When interpreting the data contained in these tables, the reader should note the following:
 - The unit of count is the admission of a youth to a secure detention center.
 - A juvenile who is admitted to a secure detention center and subsequently transferred to another secure detention center without release is counted as two admissions.
- 3. Secure detention admissions in this section occurred between January 1, 2015, and December 31, 2024.

Secure Detention Admissions, 2015–2024

Thousands Of Fewer Youth Were Securely Detained In 2024 Compared To A Decade Ago

Between 2020 and 2022, secure detention admissions decreased, before increasing in 2023. By 2024, secure detention admissions returned to 2020 levels, which resulted in a statewide net change of 0% in the five-year time period. Since 2015, however, secure detention admissions declined 53.3%. There were 4,791 fewer secure detention admissions in 2024 compared to 2015. Allegheny County detention admissions decreased by 80.5% from 2015 to 2024, and Philadelphia County admissions decreased 29.0% during the same time period. Overall statewide admissions, excluding Allegheny County and Philadelphia County, decreased by 57.7% from 2015 to 2024.

Section 3: Delinquency Dispositions


- 1. The unit of count for this section of the report is the disposition. A disposition is defined as an allegation of delinquency disposed of by the juvenile probation department and/or the court. Any one youth may be involved in a number of dispositions within a calendar year containing multiple allegations. In addition, a juvenile may be referred on more than one occasion and receive only one disposition. Therefore, the reader is cautioned NOT to attempt to interpret dispositions as the number of juveniles who are processed by the court or the number of offenses.
- 2. Dispositions in this section occurred between January 1, 2015, and December 31, 2024.
- 3. The juvenile population information used to calculate the percentage of juvenile population receiving delinquency dispositions was retrieved from the United States Census Bureau. Before the *2022 Pennsylvania Juvenile Court Annual Report*, population figures were retrieved from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. From the 2022 report forward, population figures are now retrieved from the United States Census Bureau. As such, the reader is cautioned when comparing population figures in the 2022, 2023, and 2024 reports to previous Pennsylvania Juvenile Court Annual Reports. At the time of publication of this report, the United States Census Bureau had not yet published 2024 population figures. Delinquency Dispositions, 2015-2024

Delinquency Dispositions Have Decreased 24.4% Statewide Since 2015

As reported in Chapter 2 of this report, delinquency dispositions increased 25.9% statewide between 2020 and 2024. Since 2015, however, statewide delinquency dispositions decreased 24.4%. In Allegheny County, delinquency dispositions decreased 42.7% in this time period, and in Philadelphia County, delinquency dispositions decreased 34.5%. In the remaining counties, delinquency dispositions decreased 20.0%. Statewide, there were 5,863 fewer dispositions in 2024 compared to 2015.





Despite Recent Upticks, The Delinquency Disposition Rate Per Juvenile Population Is Significantly Lower Now Compared To 2015

It is also important to determine the reduction of dispositions when accounting for changes in the youth population. This determination is accomplished by calculating the percentage of the juvenile population that received a delinquency disposition. In Chapter 2 of this report, it was noted that between 2020 and 2024, the rate of juvenile delinquency dispositions as a percentage of the Pennsylvania juvenile population increased by 9.1%, from 1.1% to 1.2%. Between 2015 and 2024, the Pennsylvania delinquency disposition rate per juvenile population declined by 36.8%, from 1.9% to 1.2%.





Delinquency Placements, 2015-2024

Page 1988 Despite Recent Increases, Delinquency Placements Remain Well Below Pre-Pandemic Levels

Delinquency placements are one of the most severe and costly dispositions that a youth can receive from the juvenile justice system and are typically reserved for the most serious types of offenses. As reported in Chapter 2 of this report, juvenile delinquency placements increased 5.0% between 2020 and 2024. Compared to 2015, however, delinquency placement figures in 2024 were still well below pre-pandemic levels. In fact, delinquency placements were 56.4% lower in 2024 compared to 2015. Statewide, there were 2,075 fewer delinquency placements in 2024 compared to 2015.





Polinquency Placements As A Percentage Of Dispositions Continue To Remain At One Of The Lowest Rates Since 2015

It is important to determine the reduction of placement dispositions when controlling for changes in the total number of overall dispositions. This determination is accomplished by calculating the percentage of total dispositions that resulted in a placement disposition. As previously shown in this report, over the last 5 years, delinquency placements as a percentage of total dispositions decreased from 5.1% in 2020 to 4.4% in 2024. From 2015-2024, however, juvenile delinquency placements as a percentage of dispositions decreased 37.6%, from 7.1% of all dispositions in 2015 to 4.4% of all dispositions in 2024.

Section 4: Delinquency Placement Days of Care and Delinquency Expenditures


- 1. The information for this section was provided to the Juvenile Court Judges' Commission by the Department of Human Services' Office of Children, Youth, and Families (OCYF). This information is compiled during the annual Needs-Based Plan and Budget process.
- 2. For the purposes of this report, days of care are defined as the total number of days that juvenile spent outside their home while in residential placement.
- 3. Detention days of care and expenditures are excluded from these figures.
- 4. Please note that data are presented by fiscal year, not calendar year.
- 5. The data contained in this section are from FY14-15 through FY23-24.



Total Delinquency Placement Days of Care, Fiscal Year 14-15 to Fiscal Year 23-24

Youth Are Spending Less Time In Residential Placement

As noted in Section 3 of this chapter, delinquency placement dispositions were down 56.4% since 2015. Days of care were also down significantly. Between FY14-15 and FY23-24, placement days of care decreased 78.6%. There were 1,023,979 fewer days of care in FY23-24 than FY14-15. This reflects progress on two fronts – fewer youth are being placed out-of-home, and those who are placed outside the home experience fewer days of care.





Juvenile delinquency placement expenditures declined by 37.0% from FY14-15 through FY23-24. In FY23-24, \$85,334,035 less was spent on delinquency placements compared to FY14-15.

Section 5: Juvenile Justice System Outcomes: Risk Reduction and Recidivism

Risk Reduction

As noted in Chapter 1, the use of the YLS is the cornerstone of Pennsylvania's Juvenile Justice System Enhancement Strategy (JJSES). The YLS is an actuarial risk assessment tool used for juvenile offenders. In addition to being administered at the time they enter the juvenile justice system, best practice also dictates that juveniles be reassessed at regular intervals while under juvenile court supervision and again at the time of case closure. Changes in scores between the juvenile's initial YLS assessment and the juvenile's case closing YLS assessment serve as one indicator of the impact of a juvenile's involvement in the juvenile justice system. Therefore, decreases in risk scores indicate a positive outcome for the youth.

- 1. The unit of count for this analysis is a juvenile with a case closed from a Pennsylvania juvenile probation department who had outcome measures completed.
- 2. Only juveniles with both an initial YLS assessment and a case closing YLS assessment captured in the PaJCMS were included in these figures.
- 3. The figures in this chapter are for youth closed between January 1, 2024, and December 31, 2024.

Recidivism

Recidivism is another measure utilized by stakeholders to determine the impact of a juvenile's involvement in the juvenile justice system. One of the main tenets of the Balanced and Restorative Justice (BARJ) mission of the Pennsylvania juvenile justice system is that youth should leave the system with the tools to become law-abiding citizens. Determining the youth's return to criminal behavior (recidivism) is one way to calculate the degree to which this BARJ goal is met.

Since the beginning of the implementation of the JJSES, the Juvenile Court Judges' Commission has tracked the recidivism rates of all youth with cases closed from the juvenile justice system. These analyses serve two purposes. First, since the core premise of the JJSES is that recidivism rates can be reduced through the implementation of evidence-based practices, these analyses establish an ongoing, consistent recidivism benchmark. Second, these analyses allow stakeholders to examine differences between recidivists and non-recidivists in terms of demographics, risk level, disposition history, and other key variables to identify factors most closely associated with recidivism in the Pennsylvania juvenile justice system.

A benchmark recidivism rate pre-JJSES implementation was established using years 2007 through 2010. Since then, the recidivism rates of juveniles closed for services from years 2011 through 2020 have been analyzed.


- 1. The unit of count for this analysis is a juvenile who was closed from a Pennsylvania juvenile probation department who had been under some form of juvenile justice supervision. Any one youth may have a number of arrests, written allegations, and dispositions at the time of their case closing.
- 2. Recidivism rates in this section were based on youth who were closed from juvenile probation departments between January 1, 2007, and December 31, 2020.
- 3. For the purposes of this report, recidivism is defined as: a subsequent delinquency adjudication in juvenile court or conviction in criminal court for either a misdemeanor or felony offense within two years of case closure.
- 4. Subsequent adjudication of delinquency information was retrieved from the PaJCMS. Subsequent conviction information was provided by the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts.
- 5. The recidivism rate is calculated by dividing the total number of youth with a subsequent delinquency adjudication in juvenile court or conviction in criminal court for either a misdemeanor or felony offense within two years of case closure by the total number of juveniles closed.

Risk Reduction as Measured by the Change in Youth Level of Service Score

The Majority Of Youth Who Leave The Juvenile Justice System Have Lower Risk Scores Compared To When They Entered The System

In 2024, among all youth closed from juvenile probation departments who had both an initial YLS score and a case closing YLS score, 72.4% had a lower risk to reoffend score at case closing compared to their initial assessment. Among just those youth identified as moderate risk to reoffend on their initial assessment, 83.3% had a lower risk to reoffend score at case closing. Finally, among just those youth identified as high/very high risk to reoffend on their initial assessment, 86.5% had a lower risk to reoffend score at case closing.





Pennsylvania's Recidivism Rate Continues To Be Its Lowest Since The State Began Tracking It In 2007, Despite Recent Upticks

In the benchmark years of 2007-2010, the statewide recidivism rate was 21.6%. This figure dropped to 18.5% in 2011 and remained relatively consistent through 2016. Starting with juveniles whose cases were closed in 2017, the recidivism rate began to decrease. The Pennsylvania recidivism rate increased from 11.7% in 2019 to 12.6% in 2020.








Secure Detention Admissions by Section Code 701 and County Class, 2024


Secure Detention Admissions by Unknown/Other Code and County Class, 2024

Glossary

Advanced Communication Technology: Any communication equipment that is used as a link between parties in physically separate locations and includes, but is not limited to, systems providing for two-way simultaneous audio-visual communication, closed circuit television, telephone and facsimile equipment, and electronic mail.

Delinquency Allegation: The document completed by a law enforcement officer or other person that is necessary to allege a juvenile has committed an act of delinquency. It is synonymous with a "court referral," though written allegation is the preferred language.

Dependency Allegation: The document alleging that a child is without proper parental care or control; subsistence; education as required by law; or other care or control necessary for their physical, mental, or emotional health.

Detention: A secure holding facility utilized to detain a juvenile temporarily. The term *detention* when used in this report does not include shelter care.

Disposition: The action/decision implemented, or treatment plan decided upon, by a juvenile court in response to a delinquency allegation. This is similar to the sentence imposed in criminal court.

Disposition Review Hearing: A Hearing that must occur every six months for juveniles under court supervision for the purpose of ensuring that the youth is receiving necessary treatment and services and that the terms and conditions of the disposition are being met. In this report, disposition review hearings involving out-of-home placement are referred to as placement review hearings (see definition below).

Juvenile: A person who has attained 10 years of age and is not yet 21 years of age who is alleged to have, upon or after the juvenile's 10th birthday, committed a delinquent act before reaching 18 years of age or who is alleged to have violated the terms of juvenile probation prior to termination of juvenile court supervision.

Out-of-Home Placement (or Placement): An out-of-home program utilized as a juvenile court disposition. Included in this definition are placements into group homes, general residential programs, secure residential care, foster care, drug and alcohol programs, residential treatment facilities (RTF), Youth Development Centers (YDC), and Youth Forestry Camps (YFC).

Placement Review Hearing: A Hearing that must occur every six months for juveniles residing in out-of-home placement for the purpose of ensuring that the youth is receiving necessary treatment and services and that the terms and conditions of the placement disposition are being met.

School-Related Offense: Any offense committed in the school setting, including in the school, on the school grounds, in school vehicles, at a designated bus stop, or at any activity sponsored, supervised, or sanctioned by the school. Failure to comply offenses are not included.

Substantiated Offense: Any petitioned offense the court finds the youth committed.
