HIGH/VERY HIGH Risk Youth Have a Lower Risk Score at YOUTH CLOSURE

Each year, Pennsylvania juvenile probation departments track the outcomes of youth offenders whose episodes of supervision ended. Outcomes associated with community protection, accountability, and competency development are tracked to better understand if the Balanced and Restorative Justice goals of the Pennsylvania juvenile justice system were met while the youth was actively under supervision.
