B. Announcement by the Chairman for Ratification of a Board Action.

The following Board Action approved on March 24, 2025, was decided by Notational Voting after the adjournment of the Board's last public meeting on March 19, 2025.

Board Action: At the January 15, 2025, public meeting, the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board voted to approve a 90-day extension of the current contract with the Philadelphia Police Department to provide police services until March 31, 2025, while a new contract was being negotiated. Those negotiations remain ongoing. Therefore, another 90-day extension is necessary to maintain these services. That would give the PLCB until June 30, 2025, to finalize and approve the new contract, which we believe will include a more prioritized list of stores as well as provide for a more active police presence within those stores. The estimated cost of the contract during the additional extension period is approximately \$250,000.00.

Due to the expiration of the current contract extension before the next scheduled public Board meeting, a notational vote on this matter was necessary to avoid a lapse in services.

Chairman Clarke and Member Vulakovich agreed (2-0 vote) to grant a 90-day contract extension with the Philadelphia Police Department.
