- (1) **SOTI MobiControl Licenses** - These licenses are for Soti MobiControl. This allows full MDM (Mobile Device Management) services on the Zebra TC53 scanners. MobiControl allows remote control, file management on the devices, deployment of updates, geofencing, etc. This will be used for troubleshooting and administering the devices.

The IBMS system is the Agency’s main computer system that runs the day-to-day operations of the Agency. Without AppWorx we would have to run all the jobs and chains manually with the risk of user error.

- (6) **Increase to Oracle Master Agreement Contract Cap: Ongoing Maintenance and Support Release 4.**

The Oracle Cloud-based ERP system has regular and recurring charges related to support and maintenance. on, \$2.0 million will be added to the contract for contingency related to unforeseen circumstances, for a total of \$13.4 million.

This project is being completed under the PLCB's existing contract purchase agreement No. 63017408 with Oracle, approved by the Board on Jan. 17, 2018, with term through Feb. 26, 2030. The current cap is \$170.8 million and was approved by The Board at its February 26, 2025, public meeting.

This amount covers the lease costs for 101 vehicles utilized by the PLCB, including monthly charges for Telematic (GPS) devices.
- (3) **Executive Offices – OCRIM (Job 78) – \$64,746.85**
FY 2025-26 billing of \$64,746.85 to reimburse the Executive Offices for services provided by the Office of Continuity and Records Information Management (OCRIM) to operate the Executive Management Directives system, continuity and preparedness operations, and the ALERTPA notification system (CodeRed). The billing is \$6,259.61 (10.7%) lower than last year and represents 7.8% of the total \$830 thousand in Executive Office’s billing. The methodology for allocating the FY

April 29, 2026, PLCB Board Meeting Public Comments Addendum

Mr. Benjamin Sutton from The Bakery Bar LLC addressed the Board regarding his pending application. Mr. Sutton continues to support the application and provided the Board with additional details regarding the project's status while the application is still pending with the Board. Chairman Darrell Clarke asked Chief Counsel Jason Worley to address Mr. Sutton. Mr. Worley explained the process the case has undergone due to a request to reopen the record and have a subsequent hearing held. Mr. Worley indicated that, in all likelihood, the case will be before the Board at its next meeting.

Former PLCB Board Member Mr. Michael Negra addressed the Board regarding the real estate action of store 1412 on the agenda. Mr. Negra stated his opposition to the relocation and that the current location is better, especially with the parking situation, and he hoped the Board would reconsider its position.

Mr. Larry Schroder, who is a member of the PA Vineyard and Winery Association, addressed the Board regarding the state of PA wineries. Mr. Schroder discussed how PA wineries are at a distinct disadvantage due to the *Cutner v Neuman* case and the subsequent influx of out-of-state entities applying for limited winery licenses. Due to harvesting times, PA growers are at a disadvantage in bringing grapes/wine to market and must compete with California and other grape growing regions that sell fruit into Pennsylvania. Further, Mr. Schroder and the PA Wine Association are hopeful to the General Assembly will address this issue via legislation and asks for the support of the PLCB. Board Secretary Vigoda indicated that the PLCB will work with the House Liquor Control Committee on this issue. Chief Counsel Jason Worley and Executive Director Rodrigo Diaz both commented on the origin of the issue to the PLCB due to the injunction placed on the PLCB from the *Granholm v Michigan* and that the interpretation the PLCB uses from that case originated from the Pennsylvania Attorney General. Mr. Diaz and Mr. Worley relayed that they would speak with Mr. Schroder in more detail after the meeting.
