- B. Announcement by Chairman for Ratification of a Board Action

The following Board Action approved on June 12, 2026, was decided by Notational Voting after the adjournment of the Board's last public meeting on June 3, 2026.

Board Action: At the last public Board meeting held on June 3, 2026, the Board voted to approve certain Procurement Actions, including the purchase of 61 Zebra TC53 scanners at an estimated cost of \$85,797.25, as well as the purchase of additional Zebra TC53 equipment and Bixolon printers at an estimated cost of \$98,037.50.

After the meeting, the Bureau of Accounting and Purchasing realized that it had made a clerical error when listing the estimated costs for these two agenda items. The correct estimated cost for the Zebra scanners is \$183,330.55, and the correct estimated costs for the TC53 equipment and Bixolon printers is \$85,797.25. Besides the estimated costs, the supporting information for these two agenda items was otherwise accurate.

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For purposes of clarity, timeliness and to ensure that the Board still supports moving forward with these purchases based on the corrected estimated costs, the agenda items were presented for consideration as a notational vote before the next scheduled public Board meeting on June 24, 2026.

Chairman Clarke, Member Vulakovich, and Member Brewster agreed (3-0 vote) to approve the Procurement Actions at the corrected cost estimated cost.
