Back in the September 2024 MPOETC Newsletter, I discussed the Use of Force and Control Tactics Instructor Certifications. Thankfully, we've received many applications and were able to turn those around fast. However, there are still over 200 instructors who were initially appointed as "Temporary MIST Instructors" that haven't yet upgraded.

Department level CT instructors still teaching under the 2022-2023 Temporary MIST Instructor certifications will have until June 1, 2025 to update their certifications. After that time, you will no longer be recognized as a CT instructor and will not be able to train department officers. To upgrade your certification, simply send us an updated MPO-239 and a copy of your original training certificate to ra-mpotraining@pa.gov. You can find the form on our MPOETC website.

Speaking of training, we get a high volume of calls from officers scrambling to get their MIST hours in by the end of the year. We realize many people take their MIST training through the Pennsylvania Chiefs of Police Association's PAVTN.net . Did you realize PAVTN has a lot of other free training opportunities and not just the mandatory MIST courses? Guidance from the PSP Bureau of Forensic Services

The Pennsylvania State Police Bureau of Forensic Services operates a system of six regional forensic laboratories and one DNA laboratory strategically located throughout the Commonwealth.

The mission of the Pennsylvania State Police Bureau of Forensic Services is to serve the citizens of the Commonwealth with competence and professionalism in providing the criminal justice community with testing services and technical and investigative support in the pursuit of justice. This mission is executed with foremost attention to quality, impartiality, timeliness, and adherence to forensic testing standards that foster excellence.

Regional laboratories are located in Bethlehem, Erie, Greensburg, Harrisburg, Lima, and Wyoming. The Forensic DNA Division is located in Greensburg. Regular business hours are: 8 a.m. - 4 p.m.

Testing services vary by laboratory. Please contact the laboratory for details.

Within the Bureau, the following forensic disciplines are performed:

- AFIS (Automated Fingerprint Identification Section)
- Biology (Body Fluid Identification, Bloodstain Pattern Analysis, DNA)
- Drug Chemistry (Controlled Substances, Clandestine Laboratory Analysis, Alcohol Beverage Analysis)
- Firearms and Tool Marks (including Serial Number Restoration)
- Latent Prints (including Impression Evidence/Footwear &Tires)
- Toxicology (Blood Alcohol, Blood-Drug Analysis)
- Trace Evidence (Paint, Fiber/Textiles, Gunshot Residue, Hair, Explosives, Fire Debris, General Physical and Chemical Analysis)

Training videos and notices regarding evidence submission can be accessed through CLEAN via the CJIS Launch Pad. Once logged into CLEAN open the Links folder on the left menu bar. Select CJIS Launch Pad. Click on CJIS Training. Click on the PSP Crime Lab Info Training folder.

The following instructions for properly sealing evidence were published in October 2024, and can be accessed via CLEAN by logging into your JNET account.

Is your evidence properly sealed?

If not:

- Your evidence may be identified as non-compliant with accreditation requirements.
- The non-compliance will be documented in the case file and be discoverable.
- Details of the non-compliance will be provided to court officials as requested.

To properly seal evidence:

- Place evidence tape to ensure complete closure of envelope/bag/box.
- There should be no openings where contents could escape.
- Evidence tape must be used; regular tape is not acceptable.
- The officer's mark must be on the seal.
- Follow instructions on self-sealing bags by folding in the correct area.
- Do not rely on hospital staff to seal blood kits and sexual assault kits.



Highlights from the December 2024 Commission Meeting

On December 11 and 12, 2024, the Municipal Police Officers' Education and Training Commission held its regular quarterly meeting at MPOETC, 8002 Bretz Drive, Harrisburg, PA. On Wednesday afternoon, December 11, 2024, the Commissioners held committee meetings to discuss the business of the Commission. On Thursday morning, December 12, 2024, the Commissioners met in an Executive Committee meeting, which was followed by the formal meeting of the full Commission, where they took the following actions:

- The Commission revoked certifications of 4 officers. The revocations were due to convictions for disqualifying offenses which included: Sexual Assault, Theft by Unlawful Taking or Disposition, Official Oppression, and Unsworn Falsification to Authorities.
- The Commission approved two Act 60 applications submitted by the Eastern Police Canine Association and the Keystone Police K-9, LLC. This will allow these organizations to conduct police K-9 certifications under the Act 60 program. The Commission also denied two applications due to failure to meet the required standards.
- The Commission voted to approve the creation of a new Act 120 police academy at Elizabethtown College, Lancaster County, PA.
- The Commission voted to allow the submission of new Act 120 police training academy applications from four colleges which
 previously submitted letters of interest. These colleges are not guaranteed to open their own academy but will have the
 opportunity to submit a full application for consideration.
- The Commission voted to modify the existing Retired Law Enforcement Officers Identification Act (RLEIA) firearms qualification course. This modification reduced the total rounds fired from 50 to 30 rounds and changed distance to three stages with the maximum distance of 10 yards. The modified course will now also accommodate revolvers.
