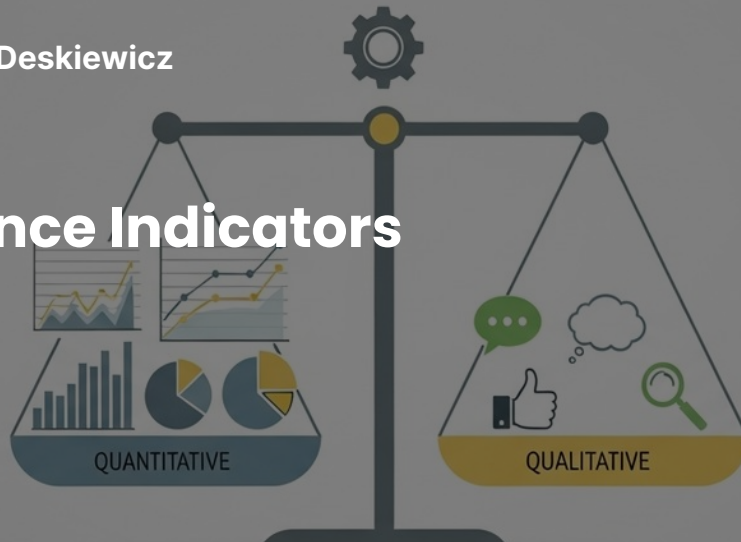

## Performance Indicators

Performance indicators, or measures, are metrics used to evaluate grant funded project progress, impact, and outcomes. Good performance indicators are:

- Quantifiable and actionable
- Should consider project goals, the data needed to measure progress toward those goals, and the appropriate metrics to track the data

PCCD funding initiatives:

- Frequently require grantees to report on PCCD established performance indicators
- May require applicant organizations to develop project specific measures

Not all funding requires the use of performance indicators. Refer to individual funding announcements for expectations pertaining to specific initiatives. If not required, you will simply change the completion status from "In Process" to "Complete" and click save.

Below is an example of PCCD Required Performance Indicators.
