
The Impact


Data on Firearm Suicides

Suicide remains the leading cause of firearm-related deaths in the U.S. and in Pennsylvania.

In 2023, the number of firearm deaths* in PA dropped for the first time in 4 years.












Data on Firearm Suicides

Suicide remains the leading cause of gun-related deaths in the U.S. and Pennsylvania. In 2022, more than half (55%) of all gun deaths statewide were firearm suicides, with significantly higher levels in some of Pennsylvania's rural counties.






Data on Firearm Suicide

According to provisional data from the CDC, PA's statewide firearm suicide fatality rate in 2023 was 8.3 deaths per 100,000 population — about the same as the national average.

In some PA counties, especially rural areas, rates of firearm suicide are significantly higher.


- Carbon County 18.3 per 100k
- Clearfield County 18.2 per 100k
- Cambria County 17.6 per 100k





Data on Firearm Suicides

Firearm suicide rates have increased significantly among Black
Pennsylvanians and youth in recent years. Since 2018, the rate of firearm suicides among Black Pennsylvanians has nearly doubled (3.3 vs 5.8 per 100,000 in 2018 and 2022)





- Objective 6.1: Use available state funding sources to support local firearm suicide reduction and response efforts, including prevention, intervention, and postvention supports.
- Objective 6.2: Increase attention to the issue of firearm suicide among broader suicide prevention efforts and state-level policy discussions.



ABOUT THE GRANT PROGRAM

Byrne State Crisis Intervention Program (SCIP)

- ✓ Federal funding stream created in 2022 to address gun violence and improve responses to behavioral health crises.
- ✓ FY 2024 SCIP Allocation: \$4,991,633
- ✓ Must create a SCIP Funding Plan informed and approved by Crisis Intervention Advisory Board.
- ✓ In April, BJA approved Pennsylvania's FY 2024 Byrne SCIP Funding Plan.

FY 2024 SCIP Funding Plan





Other SCIP Funding: FY 2024 Byrne SCIP Local Solicitation

- Over \$4 million available
- ~20 grants, up to \$200,000 over 21 months
- Eligible applicants: Units of local government
- Eligible activities: Supporting behavioral health responses including CIT, co-responders, and holistic services and programs; peer navigators; local strategies for firearm suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention; adoption of Lethality Assessment Programs (LAP); implementation of procedures required under Act 79 of 2018.
- Applications due: September 10, 2025.





Who is Eligible to Apply?

- ✓ Units of local government
- ✓ Nonprofit organizations (including community-based and statewide organizations)
- ✓ Institutions of higher education
- ✓ State government agencies







Priority Considerations

Projects in areas with the greatest need will get priority for funding.

Examples:

- The firearm suicide rate is higher than the state average (which was 8.2 deaths per 100,000 people in 2022)
- Firearm suicide rates are rising
- Rural community

- ✓ Project Summary (5 points)
- ✓ Statement of Problem/Need (15 points)
- ✓ Target Area(s) & Population (15 points)
- ✓ Project Description & Proposed Activities (35 points)
- ✓ Performance Measures, Impact, & Outcomes (10 points)
- ✓ Required Attachments

Fiscal Year 2024 Solicitation

Please Note: Applications are <u>only</u> accepted through PCCD's Egrants system. Applicants must register in Egrants prior to submitting an application. Applicants are strongly encourage to familiarize themselves with the Egrants system and allow adequate time to prepare and submit an application.

Prior to starting an application in Egrants, your agency must be registered in Egrants, and at least two individuals from your agency must register as Egrants users and have Egrants user roles for your agency.

Every agency must also have at least one person with the e-signature role in Egrants.

Please refer to the <u>Getting Started in Egrants</u> page on our website for Egrants registration information and guides.

Egrants Application Deadline:

September 9, 2025

This funding guideline contains information not appearing in the Egrants application. Applicants are advised to review this document and refer to it while completing your Egrants application.

PCCD staff may only respond to questions to clarify the funding announcement. Questions must be sent via email tos RAPCCD-CDSI@Da.gou with "SCIP Firems Suicide Prevention.

Intervention, and Postvention Initiative" in the subject line. All questions regarding this funding announcement must be received by close of business on September 2, 2025. PCCD staff will post responses to questions, as they are received, on PCCD's website. Select the appropriate funding announcement to view questions and answers.

Application Process

- Eligible organizations must submit applications using PCCD's Egrants System.
- Final recommendation of projects will be made following the receipt and review of applications in Egrants.





Applications must be submitted in PCCD's Egrants System by 11:59 PM on Tuesday, September 9, 2025.





Getting Started in Egrants

Step 1: Create an Egrants account (see *Getting Started in Egrants* webpage + the PCCD Egrants Keystone Login Guide).

Step 2: Register your organization with Egrants.

Step 3: Request roles in Egrants (see Appendix A) to make sure you have the right users and permissions set up.

*Authorized Officials are persons with contract signing authority; generally, the Executive Director or Head Administrator of the Agency.

GETTING STARTED IN EGRANTS



User Roles

Access to the Agency's grants are separated into six unique roles:

- **Financial Creator** can *view and create* fiscal information (manage budget section information, fiscal reports, etc.)
- Financial Reader can view fiscal information
- **Program Creator** can *view and create* program information (manage program section information, program reports, etc.)
- Program Reader can view program information
- Submission can submit grant forms like applications, modification, and continuations
- **User Manager** can *manage user roles* for the Agency's grants (*will still need other roles if performing other duties*)

User Manager

Every agency should have an **Agency User Manager** security role.

- The User Manager approves role requests and maintains existing security for users already established within their agency.

Frequently-Asked Questions



Can this funding be used for work in schools? We have a mix of evidence-based and evidence-informed curricula and workshops in mind.

How can this funding be applied to existing CIT and LETI programs?

Is this grant eligible for use in a K–12 setting serving youth on juvenile probation for gun-related offenses and can it fund educational technology (e.g., laptops, tablets, internet) to support web-based curricula on suicide prevention, firearm safety, and violence reduction?



Frequently-Asked Questions



If we are not an eligible applicant, are we able to partner with another eligible applicant to apply for this funding? How would that work specifically in the application process, and if the grant is awarded, the financial side of the award?

Are organizations that serve Philadelphia a fit for this grant?
